# Executive Summary

## Hate Crime in California

### 2022

*Hate Crime in California 2022* presents statistics on hate crimes reported by California law enforcement agencies that occurred during 2022 with prior years included for context. These statistics include the reported number of hate crime events<sup>1</sup>, hate crime offenses<sup>2</sup>, victims of hate crimes, and suspects of hate crimes. This report also provides statistics reported by district and elected city attorneys on the number of hate crime cases referred to prosecutors, the number of cases filed in court, and the disposition of those cases. For the purposes of this report, a hate crime refers to a criminal offense against a person or property motivated in whole or in part by an offender's bias against a race, religion, disability, sexual orientation, ethnicity, gender, or gender identity. The total number of hate crime events, offenses, victims, and suspects increased in 2022 over 2021.

The following statements highlight the major trends in *Hate Crime in California* for 2022.

## Crime Data

The amount of hate crime events has gone up and down over the last decade. In the last 10 years, hate crime events have increased by 145.7 percent (Table 11). The lowest year for reported hate crime events was 2014 with 758 events (Table 11).

Reported hate crime events increased 20.2 percent from 1,763 in 2021 to 2,120 in 2022. (Table 11)

Reported hate crime offenses increased 16.6 percent from 2,221 in 2021 to 2,589 in 2022. (Table 12)

The number of victims of reported hate crimes increased 13.5 percent from 2,180 in 2021 to 2,474 in 2022. (Table 15)

The number of suspects of reported hate crimes increased 22.8 percent from 1,654 in 2021 to 2,031 in 2022. (Table 15)

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<sup>1</sup> The term **event** is defined as an occurrence where a hate crime is involved. (In this report, the information about the event is a crime report or source document that meets the criteria for a hate crime.) There may be one or more suspects involved, one or more victims targeted, and one or more offenses involved for each event.

<sup>2</sup> The term **offense** is defined as criminal acts that are recorded as follows: murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, arson, simple assault, fondling, kidnapping/abduction, intimidation, destruction/vandalism, false pretense/swindle, hacking/computer invasion, and weapons law violation as defined by the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Reporting Program and in their national Hate Crimes Statistics Report.

Reported hate crime events involving a racial bias overall increased 11.4 percent from 1,165 in 2021 to 1,298 in 2022. (Table 11)

- Anti-black or African American bias events rose from 513 in 2021 to 652 in 2022, an increase of 27.1 percent.
- Anti-other ethnicity/national origin events rose from 55 in 2021 to 96 in 2022, an increase of 74.5 percent.
- Anti-Asian bias events fell from 247 in 2021 to 140 in 2022, a decrease of 43.3 percent.

Reported hate crime events involving a religion bias increased 39 percent from 218 in 2021 to 303 in 2022. (Table 11)

- Anti-Jewish bias events rose from 152 in 2021 to 189 in 2022, an increase of 24.3 percent.
- Anti-Islamic (Muslim) bias events rose from 18 in 2021 to 26 in 2022.
- Anti-Protestant bias events rose from 2 in 2021 to 12 in 2022.

Reported hate crime events involving a sexual orientation bias increased 29 percent from 303 in 2021 to 391 in 2022. (Table 11)

- Anti-gay (male) bias events rose from 211 in 2021 to 271 in 2022, an increase of 28.4 percent.
- Anti-homosexual bias events rose from 61 in 2021 to 81 in 2022, an increase of 32.8 percent.

Reported hate crime events involving a gender bias increased from 54 in 2021 to 84 in 2022, an increase of 55.6 percent. (Table 11)

- Anti-transgender bias events rose from 38 in 2021 to 59 in 2022.
- Anti-gender non-conforming events rose from 7 in 2021 to 12 in 2022.

