# About Brown

2008 Ivy League Champions

Brown University, a leading Ivy League institution, is the only major research university in the nation where undergraduates design their own course of study. Barron's Guide to the Most Competitive Colleges has described Brown as "the perfect university for self-motivated and confident students who desire an education [they create] on their own terms." By providing a rich undergraduate experience together with strong graduate and medical programs, the University fosters internal and external discovery at each level of the academic enterprise.

Brown is located in the College Hill residential section of Providence, Rhode Island, widely praised as one of America's most livable "renaissance cities." Boston is less than an hour away by train or car, and the state's major airport is a 15-minute taxi or shuttle ride from the campus.

The seventh oldest university in America, Brown was established in 1764 as Rhode Island College in the town of Warren and enrolled its first students in 1765. In 1770 the College moved to its present location, and in 1804 it was renamed Brown University to honor a \$5,000 donation from local merchant Nicholas Brown.

Brown draws talented students nationally and internationally. They work in partnership with a faculty known for its prize-winning multidisciplinary scholarship and dedication to teaching. Many students integrate study abroad or self-designed research projects into their academic programs. Students also have the opportunity to get involved in several



hundred extracurricular student activities and to develop their talents and interests in an atmosphere of encouragement and creativity.

About 25 percent of Brown graduates immediately go on to graduate or professional study, and within ten years of graduating more than 80 percent enter graduate or professional school. Popular career choices are business, consulting, technology, teaching, public service, computer graphics, and the arts. In recent years, the University has launched Boldly Brown, a program for academic enrichment that is enlarging its faculty by 100 members, improving support for graduate students, and investing libraries, in information technology, and academic facilities. As part of this extensive program of enhancements, the University instituted а need-blind undergraduate admission process to ensure all worthy applicants access to the University, regardless of their ability to pay.

### Faculty

The Brown faculty is one of the finest in the nation. By tradition, even the most distinguished senior professors teach undergraduates.Brown's faculty welcomes both undergraduate and graduate students as collaborators in research labs and in the field, and its many preeminent scholars make important contributions to the world through research and writing. The student faculty ratio is 8:1.

### Unique Curriculum


Brown is internationally known for its dynamic undergraduate curriculum, developed via student and faculty collaboration and implemented by faculty vote in 1969. More than 2,000 undergraduate courses support more than 100 concentrations, or majors, many of them interdisciplinary, as well as a wide variety of independent studies. The curriculum does not require distribution or core courses outside the concentration.



At the heart of the Brown curriculum are three basic principles: that students are active participants in learning; that acquiring analytical and critical skills is as important as mastering factual knowledge; and that learning requires opportunities for experimentation and cross-disciplinary synthesis. According to Barron's Guide, "Students see this [curriculum] as Brown's greatest offering and work hard to take advantage of it."

### **Innovative Grading**

In most courses, students may elect to have their work graded with either "ABC/ No Credit" or "Satisfactory/No Credit." Students may change their grading options at any time before the middle of the semester.



### **Degree Requirements**

The average course load is four per semester, which translates into 12 hours of classroom time per week, not including lab sessions. Brown undergraduates must pass 30 courses and complete the requirements for a concentration in order to receive a bachelor's degree. From eight to 21 of the courses taken – depending on the department and degree selected – must be concentrated in a single major field of study. Students select their concentrations by the end of second semester of the sophomore year.

### **Degrees Offered**

- Bachelor of arts in 80 areas of humanities, social sciences, mathematics, engineering, and life and physical sciences.
- Bachelorofsciencein, amongothersciencefocused areas, applied mathematics, aquatic biology, biochemistry, biology, biophysics, chemistry, cognitive science, computer science, engineering, environmental science, geological sciences, mathematics, neuroscience, physics and psychology.
- Program in Liberal Medical Education for 60 well-qualified freshmen who may combine undergraduate and medical studies in an eight-year continuum. Students may earn an A.B. or Sc.B. degree and the M.D. degree.
- Bachelor of arts/bachelor of science (combined degree program).
- Bachelor of science/master of science (combined degree program).
- Bachelor of arts/master of arts (combined degree program).

