Your Open Studio Experience

The program is a free educational opportunity open to 24 students who want to take a deeper dive into the design process. Over the course of one week, you will learn how to sketch and draw, think through a design problem with a teammate and present your work to a group.





You will learn how to change everyday materials into architectural models.



You will work with other students interested in architecture, design and engineering.



You will be given the space to express your ideas and bring them to life.

You will gain greater knowledge of material science and material applications.

Have you ever wondered how glass is attached to a building?

Have you ever wondered why some buildings are built from wood while others are constructed from steel or concrete?

Have you ever wanted to explore how materials make the inside of a room feel?





Learn how an architect analyzes a site with an in-person site visit during the studio.

While on site, you will practice hand sketching , using drawing scales and diagramming your ideas.

Architects will explain how views, sounds, sun, weather and other factors help inform design choices.



Ask questions to people who work in the architectural field.

Hear about their journey to becoming an architect. Some designers are at the very beginning of their career while others have over 30 years of experience.

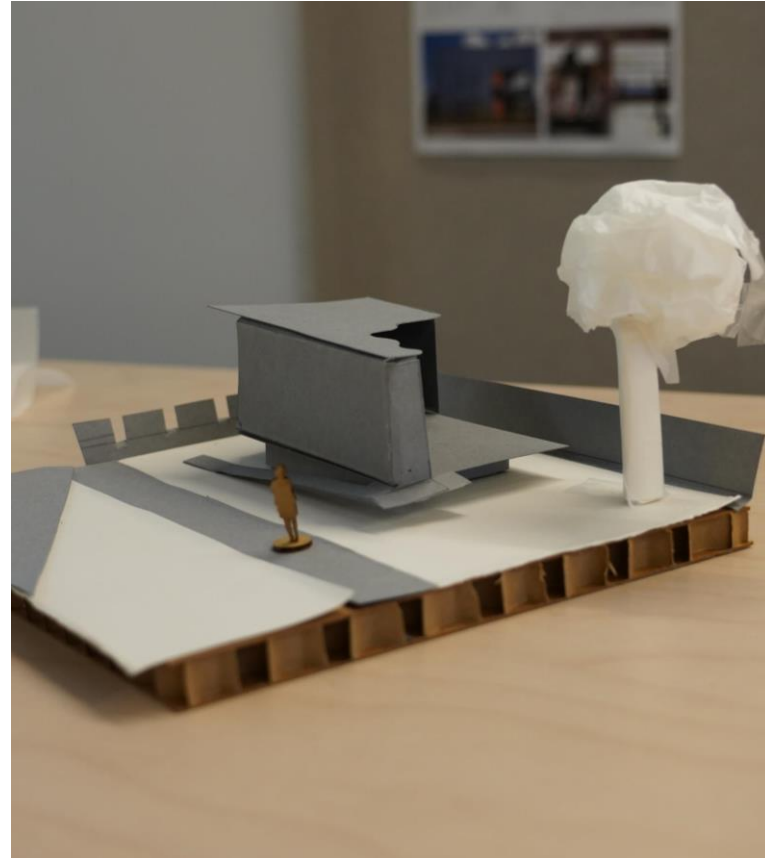
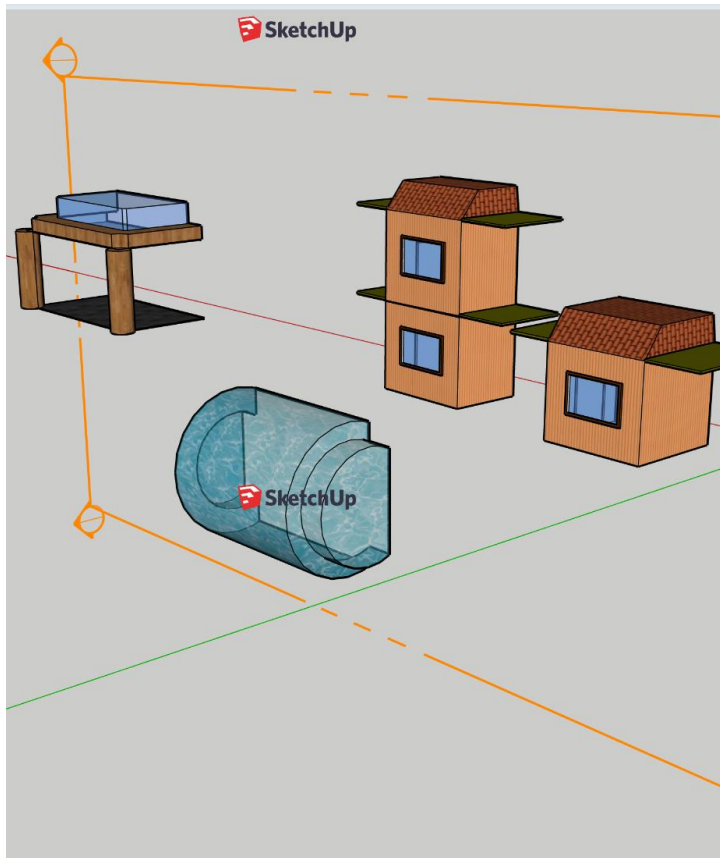
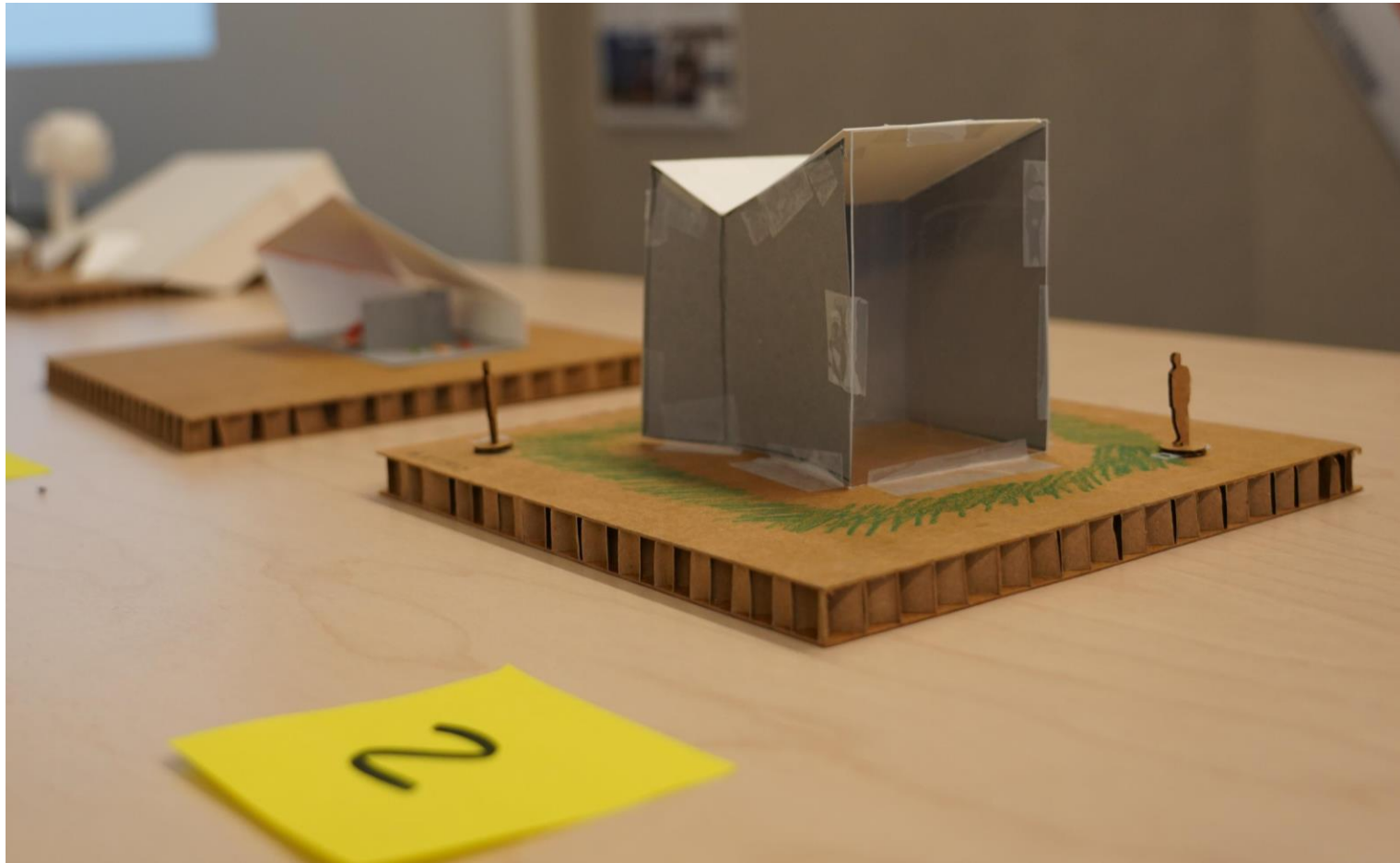
Get a better understanding of what an architect does day to day.

