These coins celebrate an important global sporting event – the XXIV Olympic Winter Games, which were held in the Chinese capital of Beijing in February 2022.

The Olympic Games are prestigious international competitions that are global events, it would be no exaggeration to say. They are organized by the International Olympic Committee for the Olympic Movement. Ukraine's national team competed in the following sports: biathlon, alpine skiing, speed skating, curling, cross-country skiing, Nordic combined, ski jumping, sledding, skeleton and bobsleigh, snowboarding, figure skating, freestyle skating, puck hockey, and short track speed skating.

Obverse: above is Ukraine's small coat of arms, below which is the semicircular legend YKPAÏHA (Ukraine); in the center in a smooth circle is a pad-printed head of a dragon, which is the main character of many ancient legends, myths, fairy tales and one of the most famous symbols of China; in the center is also the legend 2022

stylized to look like a snake-like dragon covered with scales; to the left and right are the four pictograms symbolizing Olympic sports; beneath are the coin's face value – 10 on the silver coin and 2 on the nickel silver one – and the graphic symbol of the hryvnia.

On the nickel silver coin, the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works is located under the legend 2022.

Reverse: against the backdrop of a stylized outline of a sheet of paper is a composition symbolizing the country that hosted the XXIV Winter Olympic Games – China, which has an ancient culture, one element of which is paper; in the center is a map of Beijing with pictograms of a snowboarder and a figure skater; to the right of the composition is a fan – an integral part of traditional Chinese culture, the first records of fans date back to between the 4th and the 2nd centuries BCE. In addition, the reverse features a snowflake (beneath), and the logotype of the National Olympic Committee of Ukraine (to the left), above which are a dragon's head and flames – a symbol of the Olympic Games.

These coins celebrate the national unity of Ukrainians in their fight against russian aggression, and the international support that the entire world is giving Ukraine, bringing joint victory closer.

The desire for freedom is a fundamental value of the Ukrainian people. For many centuries, Ukrainians have fought to protect their freedom and territorial integrity...

After russia unleashed its treacherous invasion of Ukraine on 24 February 2022, the people of Ukraine repelled it in a decisive counteroffensive that thwarted the aggressor's advance and assured the continued free development of the countries and peoples of Europe. Understanding that, the entire free world sided with Ukraine, providing it with humanitarian, economic, security and military aid.

Obverse: against a smooth background is Ukraine's small coat of arms (in the center), around which is a stylized composition symbolizing the unity of people

of goodwill around the world – a circle of hands that are joined in pairs and surrounded by a blue and yellow ribbon (pad-printed); above is the semicircular legend YKPAÏHA (Ukraine); to the left is the coins' issue year – 2022; beneath is the coins' face value (semicircular) – 10 ГРИВЕНЬ (10 hryvnias) on the silver coin and 5 ГРИВЕНЬ (5 hryvnias) on the nickel silver coin.

On the nickel silver coin, the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works is located to the right.

Reverse: above, against a smooth background is the following semicircular legend: B ЄДНОСТІ – СИЛА/IN UNITY STRENGTH written in Ukrainian and English; under the legend is a stylized composition of colored flags (pad-printed) of the countries that are providing Ukraine with comprehensive aid: the United States, the UK, Poland, Canada, Estonia, Lithuania, Latvia, Italy, Switzerland, the Czech Republic, Sweden, the Netherlands, Germany, France, and Japan.

This coin celebrates the navy, a separate branch of Ukraine's Armed Forces, designed to deter or repulse, together with other branches of the Armed Forces, other military formations and law enforcement authorities, preventing armed aggression against Ukraine from the sea and in coastal areas, and protecting the sovereignty and state interests of Ukraine. The Ukrainian military is an army of indomitable and unconquered fighters and true patriots who, in this time of war, are demonstrating courage, bravery, fortitude, willpower, and a great desire to defeat the enemy. Today, millions of Ukrainians are supporting and helping Ukrainian defenders, believing in them and our shared victory!

