

# ISLAND PANEL QUILT

A quick and fun quilt to showcase panels or large scale focal prints using strips and half square triangles! Instructions are set up for panels measuring  $20 \times 32$ ", but can be easily modified to accommodate any size by adjusting the size of your strip units that frame the center. Finished sample quilt measures  $56 \times 66$ ". Pattern uses a 1/4" seam allowance for all seams and assumes you have some basic quilting knowledge.

#### COLOR GUIDE



#### YARDAGE & CUTTING CHART

<b>C1</b> (1/2 YD)	(18) 6" squares	
<b>C2</b> (2/3 YD)	(5) 6" squares	(5) 3.5" x WOF strips
<b>C3</b> (1/4 YD)	(3) 6" squares	
<b>C4</b> (1/2YD)		(5) 3.5" x WOF strips
<b>C5</b> (2/3 YD)	(1) 6" square	(5) 3.5" x WOF strips
<b>C6</b> (1/4 YD)	(3) 6" squares	
<b>C7</b> (1/2 YD)	(3) 6" squares	(3) 3.5" X WOF strips
<b>C8</b> (1/2 YD)	(2) 6" squares	(3) 3.5" X WOF strips
<b>C9</b> (1/2 YD)	(1 ) 6" square	(3) 3.5" X WOF strips


#### PANEL



Cut panel or focal fabric to 20.5" wide by 32.5" tall. Modifying this measurement is very easy, but keep in mind your inner and outer border will need to be adjusted.

For the binding, I cut 2.5" strips from the rest of the panel piece.

# HALF SQUARE TRIANGLES



#### GLOSSARY


WOF = width of fabric
HST = half square triangle
SA = seam allowance
// = fabric length continues

### TOOLS

- Rotary mat & cutter
- Long ruler
- Minimum 6" square (very helpful!)
- Coordinting thread
- Iron & mat for pressing

#### STRIPS

Sew together (3) WOF strips of colors 2, 4, 5, 7, 8, and 9 on the short side. Press SA as desired. You will have (2) remaining WOF strips of colors 2, 4, and 5.




Sew together your long strips and remaining WOF strips of inner and outter borders together:



These will be cut down further, but wait until the final assembly before trimming.

## HALF SQUARE TRIANGLES

Four at a time style! With two 6" squares, (one always being Color 1, which acts as the backgroud) right sides facing, sew all the way around the outter edge, pivoting at the corners. Cut the squares into four pieces along the diagonal. Press each square open and SA to the darker fabric. Trim each HST to 3.5". Voila! 4 HST from two squares!

#### **ASSEMBLY**


Assemble your quilt top with sewing your long, pieced inner strip units to the vertical sides of your panel. Sew one side, keeping the whole unit intact, and trimming off the exess. Keep your strips long and leaving a bit extra on the top as shown. Trim the top and bottom back to 32.5".

From the remaning strip unit, cut two pieces that measure 20.5" wide. Sew the appropriate HST units to each end, and sew onto the top and bottom of the panel.



Repeat the same steps to assemble your outside border, the only difference is you will cut the top and bottom strip units at 38" wide.

Quilt and bind to finish!
