Pritzker, Democrats dominate statewide elections

Illinois Democrat Gov. JB Pritzker was reelected Tuesday, beating his Republican challenger state Sen. Darren Bailey in an expensive race that turned out fairly lopsided.

Just after the polls closed at 7 p.m., the Associated Press projected a victory for Pritzker who will serve a second, four-year term.

With a little more than 53 percent of the vote counted, the incumbent had 58.6 percent of the vote, compared to 36.8 percent



for Bailey and 2.6 percent for Libertarian candidate Scott Schluter.

The Bailey campaign had not conceded at press time.

Here's a summary of unofficial results in other statewide races.

Senate

Shortly after polls closed, the AP projected Democrat Tammy Duckworth would win reelection to the U.S. Senate against politi-

cal newcomer and lawyer Kathy Salvi.

This was Salvi's first run for statewide office, and she faced off against an opponent who had an 18-to-1 advantage in campaign cash.

Comptroller

Democrat incumbent Susana Mendoza looked to be cruising to victory over Republican Shannon Teresi, grabbing 58.8 percent of the vote with 61 percent reporting.

Treasurer

Democrat incumbent Michael Frerichs held a sizable lead over Republican state Rep. Tom

Duckworth

Demmer with more than 60 percent of the vote tallied. Frerichs was at 55.9 percent to 42 percent for Demmer.

Secretary of State

Rebounding from a failed Senate campaign in 2010, Democrat Alexi Giannoulias, 46, was leading in the race to replace Jesse White, who had held the position

since 1998. Giannoulias had 56.4 percent of the vote to 41.5 percent for Republican Dan Brady, a state legislator from Bloomington.

Attorney General

Democrat incumbent Kwame Raoul was comfortably ahead of Republican challenger Thomas DeVore with 62 percent of the statewide vote counted. Raoul had garnered 56.1 percent of votes to 41.7 percent for DeVore, who had been a vocal critic of Pritzker during the pandemic.

17th Congressional District

At press time, the race between

Princeville cop decision likely soon

PRINCEVILLE – Future police protection in Princeville might not be as comprehensive as it is now. Or it might remain the same but cost local taxpayers more money.

Peoria County Sheriff Chris Watkins plans to offer options for the Princeville Village Board to consider before it decides whether to renew its service contract. A decision is likely later this month or in early December. With a projected increase of about \$35,000 over a five-year period, the status quo – eight hours of patrols, seven days a week – might be a difficult sell.

“I think everyone here in town wants this, but when you look at these numbers, I don't know if I could ever vote for spending that kind of money,” Village Trustee Ron

Webb, Harlan win local sheriff races

Republicans Jon Webb and Jack Harlan will join Chris Watkins as new sheriffs in The Weekly Post circulation area.

While Watkins, a Republican, was appointed sheriff of Peoria County after winning the June 28 primary, Webb and Harlan had opponents in Tuesday's general election.

In Fulton County, Webb defeated Democrat Ryan Maricle, taking 55 percent of votes in the once staunchly Democratic county. Four-term incumbent Jeff Standard, a Democrat, did not run but endorsed Webb.

“My mind is just full with emotion,” the 36-year-old Webb said. “I am very eager to get started. I am very excited to be a young sheriff in Fulton County.”

In Knox County, Harlan's sizable majority in the 28 county precincts (4,914-1,998) lifted him past Democrat James Robertson, who led in Galesburg's 20 precincts (4,376-

Delbridge said.

Delbridge spoke Monday night during a Village Board meeting Watkins attended. Peoria County Board Member Brian El-sasser, who represents Princeville, was there, too.

Neither county official appeared pleased about the proposed increase. Watkins said it's related to an analysis a third-party consultant provided the county regarding how much it costs to provide regular police protection.

Watkins said his department charges some of

clients 100 percent of the cost. Most municipalities, including Princeville, aren't assessed full price. For Princeville, that annual amount would be about \$177,000.

"We know every once in a while, one of our cars gets pulled off for an accident a mile or two out of town. That eliminates that 100 percent," Watkins, who assumed office in July, told the board. "You guys will never see 100 percent as long as I'm around. I know it's a lot of money."

Under a contract that expires at the end of this year,

the village is paying the county about \$130,000 in 2022. In exchange, Princeville receives a dedicated deputy from 6:45 p.m. until 2:45 a.m. each day. The same deputy works Monday to Friday, typically.

Village President Jeff Troutman said police-protection costs have risen 2-4 percent annually, which he deemed reasonable. But according to the proposed five-year contract, the cost is to jump about \$10,000 in 2023 and increase steadily to almost \$168,000 in 2027.