#### 2008 Ivy League Champions

Carrying on an intercollegiate athletic tradition over 150 years old, the Brown Bears compete at the highest level of intercollegiate athletics at the NCAA Division I level. As a member of the Ivy League, Brown has one of the nation's broadest arrays of varsity teams, featuring the nation's fourth largest athletic program – 37 in all, 17 for men, 20 for women -- the largest athletic program in the nation for women.

U.S. News and World Report recently named Brown Athletics to the College Sports Honor Roll as one of the nation's top 20 athletic programs. Brown has 24 teams honored by the NCAA with Public Recognition Awards for Academic Achievement, second-most in the nation.

Brown teams regularly compete in NCAA Championships, with the Brown women's crew winning five NCAA Championships in the last 10 years. In addition, Brown's baseball, men's soccer, and men's lacrosse teams have made NCAA playoff appearances in the last three years, with football and women's basketball joining those teams in winning lvy League championships. Coaches and writers have ranked 12 Brown teams nationally in recent years. Both the men's soccer (17) and women's soccer (12) teams have won more lvy titles than any other lvy League school.

In the last two years, Brown athletes achieved at the highest level on an individual basis with 20 All-Americans, 24 Academic All-Americans, three Ivy League Players of the Year, two Ivy League Rookies of the Year, an NCAA Top VIII Award winner, an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship Award winner, an Academic All-American of the Year, and two national finalists for Player of the Year honors. Brown athletes were drafted or signed by teams from the National Football League, Major League Baseball, and Major League Soccer.

Alumni of Brown Athletics are equally decorated, many going on to success in professional leagues, the Olympics and being honored for their achievement off the playing field. In 2007, former Brown football and NFL standout Steve Jordan (right) was honored with an NCAA Silver Anniversary Award for success on the playing field, in the work place and in the community. Forty-four Brown students or alums have participated in the Olympic games, including 26 in the last 10 years.

Brown student-athletes do not just dedicate themselves on the playing field and in the classroom, but in the community as well. The Brown Department of Athletics and the Vartan Gregorian Elementary School at Fox Point have had a relationship that is fast approaching 20 years. Each fall, teams "adopt" classrooms in a special ceremony, and the Brown studentathletes volunteer their time to help mentor the school's largely at-risk students.




2009 NCAA Playoffs - Men's Lacrosse

# Brown in the Community



### Brown Football Wins Rhode Island Community Service Award.

When ABC-TV's *Extreme Makeover* arrived in Rhode Island to come to the aid of the Silva Family of Warwick, the Brown football family played a key role in the construction of their new home.

Doreen and Kenny Silva have two children of their own, plus three adopted children, all with disabilities, and two foster infants. The family had outgrown their Cape-style house of about 1,000 square feet that contained dangerous levels of lead paint.

Eric Johnson, the president of Oldport Homes in Portsmouth and the parent of a former Brown football player, was the primary builder of the house. Johnson elicited the help of the entire Brown football team and about 200 volunteers on the project that included contractors, subcontractors, neighbors, strangers and city officials.

In a race against time, a team of designers, hundred's of workmen and even the neighbors, had just seven days to completely demolish and rebuild an entire house - plus the exterior and landscaping for a deserving family nominated by friends and family.





Normally, the two-story, 2,900-square-foot New England shingle-style house that will be built for the Silva's on Yucatan Drive would take six to eight months to complete.

The house was rebuilt in February, and the show aired on May 4, 2008. The work was all completed on time and a grateful Silvia Family have been living in the new home, continuing to be a beacon of light for the foster care program in America.

In addition to its work with Extreme Makeover, the Brown football hosted the 2nd Annual "Bench Press for Cancer" on the Main Green of Brown University. Combining dedication to physical training and dedication to helping others, the event raised funds for the American Cancer Society.

Head Coach Phil Estes' Brown football team also has a continuing strong relationship with Providence area youth at the Vartan Gregorian Elementary School at Fox Point, volunteering their time to read to the students in the classrooms.

