Android auto waze volume too low

When you are one google now window and press volume button, look to the right bottom corner, it will display "ALERT" button. When you press that you can raise the volume. How do you fix low volume on Android? Increase the volume limiter Open the Settings app on your Android device. Tap on "Sounds and vibration." Tap on "Volume." In the upper right corner of the screen, tap the three vertical dots, then tap "Media volume limiter." While a song was playing adjusting the volume controlled the radio volume and while Google navigation was giving turn-by-turn directions the volume control would control the navigation volume. As well, when it worked as noted above, the front speakers would carry the navigation audio while the rear speakers continued to play the radio. Now when navigation directions are given the navigation comes out of only the front speakers and radio stops playing through the rear speakers. Makes sense and I probably prefer the new method. At some point something changed, I assume in Android Auto, because now the navigation spoken directions use the same volume control. If the navigation directions are too low I turn up the volume DURING the spoken TBT directions in order better hear the instructions. When the spoken directions are complete the radio volume blasts at the new volume. Anyone notice anything different and if you've been able to control both audio sources separately? · What firmware version is your radio on? · I do not use Android but on Apple CarPlay , if you play radio from the APP or Pandora or songs from the phone its all considered ONE audio source same as Navigation (phone Navigation) but if its actual car Radio its a separate audio source vs phone-Navigation Also Google Map turns off (full mute) other audio source during directions , but Waze only dims it - If it's setup the same as CarPlay, yes, the navigation from the device audio is controlled separately from the "radio" volume. You can change it while the app is speaking or in the setup. I actually had to do this yesterday as apparently my daughter while "testing out" my new Ascent, accidentally lowered the volume associated with that kind of app to zero....I'd hear the volume lower on the tunes, but not hear any spoken directions. Do you know otherwise? One of the major benefits of navigation apps on Android Auto is that they provide both visual and audio guidance, so it's pretty easy to know which way to go when driving. But as some discovered recently, the likes of Google Maps and Waze no longer offer audio guidance, so these drivers are stuck with the visual guidance showing on the screen of the car. Adjusting the audio volume obviously doesn't fix the problem, and users explain that the guidance is enabled in their navigation apps. "I'm using a Samsung s8 and my maps will absolutely not play any sound UNLESS I play Spotify or a YouTube video and leave the app open first. Everything else works fine like my phone and saying ok google for example it's just that maps won't play anything or Waze. I've tried everything in the book from uninstalling the app deleting everything in my car and phone Bluetooth and resyncing everything up over and over again nothing seems to fix it," one user explains on reddit. So is there any workaround to help deal with this problem? Not really, albeit there is one thing that you should check. Android Auto uses two different volume levels for playing music and voice navigation, so technically, you're allowed to configure them individually. However, to adjust the volume level of voice guidance for navigation apps, you need to press the volume buttons on the steering wheel or the head unit exactly when voice guidance directions are being provided. If these don't work, one possible option is to send a command to the Google Assistant, and when an answer is offered, to adjust the volume on your unit. Unfortunately, we still don't know if a fix is on its way or not, but for now, several users seem to be affected.
