DIFFICULTY:



FINISED SIZE: 58" x 72"

FABRIC SHOWN: Birch Organic Double Gauze

TAKE FLIGHT QUILT

Soft, suple and ready to cuddle! This Double Gauze quilt is perfectly plush. In a gorgeous array of color, this pattern by Ashley Miller of Fiberton Acres is perfect for a bed topper, picnic blanket or your favorite couch throw. Hand quilting with embroider floss adds a charming detail.







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CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Trace pattern piece and cut 180 total pieces for a 58"x72" quilt top. We cut 12 pieces of each of the 15 fabrics.

NOTE: If you are cutting pieces from fabric with a right side only, make sure to cut half of pieces and then flip pattern piece so they will fit together.

METHOD:

Lay out 20 pieces in the order you like to make one panel, or column. It can be matching colors, etc, or completely organic. You will create 9 columns total.



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SEAM ALLOWANCE: 1/4"

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

- 1/2 yard of each of the following (all Double Gauze):

Flight Dusk

Flight Coral

Flight Pool

Flight Shroom

Flight Sun

Poppies Dusk

Poppies Coral

Poppies Pool

Poppies Shroom

Poppies Sun

Solid Cream

Solid Coral

Solid Pool

Solid Shroom

Solid Sun


- 1/2 yard of fabric for binding (we used Solid Shroom)

- 4 2/3 yards of 44" wide fabric for backing

OTHER SUPPLIES:

- 10 8.7 yard skeins of embroidery floss to hand stitch

Start by sewing pieces 2 together at a time with right sides together. You will have 10 blocks of two cut pieces to form each column. Press all seams open as you sew.





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
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Sew from opposite directions when sewing the columns together. This will help the fabric from shifting too much. Press seams open as you sew.

Start sewing the columns together here, alternating directions.





Using your rotary cutter, cut the quilt top along the dotted lines to square up your quilt. Once you've completed this step, you're done! Hooray!

FINISH YOUR QUILT:

Press out your quilt top and make a quilt sandwich with your batting and backing. With the right sized of the quilt top and backing right sides out.

We chose to hand quilt using embroidery floss to excentuate the the design and fluffiness of the double gauze.

VOILA!