"We shouldn't try to make ends meet on the backs of small communities," El-sasser said.

According to Watkins, the only practical alternative is for the village to receive

five hours of service daily. Hours would be random.

Troutman suggested shorter shifts daily or full shifts Tuesdays through Saturdays, or perhaps a hybrid in which a deputy is in town for six dedicated hours but pursues other county policing for two. Watkins and the current regular Princeville deputy, Gabe Martinez, indicated that wouldn't work.

"There's not a guarantee (deputies) would be free from a call and come up here to get the six hours," Martinez said.

The Village Board also could decide to forego regular patrols entirely. Deputies then would respond to local calls as needed, as is the current situation when officers are off duty.



Save a child's life – lock up guns at home

Every day in America, 13 kids die from gun-related injuries. Every day, eight kids are shot by accident.

Firearm-related injuries are now the leading cause of death in kids ages 1-19, surpassing for the first time motor-vehicle accidents, according to the most recent statistics from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

As an attending emergency room physician for OSF HealthCare, I've seen the aftermath of accidental shootings involving children – the physical injuries as well as the emotional impact on all involved and the loss of life.

I can't forget two instances when boys ages 9 and 7 were brought into the emergency room just six days apart. Both boys were at the homes of a relative or friend and were asked by another young boy, "Do you want to see my daddy's shotgun?" The gun accidentally went off in both incidents, inflicting gunshot wounds to the abdomen.

Very graphic, very severe traumas. One boy recovered and went home. The other boy was in surgery for hours, receiving 30-40 pints of blood. He died despite efforts to save his life. Both of these accidental shootings could have been prevented.

A Journal of the American Medical Association survey estimates 4.6 million kids in the U.S. live with unlocked, loaded guns in the home. We

take steps to protect our children from all kinds of harm, making sure they wear seatbelts or are placed in car seats, wear life jackets or floatables while in the water ... so, why are we not making sure guns in the home are locked up?

When we drop our children off at a play date or a friend's birthday party, why aren't we asking about potential dangers in the home they are visiting – including whether there are unsecured, unlocked firearms in the house?

I'm a certified firearms instructor who's taught firearms safety for decades. I'm also a father. After the incidents with the two young boys, I made it my mission to educate the world on how to better store and child-proof firearms. It's my passion to teach parents why doing this is so important to keep their kids safe.

My own experience and the experience of others shows it's necessary to not only teach our children about gun safety in the home, but to understand the importance of practicing safe storage of guns.

Many Americans own firearms for sporting purposes and also for their family's protection. There are important, safe ways to store firearms securely, yet still keep them accessible for self-defense and family safety. Locking up guns and ammo properly can reduce the risk of self-inflicted or unintentional injury to kids by 85 percent.

Having conversations parent-to-parent about whether guns in the home are locked and secure is a crucial step.

To encourage parents to take action by asking about guns in the home, OSF HealthCare has joined more than 170 other health-care organizations representing thousands of hospitals and health systems in a nationwide public awareness and education campaign, called "Doesn't Kill to Ask."

The campaign is not intended to shame or embarrass gun owners, or remove weapons from people's homes. Its goal is to reduce risk, by putting the danger of unlocked guns front and center while stressing the importance of educating our communities about proper gun safety and talking with friends, family and neighbors about gun access.

Get educated, learn the facts and keep our children safe from firearms. Holding each other accountable and asking simple questions regarding guns in the home and whether they're locked up can save a life. It most definitely "Doesn't Kill to Ask." I urge you to visit hospitals-[united.com](http://www.united.com) for tips on getting the conversation started.

Farmington council OKs unchanged tax levy

FARMINGTON – For at least the third straight year, the Farmington City Council has voted for no increase in property taxes.

The council voted unanimously on Monday to keep the tax levy for its next fiscal year unchanged at \$333,550.

“We are not raising taxes at all, same as for the last three years. The city is healthy. There’s no reason for us to raise taxes,” said Kenn Stufflebeam, acting mayor. “I’m happy to

say that.”

In other business, the council approved donating \$500 to the Dec. 3 Winterfest, which fromn 2-6:30 p.m. will feature visits with Santa, family activities, vendors and a parade. The city has received permission to close Fort St. for the parade.

Milling was to start Tuesday on East Central, West Vernon and North Cedar streets. The city has opted to also pay for half the repaving bill on a 1,100-foot stretch of Northwest Street, with Illinois American water footing the rest of the bill.

