

We stand at a critical juncture in American education...



Academic outcomes were poor before the pandemic and are worse now. Math and reading proficiency continues to decline. Recently, U.S. students' math scores reached their lowest point ever recorded.

Making matters more complicated, educators are stretched thin. Classrooms within the same grade are full of students who learned at varying rates throughout the pandemic and are now at vastly different proficiency levels.

Note: These results are from The National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), also known as The Nation's Report Card—the largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of America's students.



Khan Academy has fostered extensive grassroots adoption by independent learners, teachers, and parents around the world. Our goal is to reach even more people and help them unlock their potential.

PILLAR 2

Content

The Content pillar describes Khan Academy's impact delivering high-quality content in core areas (preK-2 literacy and math, grades 3-14 math and science, and financial literacy) and maintaining and building content in humanities.

Khan Academy is known for its high-quality, standards-aligned content.

Each year, we add new courses and update our repository, ensuring learners worldwide have access to effective and transformative educational content.

Content highlights from school year 2022-23 include:

- **Free Official Digital SAT Prep course** to support students as they prepare to take the new digital SAT.
- New Financial Literacy course that meets requirements in >25 states for high school financial education
- **Expanded K-12 content in the U.S.,** including updates to middle school and high school science courses; 3rd-, 4th-, 5th-, 6th-, and 7th-grade math courses; and 8th-grade Eureka math courses. We also added an AP World History course and curated new MAP algebra and MAP geometry courses.
- Algebra Basics in American Sign Language (ASL) in partnership with RIT's National Technical Institute for the Deaf
- New Khan Kids Library titles with a focus on community helpers, designed to foster a love for reading from a young age
- Updated grades 9-12 science courses in India and math courses in Peru to improve content alignment to learners' needs

Khan Academy is the only official partner of the College Board. In October 2022, we launched Official Digital SAT Prep to ensure students are ready to take the new digital SAT.

PILLAR 3

Engagement

The Engagement pillar describes Khan Academy's impact empowering students to learn using a mastery learning approach, providing an efficacious user experience and supporting teachers to drive deep learning. ENGAGEMENT | KPIs

During the 2022-23 school year, **1.5M+ learners reached our deepest level of learning** associated with significant learning gains.

We track two key engagement metrics:

 Monthly Very Active Learners (MVALs): learners who have used Khan Academy for at least 120 minutes per month (30+ minutes per week)



• Yearly Very Active Learners (YVALs): learners who have used Khan Academy for 18+ hours (30+ minutes per week) over the course of a school year These engagement metrics come from our efficacy studies.

>50 research studies show that Khan Academy works.

Khan Academy boasts a repository of more than 50 research studies, each a testament to our platform's efficacy.

Last school year, we researched learning outcomes from our Khan Academy District Program using data from nearly 330,000 students in grades 3-8 during the 2021-2022 school year. We assessed their performance on the same nationally normed assessment—MAP Growth test scores.

The verdict? Khan Academy is a reliable tool for enhancing learning outcomes:

Amount that learners exceeded pre-pandemic growth expectations after using Khan Academy 30+ minutes per week (see Figure 1 on the next page)

Usage boost = Achievement boost	Year-over-year analysis showed that students who increased their usage from the previous year saw a corresponding boost in achievement. This enables us to determine Khan Academy usage is making the difference rather than other factors like specific teachers or student motivation.
Consistent results	Results are consistent across grades and demographic subgroups, such as race, gender, and income.

Results from our most recent analysis shows students who spend 30+ minutes per week on Khan Academy exceed pre-pandemic learning growth by an average of 32%.

Grassroots teachers and our Districts Partnerships program drive deep usage and significant learning gains.

Grassroots teachers

The grassroots program, open to any teacher, empowers teachers with a free suite of classroom tools and free training through Khan for Educators.

Grassroots teachers play a pivotal role in fueling usage and engagement. While these dedicated educators constitute only 4% of our registered user base, **their influence in driving deep engagement is significant–close to 60% of efficacious learners in the United States**.

Khan Academy U.S. Districts Partnerships program

The Khan Academy Districts program engages educators at the district level and includes additional benefits, like school and district-level reporting.* Our Districts Partnerships program is our best pathway to get students to efficacious usage of Khan Academy.

By the end of the 2022-23 school year, our Districts Partnerships program reached 945K licensed learners (+13% YOY) **and engaged** >103K yearly very active learners (+40% YOY).






Credentialing

The Credentialing pillar describes Khan Academy's impact enabling students to receive credit for their learning in a manner that offers transferability and provides access to future opportunities. Khan Academy enables high school students to receive college credit and bypass remedial math. The potential impact is enormous:



higher college graduation rates

higher wages



Algebra is a major barrier to college acceptance and completion, especially for historically under-resourced students. Khan Academy has partnered with Howard University and National Education Equity Lab since 2021 to address this barrier by offering college algebra to high school students.



Khanmigo

Khanmigo is Khan Academy's AI-enhanced tutor for students and enthusiastic assistant for educators. Khanmigo was piloted and launched in spring 2023.

An amazing tutor for anyone, anywhere.



Today, the world is buzzing about the promise of artificial intelligence. We believe in Al's promise, so we've put artificial intelligence to work for students and educators. Because we believe that every student deserves an amazing tutor, and every educator deserves an enthusiastic assistant.

We know that technology can help or it can hinder, depending on a person's pre-existing circumstances. We want to make sure no one is left without access to the latest innovations. To ensure this powerful, new technology works for everyone instead of creating a deeper digital divide, we're working closely with District Partners in historically under-resourced communities. Everyone deserves a chance to shine.

Khanmigo is an on-demand tutor for learners...

Khanmigo helps students understand content and work through practice exercises. When students are stuck, Khanmigo guides students through structured problem solving, empowering them to find the answer.



How can you help me learn?



I'm Khanmigo, your friendly AI Tutor! I'm here to guide you through your learning.

...and an on-demand teaching assistant for educators.

Khanmigo is designed to save educators time and enable more personalized teaching.

As a tutor, Khanmigo:

- Answers questions
- Debates topics
- Checks for understanding
- Gives encouragement
- Enables students to chat with historical or literary figures
- Co-writes stories
- Navigates the college admissions process

As a teaching assistant, Khanmigo:

- Writes lesson plans
- Helps teachers refresh their understanding of lesson content
- Creates lesson hooks or exit tickets
- Monitors student learning progress & recommends what to learn next

KHANMIGO | PILOT STUDY RESULTS

In spring 2023, Khan Academy launched Khanmigo for independent learners and hosted pilots in two districts that were willing to help us further develop Khanmigo. We intentionally over-indexed on District Partners with higher percentages of students from under-resourced communities so Khanmigo would effectively meet the needs of real classrooms with students from all backgrounds.

ABOUT THE KHANMIGO PILOT

- Conducted April June 2023
- ~8,700 users, including 90 teachers and 800 students
- Students who participated in the district pilots attended schools where 42-82% of students are eligible for free or reduced-price lunch.


Students also anecdotally described Khanmigo as "conversational, makes me feel understood, kind, respectful, patient, and clear."




Financials