Obverse: in the center, against a smooth background, is the emblem of the Navy of Ukraine's Armed Forces; beneath, to the left of the emblem, is Ukraine's small

coat of arms; beneath, to the right of the emblem, are the face value 10 and the graphic symbol of the hryvnia; above is the semicircular legend: ВІЙСЬКОВО-МОРСЬКІ СИЛИ ЗБРОЙНИХ СИЛ УКРАЇНИ (the Navy of Ukraine's Armed Forces); beneath is the legend 2022/УКРАЇНА (2022/Ukraine); the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works is to the right of the coin's face value.

Reverse: against the background of stylized waves are various types of ships that symbolize the Navy of Ukraine's Armed Forces. Apart from surface forces, the navy also comprises naval aviation, marines, coastal artillery and other components; above, against the backdrop of Ukraine's southern coastal borders and the country's exclusive economic zone, are the following legends: BIPHICTb,/MYЖHICTb,/CNЛA (loyalty,/courage,/strength).

These coins celebrate a Ukrainian folk song, the author of which is known. After russia's vicious war on Ukraine, this song is sung with renewed vigor as a modern symbol of Ukraine's indomitability and resistance to Russian invasion. Ukrainian songs are brilliant poetic stories, and a spiritual and moral treasury of the Ukrainian people.

It is from songs that the good, generous and beautiful souls of Ukrainians speak. Songs reflect ideals, such as love for the homeland, rejection of any oppression, courage and bravery in fighting the enemy. "Oh, the Guelder-Rose in the Meadow" is one such song, as its history is the history of the Ukrainian people.

This folk song, which has been known since Cossack times in the XVII century, was developed, added to and given a new meaning during the Ukrainian revolution in the early 20th century. It is now sung worldwide in different languages, uniting Ukrainians with previous generations of freedom fighters in Ukraine.

Obverse: against a smooth background, to the left, is Ukraine's small coat of arms; in the center,

there is a stylized symbolic composition: different generations of defenders: a Cossack, a Sich rifleman, and a modern soldier of the Ukrainian Armed Forces are raising a guelder-rose – a poeticized symbol of Ukraine, the crown of which resembles the outlines of Ukraine's borders; above is the following semicircular legend: A M/I TY/O YEPBOHY KAJI/HY ΠΙΔΙΙΜΕΜΟ (But we will raise that red guelder-rose up), beneath are the coin's issue year – 2022 and the semicircular legend YKPAÏHA (Ukraine); to the right is the coin's face value: 10 on the silver coin and 5 on the nickel silver coin; there is also the graphic symbol of the hryvnia.

On the nickel silver coin, the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works is located beneath, to the right, under the coin's face value.

Reverse: against a smooth background, above i s the semicircular legend that continues the song: A МИ НАШУ СЛАВНУ УКРАЇНУ, ГЕЙ, ГЕЙ, РОЗВЕСЕЛИМО! (And we will cheer up our glorious Ukraine, hey, hey, cheer up!); in the center is a branch with guelder-rose leaf and berries.

This commemorative coin celebrates the special forces of the Armed Forces of Ukraine, which include special purpose units and subdivisions for information and psychological warfare, staffed with highly qualified servicemen capable of performing complex, dangerous, and sometimes politically sensitive operations in the areas of intelligence, the protection of citizens' lives and state-owned objects outside of Ukraine, fighting against illegal arms trafficking, terrorism and piracy, organizing and supporting resistance movements, protecting maritime shipping, international military cooperation, etc. The battle slogan of Grand Prince of Kyiv Sviatoslav the Brave "Іду на ви!" ("Idu na vy!" or "I come at you!") was chosen as the motto of the Special Operations Forces of the Armed Forces of Ukraine. In modern times, it has become a symbol of the valor, courage and nobility of soldiers ready to defend their country.

Obverse: in the center, against a smooth background, is the emblem of the Special Operations Forces of the Ukrainian Armed Forces, to the right of which is the small coat of arms of Ukraine; the legends: above – YKPAÏHA (UKRAINE), below – face value 10 ГРИВЕНЬ (10 HRYVNIAS) and the coin's issue year 2022; to the left of the face value is the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works.