Work with an architectural designer and get feedback on your ideas



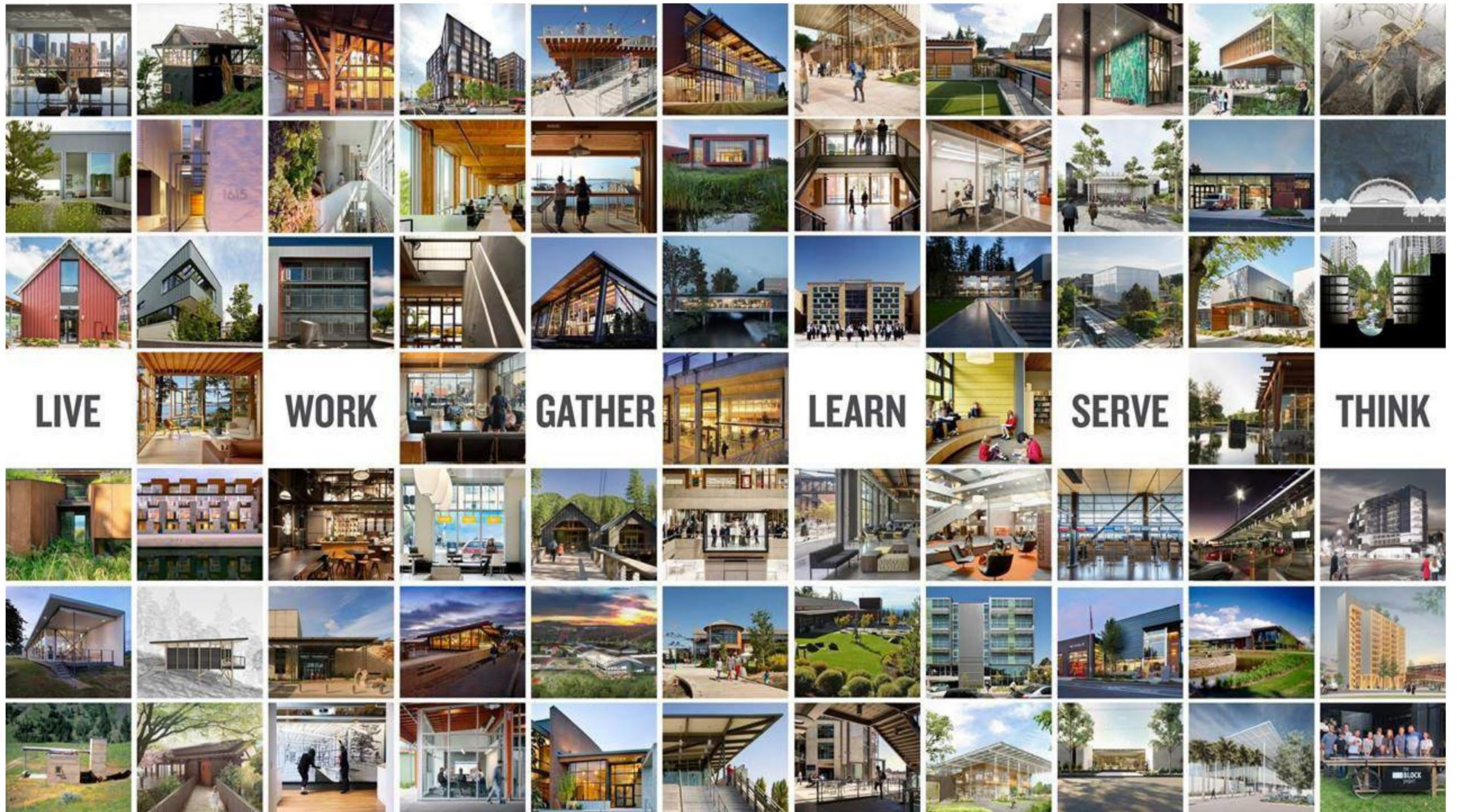