Reported hate crime offenses increased 16.6 percent from 2,221 in 2021 to 2,589 in 2022. (Table 13)

- Violent crime offenses increased 11.6 percent from 1,604 in 2021 to 1,790 in 2022. (Table 13)
- Property crime offenses increased 26.7 percent from 599 in 2021 to 759 in 2022. (Table 13)

## Prosecutorial Data

The number of hate crimes referred for prosecution increased 5.9 percent from 611 in 2021 to 647 in 2022. Of the 647 hate crimes that were referred for prosecution, 456 cases were filed by district attorneys and elected city attorneys for prosecution. Of the 456 cases that were filed for prosecution, 282 were filed as hate crimes and 174 were filed as non-bias motivated crimes. (Table 7A)

Of the 122 cases with a disposition available for this report:

- 43.4 percent (53) were hate crime convictions;
- 45.9 percent (56) were other convictions; and
- 10.7 percent (13) were not convicted. (Table 7B)

# Understanding the Data

## Characteristics and Known Limitations

### Crime Data

Local law enforcement agencies are required to report hate crimes to the Department of Justice (DOJ) in compliance with California Penal Code section 13023. California Penal Code section 422.55 defines a hate crime as “a criminal act committed, in whole or in part, because of one or more of the following actual or perceived characteristics of the victim: (1) Disability, (2) Gender, (3) Nationality, (4) Race or ethnicity, (5) Religion, (6) Sexual orientation, (7) Association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.”

The following information and limitations should be considered when using hate crime data:

- 1) A hate crime event contains the occurrence of one or more criminal offenses, committed against one or more victims, by one or more suspects or perpetrators. Victims can have more than one offense committed against them.
- 2) Hate crimes reported by law enforcement agencies are counted in a specific way. In each hate crime event, the DOJ counts the total number of victims, the total number of suspects, and the total number of criminal offenses in one event. These totals are then classified and counted by type of bias motivation (e.g., anti-black or African American, anti-Hispanic or Latino, anti-Jewish, anti-gay, etc.), type of crime (e.g., murder, aggravated assault, burglary, destruction/vandalism, etc.), the location where the crime took place (e.g., residence, street, synagogue, school, etc.), and the type of victim (e.g., individual, property, etc.).
- 3) The DOJ requested that each law enforcement agency establish procedures incorporating a two-tier review (decision-making) process. The first level is done by the initial officer who responds to the suspected hate crime incident. At the second level, each report is reviewed by at least one other officer to confirm that the event was, in fact, a hate crime.
- 4) Caution should be used when making jurisdictional comparisons. The following factors should be considered: demographic diversity and population density; size of law enforcement agencies; and the training received in the identification of hate crimes by law enforcement officers in each jurisdiction.
- 5) The following factors may influence the volume of hate crimes reported to the DOJ:
  - Cultural practices of individuals and their likeliness to report hate crimes to law enforcement agencies.
  - Strength and investigative emphasis of law enforcement agencies.
  - Policies of law enforcement agencies.
  - Community policing policies.

6) In 2011, the DOJ expanded the acceptable location codes for the California hate crime data collection system to reflect modifications implemented at the national level.

In 2013, the DOJ expanded the gender bias for the California hate crime data collection system to include gender non-conforming in order to reflect modifications implemented at the national level.

In 2014, the DOJ expanded the religion bias for the California hate crime data collection system to include Sikh in order to reflect modifications implemented at the national level.

In 2015, the DOJ expanded the race and ethnicity bias for the California hate crime data collection system to include Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander in order to reflect modifications implemented at the national level.

7) In 2013, the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program revised the definition of "forcible rape" (the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will) to "rape," which is now defined as "penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ of another person, without the consent of the victim." The California DOJ implemented this definition change in January 2014.

8) In 2016, the FBI Director informed all state Statistical Analysis Centers that the FBI UCR program would be transitioning to a National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) only data collection by January 1, 2021. The California DOJ embarked on a five-year effort to develop and implement a new state repository, the California Incident Based Reporting System (CIBRS) to house the new FBI statistical reporting format. The CIBRS repository is a combination of the federal NIBRS requirements with additional California specific data elements. The California DOJ began collecting data in CIBRS in 2021.

The data represented in this 2022 publication are a combination of both the summary incident and incident based reporting (IBR) formats. Hate Crime data were already reported at the incident level prior to the implementation of IBR. The changes reflected in this year's publication as a result of the implementation of IBR impact the following areas: victim types and offenses. IBR expands the values associated with these two areas allowing for a more complete and descriptive picture of hate crime occurring in California.