Reverse: there is a symbolic display with a Special Operations Forces soldier against the background of the outline of the image of Sviatoslav the Brave with a sword and a shield; the circular legend reads: СИЛИ СПЕЦІАЛЬНИХ ОПЕРАЦІЙ ЗБРОЙНИХ СИЛ УКРАЇНИ (THE SPECIAL OPERATIONS FORCES OF UKRAINE'S ARMED FORCES).

Yelysaveta Yaroslavna (Ellisif of Kyiv)

This coin commemorates a Princess of Kyiv, the eldest daughter of Yaroslav the Wise, under whose rule the Kyivan Rus state reached the peak of its power and who, with a diplomatic goal, concluded dynastic marriages that cemented foreign political alliances and raised the prestige of the state. In 1044, Yelysaveta became the wife of King of Norway Harald Sigurdsson, who during his first visits to Kyiv had fallen in love with the princess and, having gained fame and treasures, returned to marry her. In her second marriage, Yelysaveta Yaroslavna wed King of Denmark Sweyn II Estridsson after the death of Harald, who was killed in battle. The main sources containing information about Yelysaveta are the Icelandic sagas, the West European chronicles, and poems by Harald himself, which he composed in honor of Yaroslav's daughter.

Obverse: above, against a smooth background is the small coat of arms of Ukraine; an ornament with an interwoven trident, which decorates an inlaid iron ax dated the 10th-13th centuries, is in the center;

to the right and to the left are stylized ornaments typical of medieval Scandinavia and Kyivan Rus, which underline close relations and contacts between the two states in the Middle Ages; the legends read the following: YKPAÏHA/2022 (UKRAINE/2022) (under the coat of arms), the coin's face value – 2 and the hryvnia's graphic symbol – (below); the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works (to the left on the background of the ornament).

Reverse: there is a stylized image of Yelysaveta Yaroslavna against the background of a decorative frieze with Scandinavian wood and stone carving patterns illustrating her husband Harald Sigurdsson's military and poetic talents; and the legends in the style of ancient Norse runes reading: ЕЛЛІСІФ КОРОЛЕВА/ НОРВЕГІЇ ТА ДАНІЇ (ELLISIF QUEEN/NORWAY AND DENMARK) (on both sides of Yelysaveta's image), ОЛИСАВА ЄЛИЗАВЕТА/ЯРОСЛАВНА (OLYSAVA YELYSAVETA/YAROSLAVNA) (below).

Chornobyl. Rebirth. The Brown Bear

This commemorative coin features the brown bear. The Chornobyl Radiation and Ecological Biosphere Reserve – located in the area affected by the Chornobyl nuclear power plant disaster – is a unique nature reserve in Ukraine. Despite suffering a catastrophe on a planetary scale, nature has been recovering here at a surprisingly fast pace. These vast areas have become a kind of reserve for the recovery of fauna typical for the Polesia region, including animals on the list of endangered species. The area is seeing the return of large animals to their natural habitats from which they were previously completely eliminated by humans. One of these species is the brown bear, which reappeared in the decades following the accident, a hundred years after it was last seen there. Photo traps have from time to time recordedthe presence brown bears in the reserve. Experts suggest that in the future about 40 brown bears may comfortably live in both reserves – the Chornobyl reserve and the Polesia State Radiation and Ecological Reserve (in the territory of belarus), which borders the Chornobyl reserve.

Obverse: above is Ukraine's small coat of arms with the following legends: YKPAÏHA (Ukraine) (underneath the coat of arms); the coin's face value 5/ГРИВЕНЬ (5/hryvnias) (to the right of the coat of arms); in the center is a wheel of life that symbolizes the rebirth of nature: a stylized international radioactive sign shrouded in leaves surrounded by animals that are increasing their populations in the 30-kilometer exclusion zone, which has become a special breeding reserve for black storks, Przewalski's horses, lynxes, bison, moose, and brown bears; there is a circular legend against a smooth background, reading: ЧОРНОБИЛЬСЬКИЙ РАДІАЦІЙНО-ЕКОЛОГІЧНИЙ БІОСФЕРНИЙ ЗАПОВІДНИК (Chornobyl Radiation and Ecological Biosphere Reserve) (to the left), CHORNOBYL RADIATION AND ECOLOGICAL BIOSPHERE RESERVE; the coin's issue year 2022 (below); and the mint mark of the NBU Banknote Printing and Minting Works (above).

