BARMM Profile

- Established by virtue of **Republic Act No. 11054** or the **Bangsamoro Organic Law (BOL)** and ratified last **January 25, 2019** and **February 06, 2019**
- Population: **4,273,149** *(including Cotabato City and 63 barangays from North Cotabato)*
- Geographical Area: **36,826.95 sq.km.** ++ *(approximate)*
- Provinces: **5** *(Tawi-Tawi, Sulu, Basilan, Lanao del Sur, and Maguindanao)*
- Cities: **3** *(Cotabato City, Lamitan City, and Marawi City)*
- Municipalities: **116**
- Barangays: **2,590** *(including 63 barangays from North Cotabato)*
- Congressional Districts: **8**

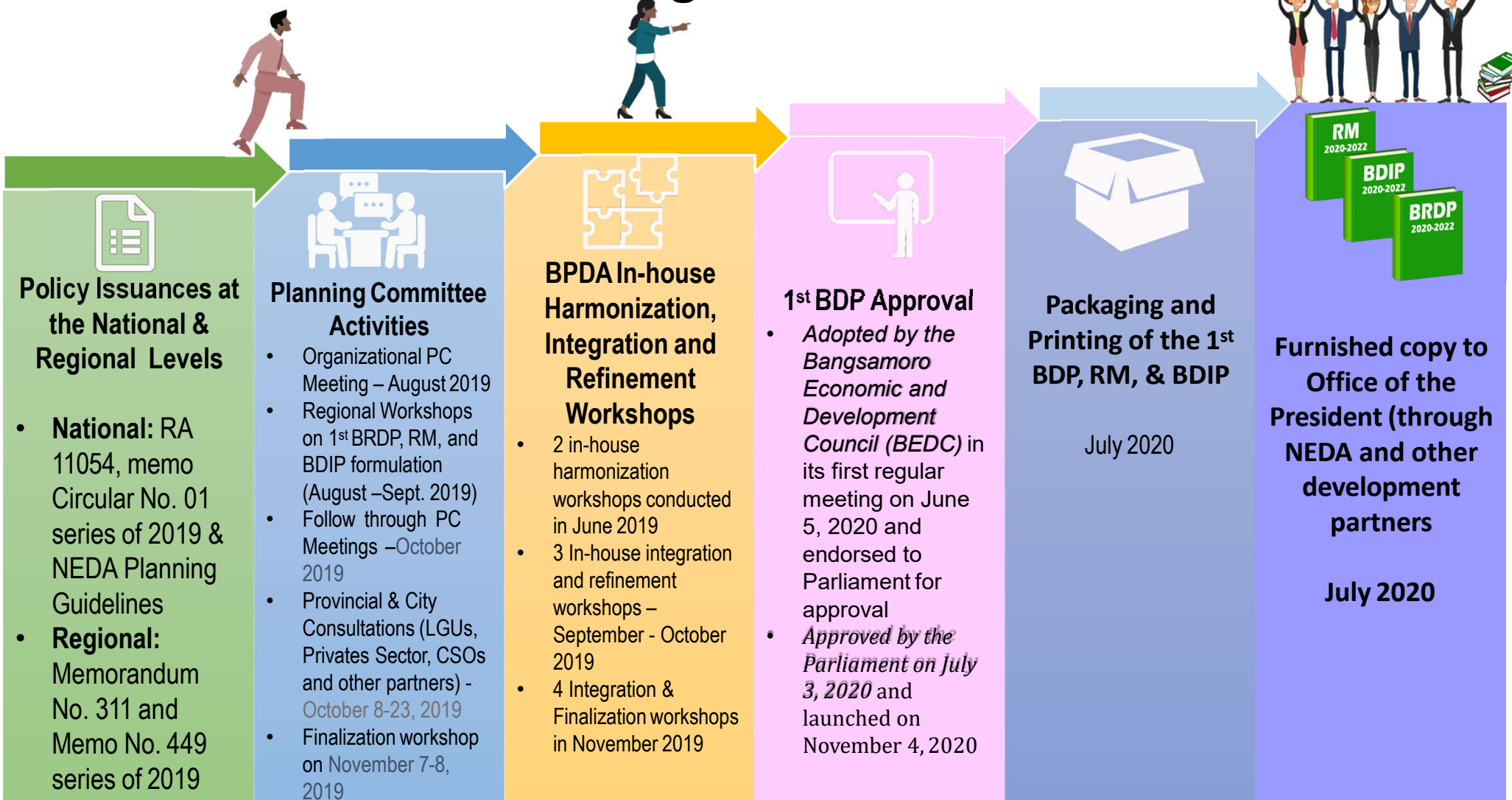

1st BDP 2020-2022

The 1st BDP contains thirteen (13) chapters, highlighting its Vision, Mission, Overall Goal and the 8-Development Goals, aligned with the 12-Point Agenda of the Chief Minister in Chapter 4;

Each goal has identified **intermediate** and **immediate outcomes**;

Every outcome has corresponding **strategies on how to achieve/realize**;

Priority programs, projects and legislative support are also identified to implement the strategies;

Result Matrices (RM) of each goal are also identified to easily determine the targets and progress of implementation. The RMs will facilitate the tracking of gains achieved and served as a tool to monitor and evaluate the progress of the Plan; and

Investment Programs for 3-year (2020-2022) are also prepared to translate the Plan into concrete actions and budget.