## **County District Attorney and Elected City Attorney Prosecutorial Data**

The following information and limitations should be considered when interpreting hate crime cases:

- 1) In order to show the criminal justice system's response to hate crimes, in 1995 the Attorney General asked all district attorneys and elected city attorneys to submit summary data of complaints filed and convictions secured.
- 2) The 2022 District Attorney's and Elected City Attorney's Report File of Hate Crime Cases contains summary data based on cases referred to each district attorney or elected city attorney, and filings and convictions that occurred from January 1, 2022, through December 31, 2022.
- 3) When viewing prosecutorial data, it is not possible to relate the number of hate crimes reported by law enforcement agencies to the number of hate crimes prosecuted by district attorneys and city attorneys. First, crimes often occur in different reporting years than their subsequent prosecutions. Second, the number of crimes reported by law enforcement is much higher than those calling for prosecutorial action since the latter requires an arrested defendant who can be prosecuted in a court of law.
- 4) The annual prosecutorial report collects data on the total number of hate crime cases filed and the total number of hate crime convictions as reported by each district attorney or elected city attorney. There is no direct relationship between "complaints filed" and "convictions" since a case may be filed in one year and the outcome (trial or pleading) may occur in another.
- 5) All prosecutorial data include hate crimes committed by both juvenile and adult defendants.
- 6) Glenn County District Attorney did not report data for 2014.

## Appendix: Glossary

**Aggravated Assault** – An unlawful attack by one person upon another wherein the offender uses a dangerous weapon or displays it in a threatening manner or the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury, or where there was a risk for serious injury/intent to seriously injure.

**Ancestry Bias** – A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of people based on their common lineage or descent.

**Bias** – A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on their race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, or physical/mental disability.

**Bisexual** – (adjective) Of or relating to people who are physically, romantically, and/or emotionally attracted to both men and women.

**Case** – A set of facts about a crime that is referred to a district attorney for filing with a court. The case may charge one or more persons with the commission of one or more offenses. (For this report, the case must contain some element of bias.)

**Complaints Filed** – Any verified written accusation, filed by a district attorney with a criminal court, that charges one or more persons with the commission of one or more offenses. (For this report, the case must contain some element of bias.)

**Conviction** – A judgment based on the verdict of a jury or a judicial officer or on a guilty plea or a nolo contendere plea of the defendant.

**Disability Bias** – A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on their physical or mental impairments, whether such disability is temporary or permanent, congenital or acquired by heredity, accident, injury, advanced age, or illness.

**Disposition** – In criminal procedure, the sentencing or other final settlement of a criminal case.

**Ethnic Bias** – A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of people whose members identify with each other, through a common heritage, often consisting of a common language, common culture (often including a shared religion) and/or ideology that stresses common ancestry. The concept of ethnicity differs from the closely related term race in that “race” refers to grouping based mostly upon biological criteria, while “ethnicity” also encompasses additional cultural factors.

**Event** – An occurrence where a hate crime is involved. (In this report, the information about the event is a crime report or source document that meets the criteria for a hate crime.) There may be one or more suspects involved, one or more victims targeted, and one or more offenses involved for each event.

**Gay** – (adjective) Of or relating to people who are physically, romantically, and/or emotionally attracted to people of the same sex.

**Gender Bias** – (noun) A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a person or group of persons based on their actual or perceived gender, i.e., male or female.



**Gender Identity Bias** – A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a person or group of persons based on their actual or perceived gender identity, e.g., bias against transgender or gender nonconforming individuals.

**Gender Non-Conforming** – (adjective) Describes a person who does not conform to the gender-based expectations of society, e.g., a woman dressed in traditionally male clothing or a man wearing makeup.

**Guilty Plea** – A defendant’s formal answer in open court stating that the charge is true and that he or she is guilty of the crime charged.

**Hate Crime** – A criminal offense against a person or property motivated in whole or in part by an offender’s bias(es) against a race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, or physical/mental disability.