Reverse: against the outline of a landscape scene is a brown bear (pad printing), above there is the legend, against a smooth background: ВЕДМІДЬ/БУРИЙ (BEAR/BROWN) / URSUS ARCTOS; above is a sow with a cub.

This commemorative coin honors a specialized agency of central executive power operating in the field of special communications and information protection.

The State Service of Special Communications and Information Protection of Ukraine is tasked with guaranteeing Ukraine's national security, and addressing external and internal threats. It is part of the security and defense sector of Ukraine, acting as the main subject of the national cybersecurity system.

On the very first days of russia's military aggression against Ukraine, the State Service of Special Communications and Information Protection of Ukraine stood up to protect the information space by participating in measures to counter hacker attacks. The service's specialists also provide informational support to civilians and military personnel, publishing explanations and advice on the use of various channels and means of communications.

Obverse: above is Ukraine's small coat of arms, to the right of which is the legend saying YKPAÏHA/2022 (UKRAINE/2022); the emblem of the State Service for Special Communications and Information Protection of Ukraine is in the center, against the background of stylized binary codes; below the emblem against a smooth background are the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works and the coin's face value Π'ЯΤЬ ΓΡИΒΕΗЬ (FIVE HRYVNIAS) (a semicircular legend).

This coin celebrates St. Volodymyr's Cathedral – an architectural gem of Kyiv. The cathedral, which is built in the Neo-Byzantine style, is notable both for its history and interior paintings, which are true masterpieces of art.

A lot of money was donated for the construction of the cathedral, which lasted for 20 years – from 1862 until 1882. For more than 10 years, work was carried out on the interior decorations of the cathedral, the main treasures of which are its unique paintings.

Obverse: above, against a smooth background is Ukraine's small coat of arms, to the right and left of which is the semicircular legend НАЦІОНАЛЬНИЙ

БАНК УКРАЇНИ (National Bank of Ukraine); against an ornamental backdrop is the cathedral's main facade (pad-printed), below which is an ornamented band; beneath is the coin's face value – П'ЯТЬ/ГРИВЕНЬ (five/hryvnias); to the left of the cathedral is the coin's issue year – 2022; to the right of the cathedral is the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works.

Reverse: there is an ornamented decorative element from the historical cathedral, below which are the years of the cathedral's construction 1862 – 1882; beneath are an ornamented band and the legend ВОЛОДИМИРСЬКИЙ/СОБОР (St. Volodymyr's/Cathedral).

Solomiya Krushelnytska

This coin celebrates Solomiya Krushelnytska, who was a Ukrainian opera and chamber singer (dramatic soprano).

Musical experts have described her as "unforgettable", "unsurpassed", "the one and only", and "a most beautiful and charming Butterfly." Krushelnytska performed a variety of soprano parts, in particular from operas by Richard Wagner, Richard Strauss and Giacomo Puccini. Her repertoire included over 60 opera parts that have greatly influenced the development of the world's vocal arts. She also skillfully sang Ukrainian folk songs and promoted Ukrainian music.

Thanks to her creative work she established friendship with Ivan Franko, Vasyl Stefanyk, Olha Kobylianska, Mykola Lysenko, and Oleksandr Myshuha. Obverse: in the center is an image of Krushelnytska performing Verdi's Aida; on both sides of Krushelnytska are stylized stage wings embellished with decorative ornaments; to the left is Ukraine's small coat of arms; above, against the backdrop of the decorative ornament, is the legend УΚΡΑΪΗΑ (Ukraine); to the right is the coin's issue year – 2022; beneath is the coin's face value – ДВІ ГРИВНІ (two hryvnias); to the right, above the issue year, is the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works.

Reverse: against a smooth background is a portrait of Krushelnytska, to the right of which is a stylized butterfly wing, symbolizing one of the singer's most famous opera roles "Madama Butterfly"; to the left are the singer's years of birth and death — 1872/1952 and the semicircular legend СОЛОМІЯ КРУШЕЛЬНИЦЬКА (Solomiya Krushelnytska).

