
. Handicap allowances ensure fair play for golfers of different abilities in various formats, for 9 or 18 holes. They are based on the Course Handicap, which is used to calculate the Playing Handicap (see Rules 6.1 and 6.2). The National Association sets the handicap allowances, or it can delegate this task to a Regional Golf Association or golf club. The table below shows the suggested handicap allowances for medium-sized field net events. They can be modified depending on the field size and the desired fairness (see Interpretation C/1): Handicap allowance in the Terms of the Competition. Usually, in stroke play formats, a player gets their full Playing Handicap after applying the handicap allowances. Usually, in match play formats, the player with the lowest Playing Handicap and the lowest one. Plus Playing Handicaps: If the Committee does not say otherwise, players with a 'plus' Playing Handicap return strokes to the course, starting from the hole with stroke index 18 and 17. When handicap allowances are applied, a player with a plus Playing Handicap moves up to zero with rounding. This keeps the same relative difference between Playing Handicaps. Extra Holes: Handicap allowances are meant for 9 or 18 holes.



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