**Heterosexual** – (adjective) Of or relating to people who are physically, romantically, and/or emotionally attracted to people of the opposite sex.

**Homosexual** – (adjective) Of or relating to people who are physically, romantically, and/or emotionally attracted to people of the same sex.

**Known Suspect** – Any person alleged to have committed a criminal act or attempted criminal act to cause physical injury, emotional suffering, or property damage. The known suspect category contains the number of suspects that have been identified and/or alleged to have committed hate crimes as stated in the crime report. For example, witnesses observe three suspects fleeing the scene of a crime. The word “known” does not necessarily refer to specific identities.

**Lesbian** – (adjective) Of or relating to women who are physically, romantically, and/or emotionally attracted to other women.

**Location** – The place where the hate crime event occurred. The location categories follow UCR location specifications developed by the FBI. Examples are residence, hotel, bar, church, etc.

**Mental Disability** – Any mental impairment or psychological disorder such as organic brain syndrome, emotional or mental illness, and specific learning disabilities. (Americans with Disabilities Act)

**Multi-Racial** – A hate crime that involves more than one victim or suspect, and where the victims or suspects are from two or more different race groups, such as African American and white or Hispanic and Asian.

**Nolo Contendere** – A plea or answer in a criminal action in which the accused does not admit guilt but agrees to be subject to the same punishment as if he or she were guilty.

**Offenses** – Criminal acts that are recorded as follows: murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, arson, simple assault, fondling, kidnapping/abduction, intimidation, destruction/vandalism, false pretense/swindle, hacking/computer invasion, and weapons law violation as defined in the UCR and the national Hate Crimes Statistics Report.

**“Other” Values** – Capture bias types not specifically called out in their respective categories.

**Physical Disability** – Any physical impairment; any physiological disorder or condition, cosmetic disfigurement, or anatomical loss affecting one or more of the following body systems: neurological, musculoskeletal, special sense organs, respiratory (including Version 3.0, 3/1/2022 10 speech organs), cardiovascular, reproductive, digestive, genitourinary, hemic and lymphatic, skin, and endocrine. (Americans with Disabilities Act)

**Property Crimes** – Burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, arson, destruction/vandalism, false pretense/swindle, hacking/computer invasion and weapons law violation are reported as property crimes. (weapons law violation is included in crimes against society in the FBI Hate Crimes Statistics Report.)

**Racial Bias** – A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons who possess common physical characteristics, e.g., color of skin, eyes, and/or hair, facial features, etc., genetically transmitted by descent and heredity which distinguish them as a distinct division of humankind, e.g., Asians, Blacks or African Americans, Whites.

**Religious Bias** – A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons who share the same religious beliefs regarding the origin and purpose of the universe and the existence or nonexistence of a supreme being, e.g., Catholics, Jews, Protestants, atheists.

**Sexual-Orientation Bias** – (noun) A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a person or group of persons based on their actual or perceived sexual orientation.

**Sexual-Orientation** – (noun) The term for a person’s physical, romantic, and/or emotional attraction to members of the same and/or opposite sex, including lesbian, gay, bisexual, and heterosexual (straight) individuals.

**Simple Assault** – An unlawful physical attack by one person upon another where neither the offender displays a dangerous weapon, nor the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness.

**Transgender** – (adjective) Of or relating to a person who identifies as a different gender from their gender as assigned at birth, including non-binary people.

**Trial Verdict** – The finding or answer of a jury or judge concerning a matter submitted to them for their judgment.

**Uniform Crime Reporting** – A federal reporting system that provides data on crime based on police statistics submitted by law enforcement agencies throughout the nation. The DOJ administers and forwards the data for California to the federal program.

**Victim** – An individual, a business or financial institution, a religious organization, a government entity, or other. For example, if a church or synagogue is vandalized or desecrated, the victim would be a religious organization.

**Violent Crimes** – Murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, kidnapping/abduction, simple assault, fondling, and intimidation are considered violent crimes in this report. (Robbery is included in crimes against property in the FBI Hate Crimes Statistics Report.)

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