1

Enact priority measures mandated by the Bangsamoro law such as Electoral Code, Civil Service Code, Administrative Code and other legislations that need to be enacted by the Parliament of the Bangsamoro Transition Authority (BTA)



2

Review, integrate, and harmonize the Bangsamoro Development Plan, the Regional Development Plan of ARMM, the Camp Transformation Plan and other Bangsamoro plans to make them responsive to the current needs



3

Establish an appropriate bureaucracy for the Bangsamoro Government that will ensure the right balance between the size of the bureaucracy and the services that need to be delivered as well as the appropriate skills required of people in the bureaucracy



4

Set up and implement programs and projects that will respond to the pressing **social** and economic challenges in the Bangsamoro such as poverty, education, health, access to clean water and electricity, job opportunity, agricultural productivity, and access to capital market. "These must be complemented with responsive strategic infrastructure in the region such as ports, road network, flood control, and logistics, and communication facilities."

Implement special programs for transitioning combatants and their families apart from regular programs of the national government like 4Ps and PhilHealth, among others, “to ensure that these programs are tailored fit to their needs so that they will become productive members of the society



6

Support ongoing rehabilitation, reconstruction, and recovery of Marawi. “Marawi must be quickly rehabilitated and reconstructed as every delay is an opportunity for violent extremism to use it for propaganda and recruitment. Besides, immediate rehabilitation of Marawi is both the right and just thing to do.”



7

Develop policy environment on transparency, accountability, and prudent fiscal policy as well as improvement on revenue generation



8

Improve energy development and power generation to support the development of industries that will generate jobs and other opportunities

Enhance security by “maximizing the utilization of available legitimate forces on the ground and leveraging on the network of the MILF in the Bangsamoro communities by deploying such joint forces such as the Joint Peace and Security Teams (JPSTs).”

Ensure a productive partnership between the Bangsamoro Government and Development Partners as well as the national government for complementation of programs and projects to maximize results



11

Pursue the assessment of the status of region’s forests, watersheds, and other natural resources to ensure environmental protection, conservation, and management. Closely monitor and regulate the operation of mining and other related industries to strictly comply with environmental laws and policies



12

Explore and harness the economic potentials and comparative advantages to include Halal Industry, the *Ligawasan* Marsh, watersheds, potential tourist destinations, and other natural resources to boost economic development in the Bangsamoro

