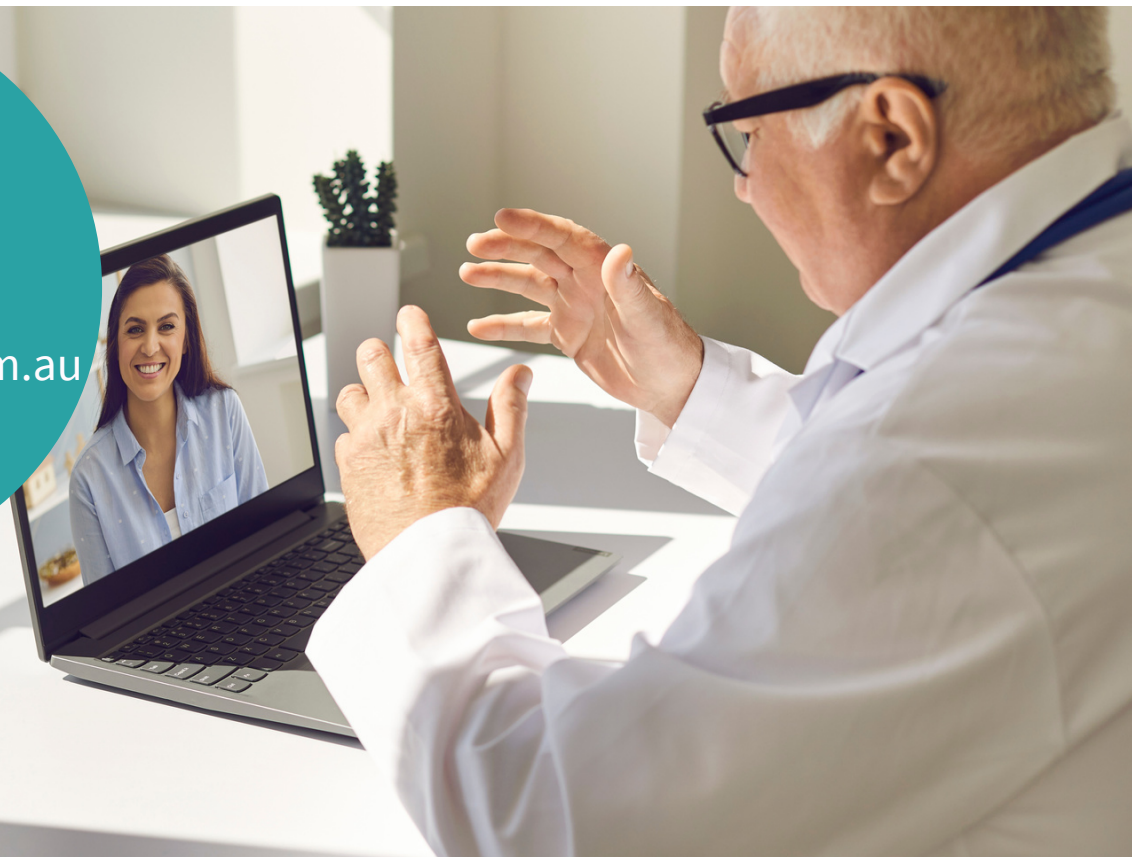

	MBS	Description	Fee
Organise and Coordinate a multidisciplinary case conference	743	Attendance by GP, where the conference time is at least 40 minutes	\$213.15
Participate in a multidisciplinary case conference	758	Attendance by GP, where the conference time is at least 40 minutes	\$156.65

These services are for patients who:

- Have at least one medical condition that:
 - Has been (or is likely to be) present for at least six months; or
 - Is terminal; and
- Require ongoing care from a multidisciplinary case conference team which includes:
 - A medical practitioner, and;
 - At least two other members, each of whom provides a different kind of care or service to a patient and is not a family carer of the patient, and one of whom may be another medical practitioner. May include allied health practitioners; mental health workers; psychologists; registered nurses; social workers; home and community service providers, or care organisers, such as: interpreters. **Dokotela can organise free interpreters or engage our case coordinator.**