These coins commemorate the granting of EU candidate status to Ukraine. Obtaining the status is an important result of Ukraine's long path to European integration. The summit of the European Council held on 23 June 2022 has gone down in history, while the positive decision of the EU's leaders demonstrated solidarity with Ukraine in these difficult times for the country.

Obverse: against a smooth background, is a stylized image of the European continent, to the left of which is a decorative element in the form of mosaic decorations - symbolizing various nations and cultures, the freedom to make one's own life choices, and the absence of formal borders; on the European continent, an outline of Ukraine is traced - showing that Ukraine, like a puzzle piece, completes the integrity of Europe and "returns" to its European home, in which the country has always had an indirect presence, which began with the dynastic ties of Kyivan Rus; to the right are Ukraine's small coat of arms, the semicircular

legend YKPAÏHA (Ukraine), the coin's face value – 10 on the silver coin and 5 on the nickel silver coin, and the graphic symbol of the hryvnia (on both coins); beneath are the coins' issue year - 2022 and the legend ПОВЕРНЕННЯ ДОДОМУ (the return home).

The nickel silver coin also features the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works (under the map of Ukraine).

Reverse: against the backdrop of stylized tridents is a map of Ukraine, decorated with a national embroidery ornament (on the silver coin the map features a holographic element that has dynamic light effects: when looked at from different angles, the images of the ornament, sunrays and an administrative map of Ukraine change dynamically); the map is surrounded by 12 stars symbolizing the unity of European nations; there is the following circular legend: НАДАННЯ СТАТУСУ КРАЇНИ-КАНДИДАТА НА ЧЛЕНСТВО В ЄС (The Granting of the Status of Candidate for EU Membership).

This banknote celebrates the 300th anniversary of the birth of Hryhorii Skovoroda – a prominent Ukrainian philosopher, poet and teacher, who studied at the Kyiv Mohyla Academy.

Skovoroda is one of the foremost figures in Ukrainian philosophy and literature. Skovoroda, whose thoughts focused on the vital and existentially important problems of human existence, remains an influential figure, thinker and writer.

An organic combination of personal and public motifs is the most characteristic feature of Skovoroda's poetry. The collection of poems "The Garden of Divine Songs" is a kind of lyrical diary of Skovoroda, describing events in the poet's life, as well as his moral and philosophical reflections on the meaning of life, true happiness, goodness, honesty, and so on. The collection consists of 30 songs.

WITHIN MY MIND A SINGLE THOUGHT INTENSE SEEKS HOW TO LIVE, AND DIE, IN INNOCENCE.. O FEARFUL DEATH! THOU SCYTHE THAT SLITS ALL LIFE! EVEN THE HEADS OF KINGS THOU SPAREST NOT. ALIKE TO CZAR AND PEASANT COMES THY KNIFE, DEVOURING ALL, LIKE STRAW IN BLAZES HOT. ONLY THAT MAN HER SHARP STEEL NEED NOT FEAR WHOSE CONSCIENCE, AT HIS DEATH, IS CRYSTAL CLEAR. above is the following legend: САД БОЖЕСТВЕННИХ ПІСЕНЬ (Garden of Divine Songs).

This set celebrates the main state regalia and the symbols of Ukraine that embody the national idea and reflect the state's historical continuity.

Ukrainian state symbols tell millions of Ukrainians about the glory of their ancestors.

The trident – a symbol of the Kyiv state of Volodymyr the Great – symbolizes the continuity of the historical development of the Ukrainian people

The song "Ukraine is not Yet Dead" has, for a century and a half, become a powerful symbol of Ukrainians' struggle for independence, and is now their national anthem.

The combination of blue and yellow – which has long been used by Ukrainians to represent their identity, and which stands for a clear sky and a wheat field – was for the first time officially approved as the Ukrainian flag by the Ukrainian People's Republic.

The set consists of the following coins: Ukraine's Coat of Arms, Ukraine's Flag, and Ukraine's Anthem.

Obverse of Ukraine's Coat of Arms coin: above is Ukraine's small coat of arms – a golden trident on a blue shield (pad-printed); against the backdrop of sunrays is a stylized trident of the kind that was used by Volodymyr the Great; the lines of the trident show how tridents are formed; to the left are the legends 2022/YKPAÏHA/5 & (2022/Ukraine/5), the graphic symbol of the hryvnia and the legend /HALII/ГЕРБ (Ukraine's coat of arms); beneath is the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works.