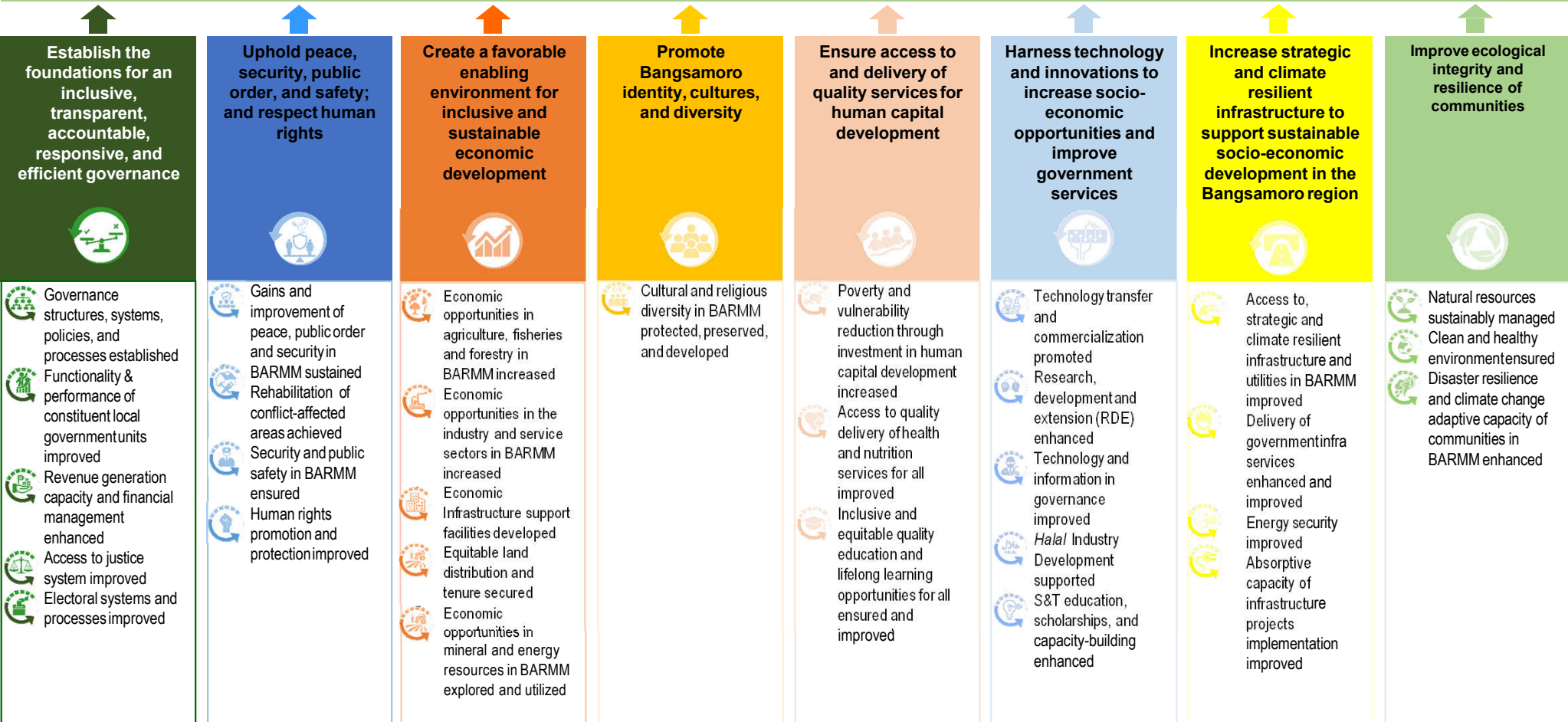

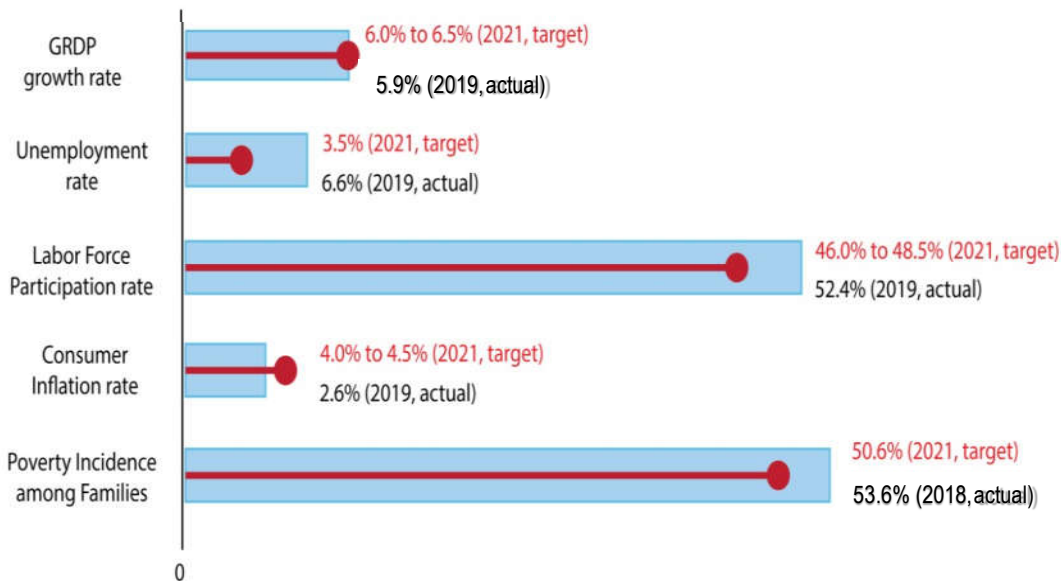

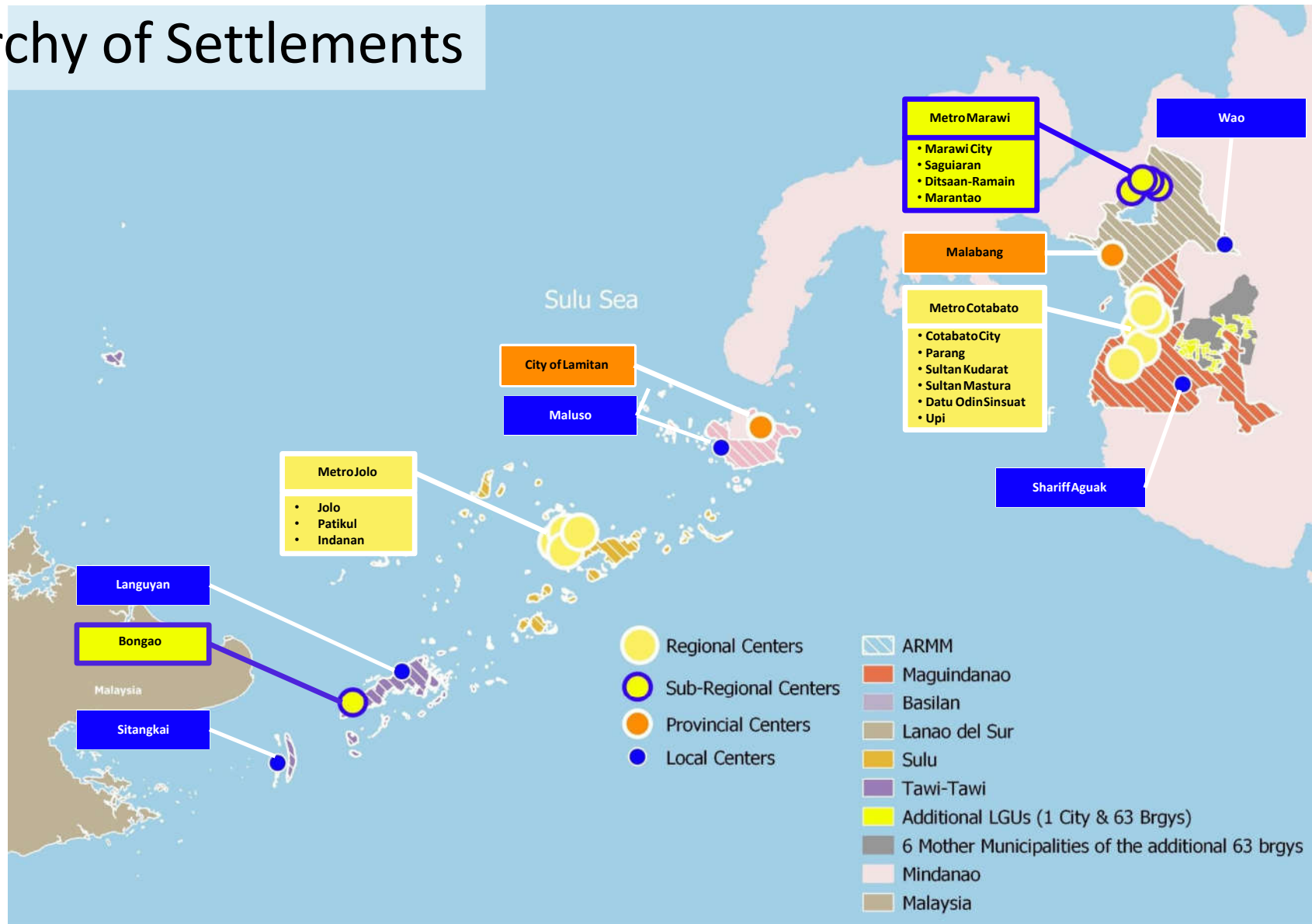

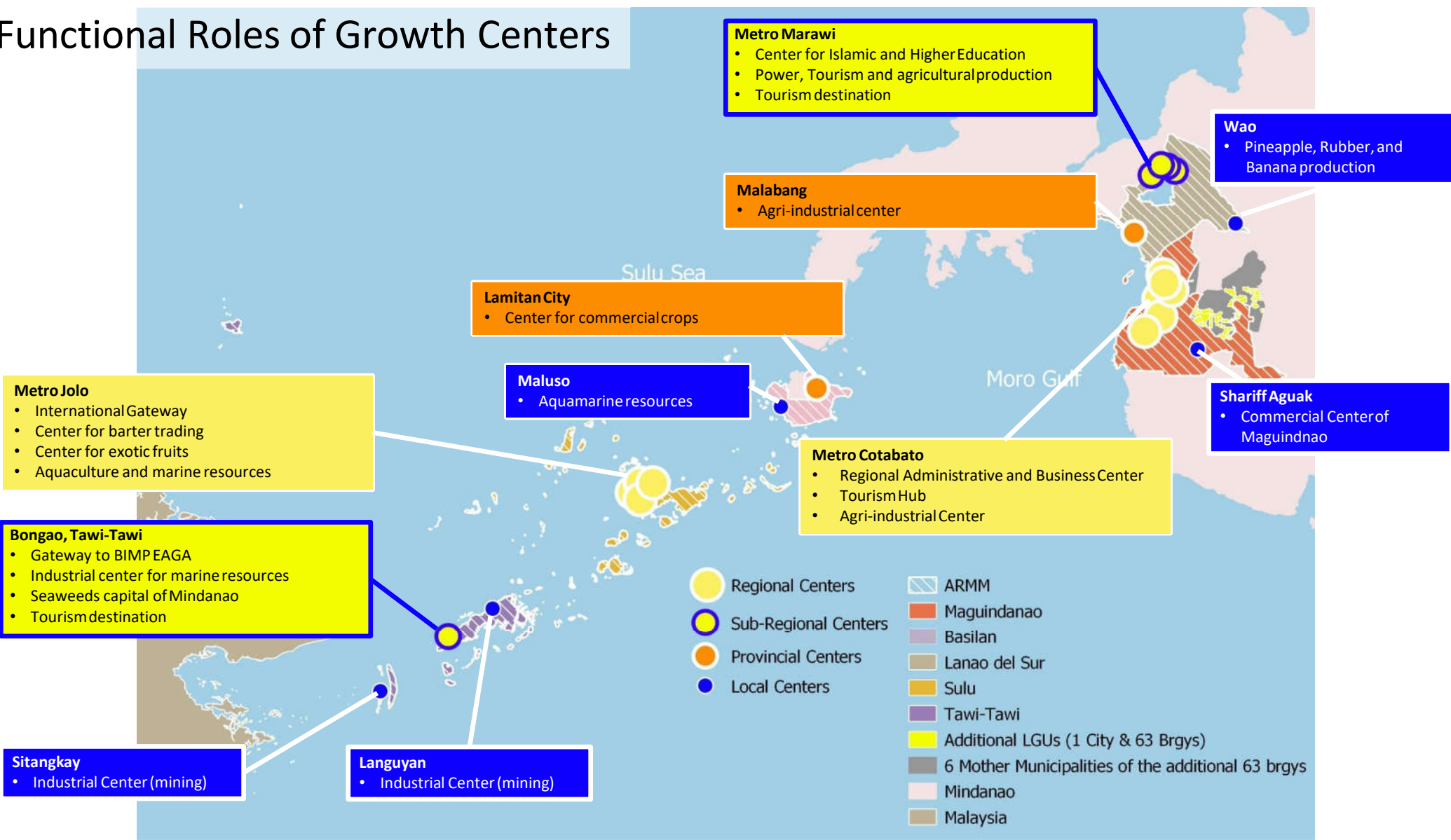

Marawi City

- Marawi City is the nucleus of growth and serves as the metropolitan center of the province of Lanao del Sur
- Urban center for socio-economic development of BARMM
- Commercial and Agri-eco-tourism Development
- Summer Capital of the BARMM

Lanao del Sur

- Center of Commerce and Trade, and Education of Lanao del Sur (Growth Cluster A)
- Agri-fishery production and cottage industries like brass wares, soap making, handy loams and other Maranao native products (Growth cluster B).
- Rice granary of Lanao Del Sur (Growth Cluster C)
- Commercial crops production specializing in high commercial crops and high value crops such as fruit trees, vegetables, sugar cane, pineapple and rubber (Growth Cluster D)