The Brown football team is also involved with A Wish Come True, Inc., an organization that grants wishes to children, ages 3-18, who have a life-threatening illness.

# The Ivy League



While the 2005-06 academic year marked the 50th season of official lvy League athletic competition, the rivalries and traditions in the League go so much deeper. The first official athletic competition between League schools was more than 150 years ago (1852, Harvard-Yale rowing) and the first football game was more than 130 years ago (1872, Columbia-Yale). Brown's first intercollegiate athletic competition came in 1859.

In the early days, the Ivy schools dominated college athletics. All-America status, Olympic medals, and national championships were routinely earned by students from the Ancient Eight.

Today, Ivy Leaguers continue to claim national titles and Olympic medals as well as All-America and Academic All-America status. Hundreds continue athletic careers as professionals and hundreds more as coaches and athletic administrators. The student-athletes also are among the nation's leading public servants, doctors, journalists, lawyers, scientists, scholars, business leaders, entertainers, educators and so much more.

The success of the League comes without athletic scholarships while maintaining self-imposed high academic standards. The

Ivy League has demonstrated a rare willingness and ability, given the pressures on inter-collegiate success throughout the nation, to abide by these rules and still compete successfully in Division I athletics.

Sponsoring con-ference champion-ships in 33 men's and women's sports, and averaging more than 35 varsity teams at each school, the Ivy League provides intercollegiate athletic opportunities for more men and women than any other conference in the country. All eight Ivy schools are among the "top 20" of NCAA Division I schools in number of sports offered for both men and women.

The term "Ivy colleges" was first in October 1933 by Stanley Woodward of the New York Herald Tribune to describe the eight current Ivy schools (plus Army). On Feb. 8, 1935, Associated Press sports editor Alan Gould first used the exact term "Ivy League."

The first "Ivy Group Agreement," signed in 1945, applied only to football. It affirmed the observance of common practices in academic standards and eligibility requirements and the administration of need-based financial aid, with no athletic scholarships. The agreement created the Presidents Policy Committee, including the eight Presidents; the Coordination and Eligibility

Committee, made up of one senior non-athletic administrator from each school; and the committee on Administration, comprised of the eight directors of athletics.

The Ivy Presidents extended the Ivy Group Agreement to all intercollegiate sports in February 1954. Their statement also focused on presidential governance of the League, the importance of intra-League competition, and a desire that recruited athletes is academically 'representative' of each institution's overall student body. Although that is the League's official founding date, the first year of competition was 1956-57, when Brown and Columbia played the first official Ivy League Game.

The League office is housed in Princeton, N.J., under the leadership of Executive Director Robin Harris.

# Since 2000 alone, the lvy League...

Produced NCAA individual champions in fencing, women's swimming and diving, men's indoor track & field, men's outdoor track and field, women's indoor track and field, women's outdoor track and field and wrestling while earning NCAA team championships in fencing, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse and women's rowing. The League has also captured national champions in the non-NCAA sports of men's squash and men's rowing. All eight Ivy League schools have had at least one NCAA champion – individual or team – during this span.

- Became the first conference to "sweep" the four major NCAA Honors in the same year (2006) — Columbia's Robert Kraft claiming the Theodore Roosevelt Award; Princeton's John Doar the Inspirational Award; Yale's Susan Wellington a Silver Anniversary Award; and Brown's Nick Hartigan a Top VIII Award.
- Became the second conference with three of the six NCAA Silver Anniversary Award winners in the same year (2007) — Dartmouth's Gail Koziara Boudreaux, Brown's Steve Jordan, and Yale's Patricia Melton.
- Finished eighth among the 31 Division I conferences in the 2007-08 Directors' Cup presented annually by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA), United States Sports Academy and USA Today.



# **Brown Stadium**

Brown football's current home. Brown Stadium, was part of the University's 30 acre Elmgrove Avenue athletic complex developed in the early 1920's. The stadium, dedicated in 1925 as "A Field of Honor," was initially called Brown Field. It was underwritten completely by subscription, with funds raised by the Amphitheatre Committee headed by Clinton C. White 1900. The first game in the all-home schedule resulted in a 33-0 victory over Rhode Island. Dedication games were held with Yale and Harvard. The original seating capacity was 27,646, which included 7,264 end zone and sideline wooden bleachers. The last bleachers were removed after the 1952 season, resulting in the current capacity of 20.000.