Reverse of Ukraine's Coat of Arms coin: surrounded by sunrays is a composition made of tridents that symbolizes Ukraine's historical heritage – from the two-pronged symbol of Sviatoslav the Brave, to tridents on gold and silver coins of the Kyiv State, symbols used during Ukraine's liberation struggle in 1917–1921, and up to the modern symbol

of Ukraine – its coat of arms (latent image); to the left is the legend HAWE KOPIHHЯ (our roots).

Obverse of Ukraine's Flag coin: above is Ukraine's small coat of arms; against the backdrop of sunrays is a flapping stylized blue and yellow flag (pad-printed); to the left are the legend 2022/УКРАЇНА/5 (2022/ Ukraine/5 €), the graphic symbol of the hryvnia and the legend /НАШ/ СТЯГ (Ukraine's flag); beneath are the following lines from the Flag poem: СИНІЙ, ЯК МОРЕ, ЯК ДЕНЬ, ЗОЛОТИЙ – /З НЕБА І СОНЦЯ НАШ ПРАПОР ЯСНИЙ./ОЛЕКСАНДР ОЛЕСЬ (as blue as the sea, as gold as daylight – /from sky and sunlight our flag is bright./Oleksandr Oles; there is also the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works.

Reverse of Ukraine's Flag coin: surrounded by sunrays is an ornamented stylized bird, holding a guelder-rose branch and symbolizing the soul of Ukrainians who strive for freedom and independence; beneath is the legend HALIIA ДУША (our soul).

Obverse of Ukraine's Anthem coin: against the background of a guelder-rose branch with red berries (pad-printed) are Ukraine's small coat of arms and a music sheet against the backdrop of sunrays; to the left are the legend 2022/YKPAÏHA/5 $\frac{2}{3}$ (2022/Ukraine/5), the graphic symbol of the hryvnia and the legend /HALII/FIMH (Ukraine's anthem); there is also the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works.

Reverse of Ukraine's Anthem coin: surrounded by sunrays is Ukrainian folk hero Cossack Mamai under the trunk of an oak tree – a free spirit, defender, warrior, traveler, and a skilled rider – symbolizing Ukrainian mentality and the eternal defender of Ukraine; the Cossack has modern attributes – instead of a sabre there is a modern assault rifle on the oak tree; above the image of the Cossack is the following semicircular legend (lines from the anthem): ДУШУ Й ТІЛО МИ ПОЛОЖИМ ЗА НАШУ СВОБОДУ/І ПОКАЖЕМ, ЩО МИ, БРАТТЯ, КОЗАЦЬКОГО РОДУ (Soul and body shall we lay down for our freedom/ and show that we are brethren of the Cossack nation) – the words that are still relevant; the legend HALIJE ГАСЛО (our motto) is to the right of the Cossack.

This coin celebrates Archangel Michael – one of the most revered biblical characters, who is called the chief commander of the Heavenly Host. Archangel Michael is a steadfast fighter against evil forces, defender of the faith, and the patron of soldiers who fight for just causes and protect the good.

Archangel Michael has been revered since the time of the Kyiv Rus State – he was a symbol of the heavenly protection of the power of Kyiv Rus princes. Later on, this reverence was manifested not only in toponyms – in the names of church buildings, but also in heraldry – on the coats of arms of Kyiv, the Voivodeship of Kyiv, and the Province of Kyiv. Today, his image is found in the attributes of Ukrainian paratroopers, embodying once again the fight against evil.

This coin celebrates Pavlo Hlazovyi, who was one of the most popular Ukrainian humorous poets. Hlazovyi was an honored artist of Ukraine, a recipient of Ostap Vyshnia Award in 1988, and the first recipient of Petro Sahaidachnyi Award in 1996.

The humorist drew inspiration from the treasures of the living Ukrainian language, tapping real gems of folk wisdom as inexhaustible sources for his work. The satirist had a gentle and cheering sense of humor; his fables are witty and apt; a lot of his works resemble folk humor and put people in good spirits.