The council approved three Residential Redevelopment grants: Geoff Monari, \$1,125 for tree removal; Tara Kelsey, \$2,500 for new windows; and Jake Johnson, \$2,500 for new roof shingles. Stufflebeam reminded residents and businesses there is still grant money available.

The council went into executive session for 23 minutes to discuss setting a price for sale or lease of property owned by the city, but returned with no action having been taken.

“We will probably talk again,” Stufflebeam said.

ing a westbound box truck on Route 116 when he took his eyes off the road to attend to something inside the cab, according to a sheriff’s-office report. As he looked back up at the road, his truck crashed into the rear of the school bus.

The Farmington School District bus was transporting 11 children. Susan M. Payne of Farmington was driving. The box truck is owned by Butch’s Pizza Inc. of Morton, the report said.

Payne said she was turning her bus from Route 116 onto Quarry Road when the box truck hit it, the report stated. The bus went into a ditch on the west side of Quarry Road, ran over a stop sign and became airborne. Then it crashed into the left side of a house at 709 N. Quarry Road.

A man inside the house said he was asleep when a loud noise awakened him, according to the report. He was uninjured.

Farmington School Superintendent Zac Chatterton suggested Payne prevented a much-worse result.

“She did an absolutely amazing job

of navigating,” Chatterton said Tuesday. “We’re fortunate we had an experienced driver on that route, because if you look at the scene, the bus catapulted up a 15-foot incline. Compared to a pole and a tree, I guess it was the least restrictive of options.”

Mounce complained of chest pain. An ambulance transported him to UnityPoint Health-Methodist. He was cited for failure to reduce speed to avoid an accident. A deputy searched Mounce’s cellphone and found no evidence Mounce was using it immediately before the collision.

Payne was transported to Methodist after she complained about knee and back pain. Also transported there was one of the children aboard the bus. Ambulances or parents transported four other children to OSF Saint Francis Medical Center.

“It was an emotional day,” Chatterton said.

Of the six other children aboard the bus, most were released to their parents, according to Chatterton. A few boarded another bus that was behind

Payne’s and were transported to the Farmington campus.

Representatives of Advanced Medical Transport of Central Illinois, the Logan-Trivoli Fire Protection District and the Elmwood and Farmington police departments joined sheriff’s-office deputies in responding.

Payne’s bus was running a relatively standard route at the time of the accident and was working its way back to school, Chatterton said. Elementary-school, junior high and high school students were aboard.

Chatterton and Toby Vallas, the Farmington director of student services, debriefed the other district bus drivers Monday after the accident. Chatterton said one of the drivers raised a salient point.

“He told his kids on the bus that this is why we sit in our seats and (shouldn’t) be dangling in the aisles,” the superintendent said. “The bus seats are designed to keep you safe, if you’re sitting in them the right way. If you’re not, you’re not quite as safe.”

LOCAL: Peoria Co. to eliminate auditor position

Continued from Page 1 4,345). Democrat David Clague did not run for reelection.

In Peoria County, voters opted to eliminate the office of county auditor currently held by Jessica Thomas. With 63.9 percent of the vote in, 68.8 percent voted to end the position.

Peoria County voters also overwhelmingly favored retaining Circuit Court Judge John Vespa.

Several other Knox County positions were decided Tuesday.

Republican incumbent Scott Erickson was re-elected as Knox County clerk, topping Democrat challenger Tracy Thierry-Robertson, 10,916-4,784.

Republican Janet Windish of Yates City appears to have narrowly failed in a bid to upend Democrat incumbent Robin Davis as Knox County treasurer.

With a strong majority in Galesburg, unofficial results had Davis leading Windish by 37 votes – 7,843 to 7,806.

Finally, in the race for Knox County Board District 3, Republicans Rick Robertson (34 percent), Brian Friedrich (25.5 percent) and Patty Boone (25 percent) won seats and Democrat Jake Secrist fell short with 15.4 percent.

In Fulton County, Republicans James Barclay, incumbent Brian Platt and Ryan Sloan won places on the County Board from District 3, which includes Farmington. A pair of incumbent Democrats, Lisa Thompson and Daniel Kumer, took the fourth and fifth of the five District 3

seats.

With all 21 precincts reporting, Barclay received 18.3 percent, Platt 17.9 percent and Sloan 17.1 percent. Thompson was at 12.7 percent and Kumer was at 12.2 percent. Glen Hamm (11 percent) and Alex Gilles (10.8 percent) finished out of contention.

The new, 15-member board is on track to have eight Republicans and seven Democrats. Previously, the board had 21 members, seven from each district, and Democrats held 15 seats. That included six Democrats in District 3.

This would be the first time in recent memory the GOP will hold the board majority.