Basilan and Lamitan City

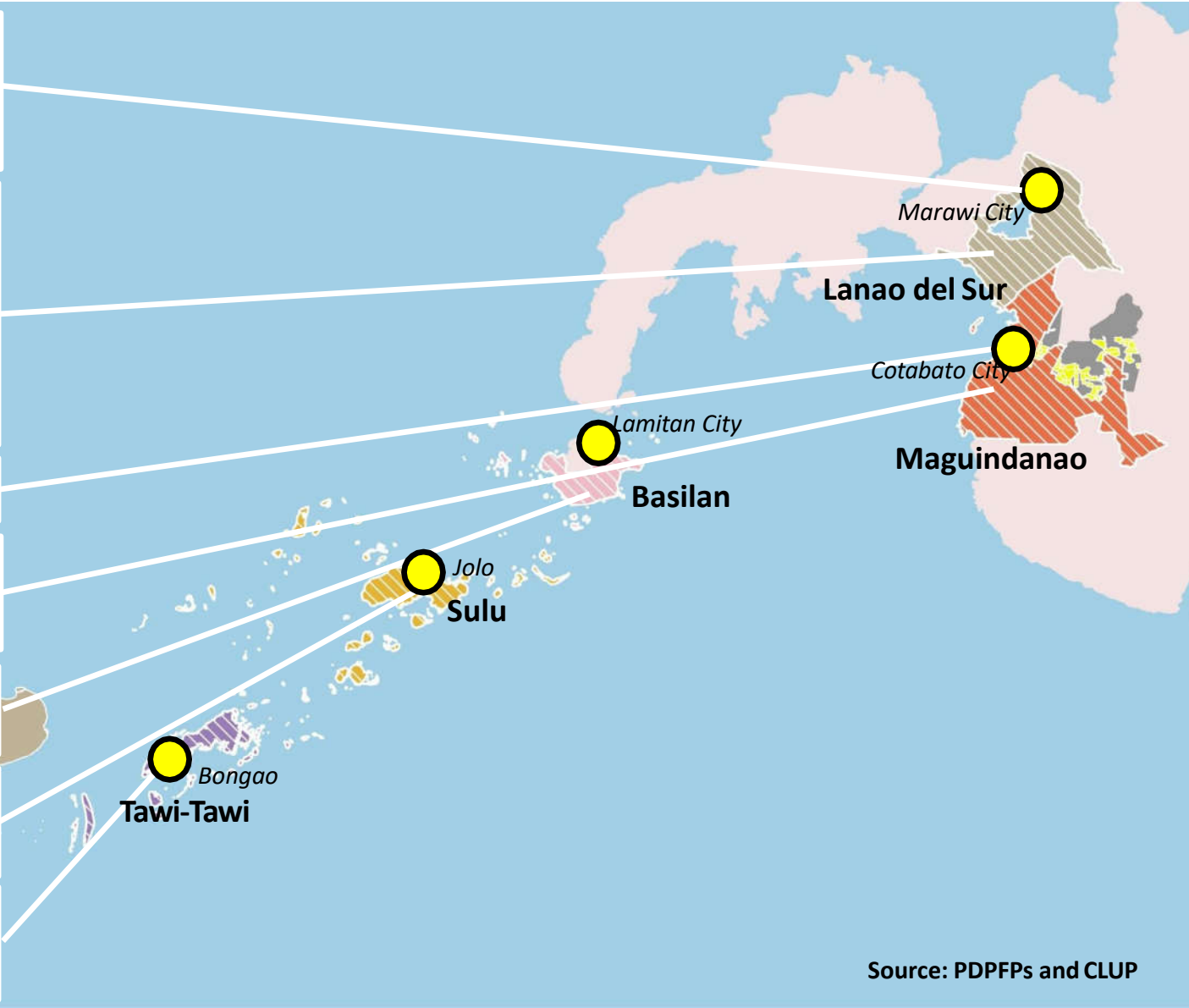

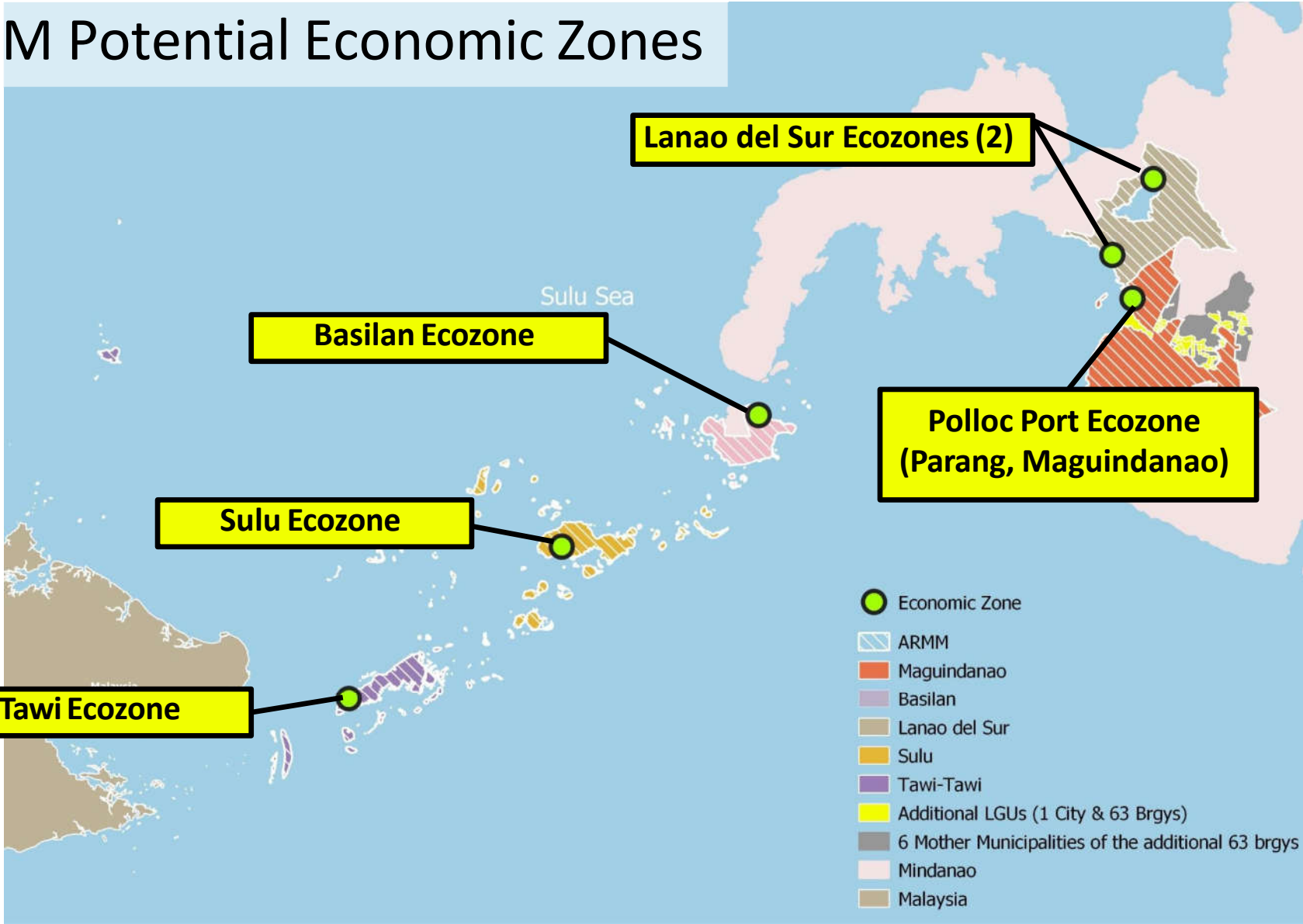

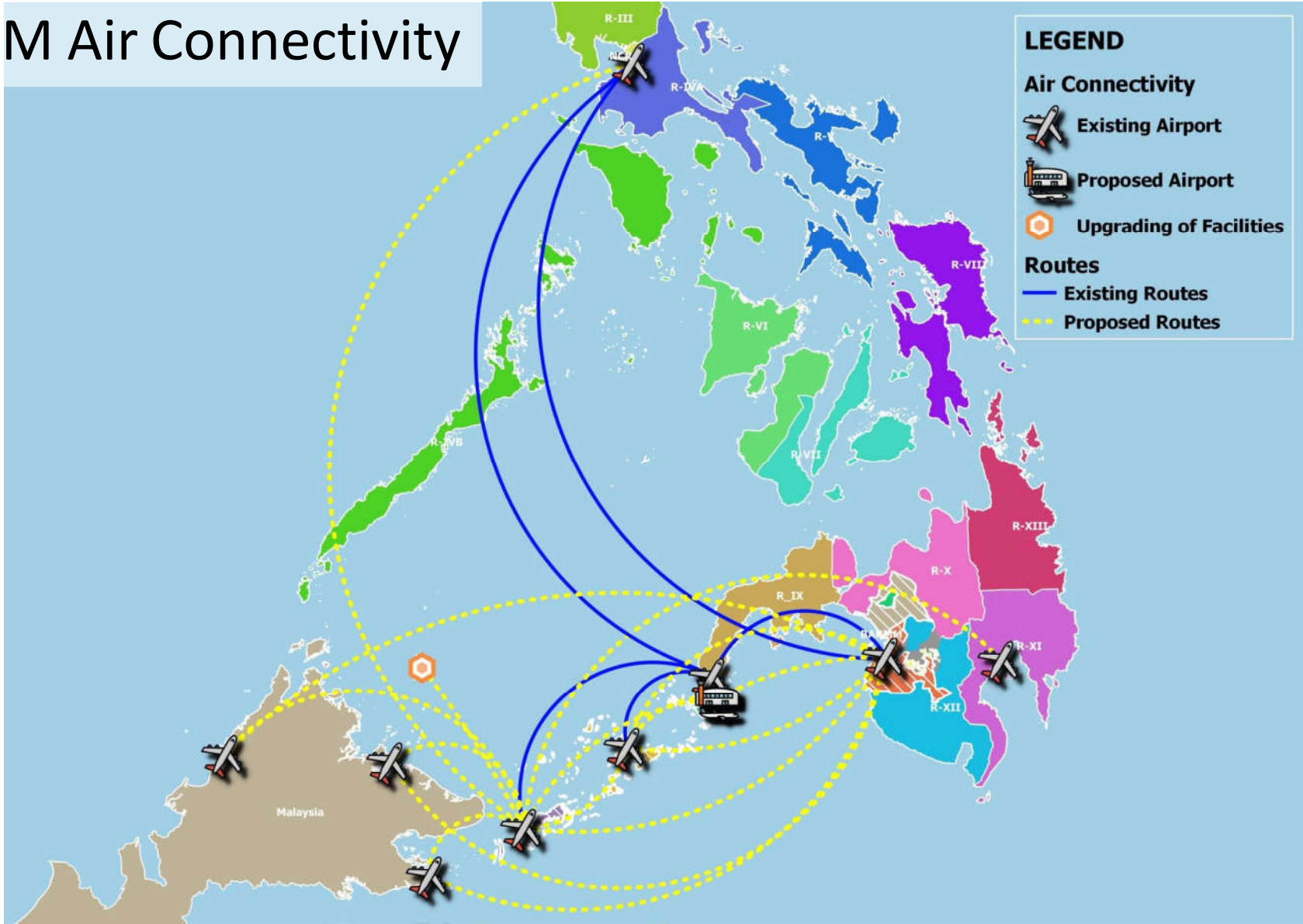

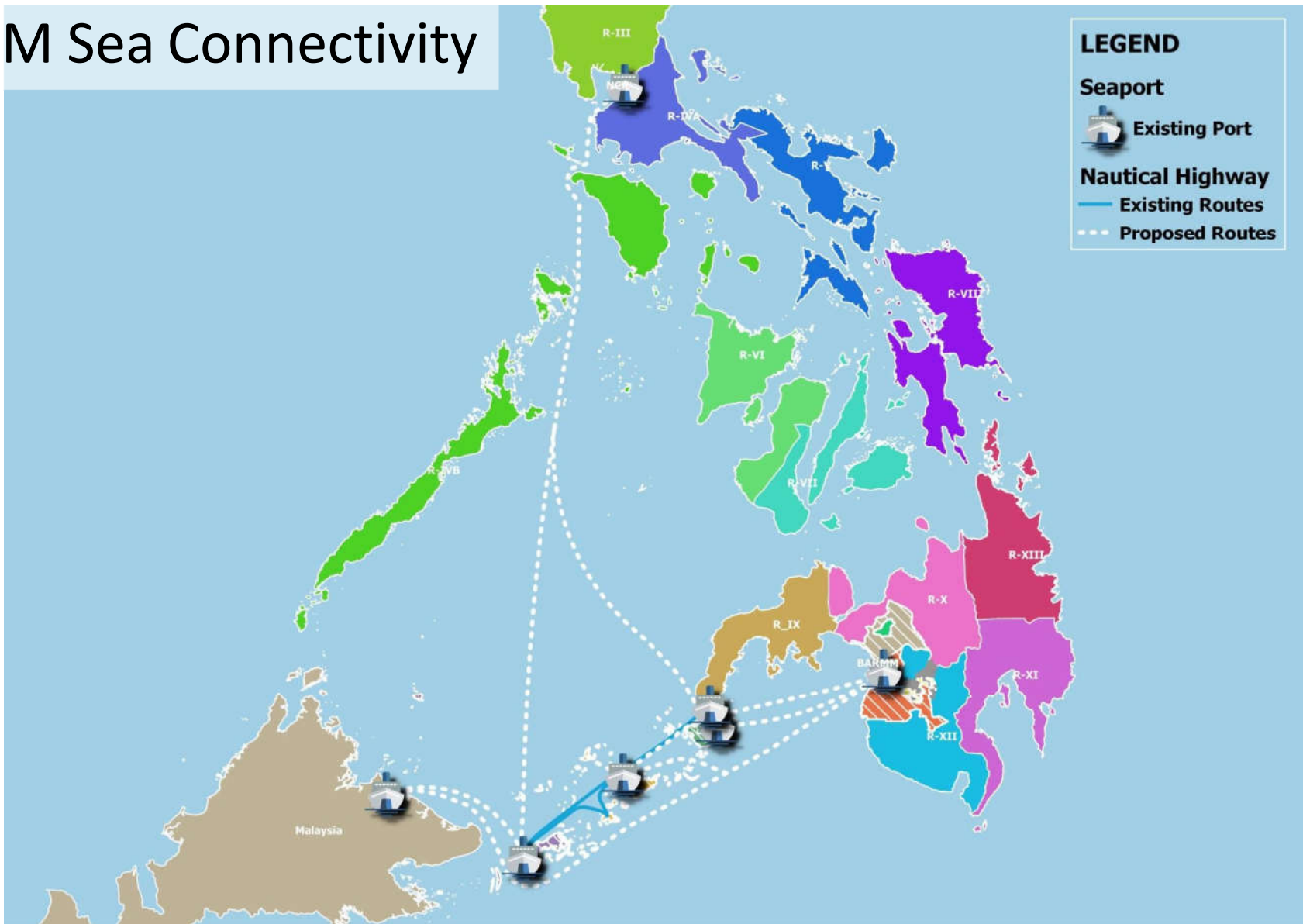
BARMM Potential Economic Zones



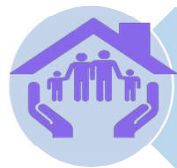
BARMM Air Connectivity

Accelerating Sustainable Infrastructure Development in the Bangsamoro Region

Infrastructure Priority Programs and Projects

1. Enactment of necessary legislations and policies to expedite infrastructure plans and programs
2. Construction, maintenance, and rehabilitation of quality infrastructure facilities such as roads, bridges, seaport and airports, irrigation facilities, water and sanitation facilities, electricity facilities, communication facilities, other vertical infrastructure facilities
3. Conduct feasibility studies and formulate master plans in coordination with stakeholders
4. Full digitalization of government operations with centralized network system technology transfer from outside country contractors
5. Regional vessel modernization program
6. Port modernization program
7. Strengthening infrastructure research and development
8. Projects in support of the bangsamoro economic corridor