The writer uses humor to express love for his native land, his people, and his affection for the Ukrainian language and Ukrainian art, lifting people's spirits in the most difficult times. Hlazovyi's works are also a window into the cheerful nature of the Ukrainian people.

Obverse: above, against a smooth background is the semicircular legend YKPAÏHA (Ukraine),

Ukrainian Peacekeeping Soldiers – this coin celebrates Ukrainian servicemen participating in numerous peacekeeping missions.

Standing Guard over Life – this coin honors combat medics. These are professionals combining medical and military knowledge. Saving the lives of Ukrainian defenders every day, they perform the feat of showing mercy, valor, and steadfastness.

The Soldier KrAZ-6322 – this coin features a multipurpose all-wheel drive vehicle, designed to transport personnel, various types of cargo for military units, special forces units, and UN peacekeeping forces.

The Air Force of Ukraine's Armed Forces – this coin celebrates the Air Force, one of branches of the Ukrainian Armed Forces. Being a powerful and technologically advanced branch of the Armed Forces, the Air Force is one of the main instruments for fending off military aggression against Ukraine.

Fallen Defenders' Day – this coin pays tribute to and perpetuates the heroism of soldiers and military volunteers who have given their lives for Ukraine.

The State Border Guard Service of Ukraine — this coin honors the special-purpose law enforcement agency, which is tasked with ensuring the inviolability of the state border and protecting the sovereign rights of Ukraine on the frontiers and in the exclusive (maritime) economic zone.

This roll celebrates the territorial defense forces of Ukraine's Armed Forces. This is a special unit of Ukraine's Armed Forces that is responsible for organizing, preparing and carrying out territorial defense tasks as set forth in Ukraine's Law On the Basics of National Resistance.

Each roll features a holographic element designed to control access to the contents of the roll. The holographic element is made of a multi-layer metallized film and has the form of round self-adhesive labels 25 mm in diameter (the foil is silver in color). Any attempt to remove the holographic image from the roll destroys the image, creating a characteristic pattern in the form of honeycombs, making it impossible to reuse the holographic element and indicating that a roll has been compromised.

The holographic element depicts the logotypes of the National Bank of Ukraine and the Territorial Defense Forces of Ukraine's Armed Forces.

The background of the holographic element has dynamic light effects: when looked at from different angles, the colors of the lines that form the logotypes of the National Bank of Ukraine and the Territorial Defense Forces of Ukraine's Armed Forces, as well as those of other legends, microlettering and micro images, change dynamically.

Obverse: above is Ukraine's small coat of arms; in the center, surrounded by an old Rus ornament is the following semicircular legend: УКРАЇНА/10/ ГРИВЕНЬ (Ukraine/10/hryvnias); against the backdrop of the ornament are the coins' issue year – 2022 (beneath) and the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works (to the right).

This medal celebrates the Ukrainian National Museum of Chicago, which also serves as an archive. The museum, which was established by the efforts of several generations of emigrants to preserve the spiritual heritage of the Ukrainian people, represents Ukrainian history and culture on the American continent.

Founded in 1952, the museum plays an important role in the cultural and artistic world of the Ukrainian diaspora in the United States, serving as a place where people can unite around the idea of Ukraine's independence, and shaping the national identity of Ukrainians.

The museum boasts about 100,000 pieces of archive materials about the history and culture of Ukraine and unique relics of the past – from the Cossack age to the present, which tell about the national

liberation struggle, artificial famine as an act of genocide against the Ukrainian people, and their path to independence.

Obverse: there is a stylized composition that symbolizes a respectful and reverential attitude to the Ukrainian heritage that is stored at the museum: hands supporting the logotype of the museum; above the hands is a guelder rose branch; beneath are Ukraine's small coat of arms, the semicircular legend YKPAÏHA (Ukraine) and the medal's issue year –20/22; under the composition is the mint mark of the NBU's Banknote Printing and Minting Works.

This medal celebrates unconquered Kherson and heroic Kherson oblast, which is washed by two seas, and through which run land routes to occupied Crimea.