Continued from Page 1 Republican Esther Joy King and Democrat Eric Sorensen was still too close to call.

With 80 percent of the vote tabulated, Sorensen was holding a slight lead with 50.9 percent (97,142 votes) to 49.1 percent for King (94,105 votes).

Workers' Rights Amendment

Perhaps the tightest vote of all was for a so-called Workers' Right Amendment that would guarantee

not only the right to organize for the most common elements of collective bargaining, like wages, hours and working conditions, but also for "economic welfare and safety at work."

With 53 percent of the state tallied, 59.9 percent had voted in favor of the amendment.

But in order to pass, the vote must top 60 percent, meaning the margin was still too slim to predict at press time.

Fire damage at \$3M for Maquon body shop

MAQUON – Steve Filker lost a valuable collection of cars and motorcycles on Nov. 3 when a fire engulfed his body shop in Maquon and briefly shut off power to the entire town.

A blaze that eventually required the service of 15 fire departments was reported at the former Strode Garage at 400 Main St. at 11:54 a.m. according to Patrick Hohenberry, Maquon Fire Department chief. The blaze caused a reported \$3 million in damage to the 12,000-square-foot building, according to the Illinois State Fire Marshal. There were no injuries.

Most of the damage was to vintage cars and motorcycles inside the building owned by Filker of Yates City.

“I had six Harleys sitting in there

and a couple Corvettes, stuff I collected all my life,” Filker said.

Filker, 67, ran his Deluxe Auto Body Shop out of the building and at one point had seven full-time employees. He said he spent more than \$10,000 to upgrade the structure. But Filker said he had to close in 2017 after breaking his back – an injury that kept him from repairing the roof.

Filker said he believes the fire, which reportedly started in the southwest corner of the building, was the work of an arsonist.

“How else could the fire have started where it did?” he asked.

Filker said he had no insurance on the building, adding that he had planned for the cars and motorcycles to be an inheritance for his children.

The building was torn down after it was deemed unsafe.

“A part of the roof collapsed a long time ago and they never fixed it,” Hohenberry told the Register-Mail. “It was a fire trap this whole time.”

The State Fire Marshal’s office is conducting an investigation.

Farmington sideline.
 "I thought we did exactly what we talked about doing," Vallas said. "Our kids responded and did exactly what they were supposed to do."
 Renken, a senior quarterback, attempted no passes during the drive. He passed for 199 yards in a first-round victory over El Paso-Gridley.
 "It was nothing like we've ever played before," Renken said about the weather in Maroa. "We really couldn't pass a lot, so we had to stick to our run game and just try to pound it down the middle."

Maroa-Forsyth's second possession was not nearly as methodical. With the wind at his back, quarterback Kaiden Maurer completed passes of 25 yards to Mitch Williams and 38 yards to Grant Smith. That set up Aiden Riser for a 3-yard touchdown on the fourth play of the drive.
 Riser's run at 3:14, followed by Noah Luster's extra-point kick, gave the Trojans a 7-6 lead. They did not trail again.
 A Farmington punt into the wind on the ensuing series resulted in a 1-yard loss. Big pass plays by Maurer and his 66-yard run led to touchdowns that gave Maroa-Forsyth a 27-6 lead at intermission.

None of the Trojans' first-half scoring drives exceeded five plays. Each of their two third-quarter scores in-

cluded a play of at least 40 yards.
 "They're a very explosive team," Vallas said. "When you've got explosive players like that, it's trouble."
 Maurer finished with 164 passing yards. Renken was 3-for-10 for 46 yards.
 "We showed we can still throw the ball in really tough conditions ... but I do think it kind of took their passing game out," Jostes said about the Farmers. "They had some dudes that didn't complete a lot of balls today."
 Shymansky didn't run the rest of the first half after he was banged up on the first Farmington scoring drive, Vallas said. Still, Shymansky carried 30 times for a game-high 151 yards.
 The resilience Shymansky showed

might have been indicative of the Farmington situation this season. It began with a 16-point loss to Aledo Mercer County and included a comeback from a 14-point early deficit against El Paso-Gridley.
 Not even a mighty wind can blow away the accomplishments, according to Vallas.
 "This group went through COVID and they lost a ton of kids out of that group," he said. "I'm as proud of these seniors as I am of any group."
 "We're not a wealthy community. We don't have all the resources to do all the things that everybody else is doing. But our kids stuck with it just off grit, and I'm proud of them for that."

ROWVA-Williamsfield struggles on road against Lena-Winslow

LENA – ROWVA-Williamsfield received an up-close-and-personal look at the strengths of the Lena-Winslow football program.