Kherson oblast, which has a long history, is the land of Cossack glory and a cradle of shipbuilding. Kherson oblast was occupied by the enemy from the first days of the full-scale invasion, with Kherson being the only regional center that the russian invaders managed to capture from 24 February 2022.

Kherson oblast became one of the centers of the partisan resistance movement. Despite the danger and aggression, city and oblast residents resolutely attended rallies and launched a public resistance movement.

The city, which was occupied for 256 days, was liberated by Ukraine's Armed Forces and came again under the Ukrainian flag.

This medal celebrates the heroic, proud and unconquered city of Kharkiv. The city, which since the first days of the full-scale russian invasion of Ukraine had been subjected to mass terror attacks – bombings, shelling, the destruction of residential buildings and infrastructure, the loss of human life in the city and the entire oblast – still continued to resist the enemy.

Kharkiv is a city of heroes who proved to the entire world that they can endure hardship: babies were born, students were taught, and the economy of the city adapted to the war conditions, to the sound of explosions. A lot of entrepreneurs have changed their business lines and put their businesses in what they call "military mode." The city's cultural figures, artists, poets, writers and activists were fighting on their own frontline.

The lightning counteroffensive in Kharkiv oblast fulfilled its strategic goal – it changed the course of the war and was one of the first significant successes of Ukraine's Armed Forces on the way to the complete restoration of Ukraine's territorial integrity.

This medal celebrates the inhuman valor, great strength, indomitable spirit, struggle, heroism and tragedy of the city of Mariupol and the hero-fighters of the city who valiantly defended the city from russian invaders.

The resolute resistance of Mariupol's defenders frustrated russia's objective to capture Mariupol quickly, drawing the enemy forces and weapons onto themselves, and slowing the advances of russian troops in other operational areas.

The defense of Mariupol and Azovstal, which lasted for 86 days, during 82 days of which the defenders were completely besieged, is one of the most outstanding examples of the valor of Ukrainian soldiers in recent history.

Obverse: above is the legend YKPAÏHA (Ukraine), under which is Ukraine's small Coat of Arms; there is the following composition that symbolizes the hero city: the facade of Mariupol Drama Theater while

This medal celebrates the fortitude, resilience and heroism of Ukrainians and honors the memory of the dead.

After the russian invasion on 24 February 2022, fierce fighting broke out in Irpin, Hostomel, Bucha, and other towns and villages in the suburbs of Kyiv. With a view to encircling Kyiv, columns of armored vehicles and airborne troops of the russian army captured populated areas near the capital. There they destroyed a lot of housing and infrastructure and committed mass war crimes against the civilian population: looting, physical violence, and the kidnapping and killing of people, including children.

On 2 April 2022, Kyiv oblast was liberated from the russian invaders thanks to the joint efforts, professionalism and heroism of all defense forces, and help provided by local residents.

The liberation revealed the terrible truth about the horrific mass killings of civilians and the atrocities committed by the occupiers. These crimes shocked the global community so much that it launched an investigation of the war crimes and crimes against humanity caused by russia's aggression against Ukraine.

In 2022, the NBU continued to make Archangel Michael bullion coins that were designed in 2020.

Bullion coins are a special group of modern coins designed to be bought by a wide range of investors, including private individuals. Such coins are legal tender and are also classified as investment metals.

Bullion coins are a convenient way to make savings that is used by people in many countries.

Taras Shevchenko (1814–1861) was an outstanding Ukrainian poet, artist and thinker, the founder of the new Ukrainian literature. His collection of poetry "Kobzar" has been translated into many languages.

The back of the note features the image of the Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv.

On 15 July 1834, the university inauguration took place. Taras Shevchenko worked as a teacher of drawing of the University school of painters, at the same time holding a post in the Archaeographic Commission of the University (an ad hoc commission for study and publishing of historical documents). In March of 1939, on the occasion of the 125th anniversary of the birth of Taras Shevchenko, the University was named after him.

To support cash circulation, the National Bank of Ukraine on 19 December 2022 issued a 100-hryvnia banknote designed in 2014, which bears the signature of NBU Governor Andriy Pyshnyy and the banknote's issue year -2022.





Both sides of the coin have a continuous embossed rim around them.