The sight of Le-Win ball-carriers running into the end zone was the most common. Undefeated, top-ranked Le-Win scored early and often in a 76-7 victory Nov. 5. The defeat ended a memorable season for R-W (6-5), which qualified for the playoffs for the first time in its current cop configuration.

A first-round home victory over Lincoln Trail Conference rival Stark County sent the Cougars 120 miles north to face the

winner of three of the last four 1A state titles. The Panthers wasted little time burnishing their reputation.

Le-Win (11-0) scored within the first three minutes and led 38-0 midway through the second quarter. That's when R-W had its only touchdown, a 37-yard pass from Riley Danner to Luke Nelson.

According to R-W Coach Grant Gullstrand, winds in excess of 30 mph and rain didn't help.

"We really couldn't throw the ball at all," Gullstrand said. "It made us one-dimensional, so we had to run the ball straight at them. That was not a recipe for success.

"Their size was eye-

opening. They're big kids across the board. Their running backs were extremely tough to bring down, and when you put those guys behind an offensive line that's really big and really physical, it's a good recipe for success for them."

The Le-Win point total broke the previous state record for the most points by one team in a postseason 1A game. Ten years ago, LeRoy scored 74 against Flanagan-Cornell-Woodland.

Gunar Lobdell ran for three TDs and 180 yards on only nine carries as Le-Win outrushed R-W 429-39. A total of seven Le-Win players scored.

Bryan Bertlshofer and

Nolan Coverdill each ran for 16 yards to lead R-W.

Le-Win led 54-7 at half-time. From an R-W perspective, the second half primarily was devoted to allowing seniors to play.

"It's a little different, being those kids' last games, so they could see after a half this was going to be it," Gullstrand said. "We were just trying to get them on the field one last time."

Despite the outcome, the Cougars accomplished some big things in 2022. The Stark County victory represented the first in the postseason since 2006 for a ROWVA-based football team. It's also only the second time in 10 years a

ROWVA-based team posted a winning record.

"We haven't been very good in the past, and people probably questioned whether we'd ever be good," Gullstrand said. "Not a whole lot was expected from us. But these kids worked very hard and loved the game of football.

Hopefully this gives us confidence going into next year.

"This is the first group of kids I've coached for four years through, so they're really special to me. I'm kind of glad they're the ones who took the initiative to get the program to where it needs to be."

Fast start, rough end for Farmers

MAROA – After a promising start, the Farmington football team’s hopes for another postseason victory ended up gone with the wind. And against the wind, for that matter.

The Farmers’ scoring bookended Maroa-Forsyth’s point total Nov. 5 as Farmington lost a second-round Class 2A playoff game 42-12. Losses also bookended the season for Farmington, which finished 8-3 following its seventh successive postseason berth.

It’s doubtful Farmington played many, if any, of those postseason games in conditions as blustery as those last week at Walter Boyd Field.

Winds in nearby Decatur averaged 35-45 mph, according to the National Weather Service office in Lincoln. At Maroa-Forsyth, the winds howled from the south-southwest. Unencumbered adjacent farmland provided no resistance.

“No place has a more open field than this,” Maroa-Forsyth Coach Josh Jostes said.

Immediately following the game, Farmington Coach Toby Vallas might

“It was terrible,” he said.

The conditions and the opening coin flip led to a Farmington offensive adjustment.

Headed into the breeze to begin the game, the Farmers’ passing and punting were in peril. Instead, they ran and ran, even on fourth down deep in their territory.

The initial series ended with a Farmington turnover on downs at its

27. But the Trojans (11-0) fumbled away their first snap, something Jostes suggested was weather related.

Rese Shymansky carried the ball 11 times on the ensuing 18-play drive, capped when Gage Renken ran in from 1 yard to give Farmington a 6-0 lead with 4:11 remaining in the quarter. The effort against the top seed in the 2A northern bracket provided hope for everyone on the

E-B does return plenty for next year, though, including its top finisher, junior Addie Symonds (48th, 19:10.76). Other scoring runners were sophomore Olivia Stage (71st, 19:40.36) and freshman Natalie Babcock (162nd, 21:08.85).

Rounding out the top seven for E-B was freshman Addy Turner (166th, 21:12.96) and Bre Turner (215th, 22:28.88).

In a boys race won by Chicago DePaul College Prep (113 points), E-B placed 11th with 301 points.

“I thought we ran well for the conditions, but it wasn’t our best race,” E-B Coach Gregg Meyers said. “Our goal was to try to get into the top 10 and we ran and missed it by four