In 1978, Brown's Centennial Season, new aluminum seats were installed as part of Operation Pride. The stadium underwent a complete renovation in 1988, with concrete restoration and waterproofing, new graphics, and painting of the John "Jay" Barry Jr. 1950 Press Box. In addition, an underground sprinkler system was installed for the stadium's natural grass field. A new home locker room was completed for the 1991 season, in addition to a coaches' locker room and training facility.

### Joukowsky Family Locker Room

Named in honor of Artemis A.W. Joukowsky '55 and Martha Sharp Joukowsky '58, whose commitment in encouraging Brown University studentathletes to realize their fullest potential in mind and body, led to the renovation of the locker room. The football locker room at Brown Stadium underwent a massive expansion in the summer of 1991 with new carpeting and lockers installed to accommodate over 100 players. The fully decorated locker area has full shower facilities and a movable partition that can separate the room for offensive and defensive meetings.

# Weight Training

# Washington Weight Room

The Washington Weight Room was given to Brown University's athletes by the Washington, D.C. Sports Foundation Committee, and is located in the Pizzitola Memorial Sports Center. Encompassing 4,000 square feet, the weight room is recognized as one of the premier collegiate athletic weight training facilities in the Northeast.

Under the direction of strength and conditioning coordinator Roger Marandino, the Washington Weight Room has taken on a new look. Six new weightlifting platforms and eight new power racks have been added and the new room now resembles an Olympic-style training facility. Brown athletes train with multi-joint Olympicstyle movements geared to meet the biomechanical and physiological needs of their sport. Varsity teams train with goals of increasing performance, preventing injury and reconditioning after injury.

The Brown Bears Football Strength program consists of multi-joint Olympic movements designed to increase athletic power, mobility, and overall sprint conditioning. Testing in the weight room consists of the power clean, squat, and bench press. Each athlete is tested a total of nine times during a full training year. Testing frequently develops team competition and short-term goal setting. During the competitive season, training focuses on increasing strength levels throughout the season with weekly goals of peaking on game day.

### **Roger Marandino**

Head Strength Coach M.S.CSCS.\*D

The head strength and conditioning coach at Brown since 1995, Roger Marandino is responsible for the coordination of all strength and conditioning programs for Brown's 37 varsity sports. Marandino utilizes a hands-on approach to assure that all players maintain peak physical conditioning to be able to play at the highest level possible.

A 1993 graduate of Kean College of New Jersey, Mar-andino earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Exercise Physiology. He completed a strength and conditioning internship at the University of Pacific in Stockton, California after graduation and then enrolled in the graduate school at the University of Connecticut in 1993. While working towards his Master's degree in biomechanics, he served as assistant strength and conditioning coach for two years. He designed, developed and implemented the comprehensive strength and conditioning programs for several varsity athletic teams at Connecticut, including the football and men's and women's basketball teams.

Marandino, who was named the NSCA Collegiate S&C Professional of the Year in 2000, was a three-time, drug-free national power-lifting champion and is certified by the National Strength and Conditioning Association as a certified strength and conditioning specialist (CSCS).

In 1997 and 2000, Marandino was chosen as the NSCA Strength and Conditioning Professional of the Year in the Ivy League. He has been a NSCA National Conference speaker.

In addition, he is certified by the United States Weightlifting Federation as a Level I Olympic Weightlifting coach.

Formerly of Vineland, New Jersey, Roger and his wife, Caraline, reside in Rumford, Rhode Island with their daughter, Annabella.







# Athletic Training



**Russ Fiore** Head Athletic Trainer

Russ Fiore has been a member of the Brown University training staff since August of 1979 and in 2004, assumed the position of Head Athletic Trainer at Brown.



Born in Providence,

Fiore graduated from Cranston East High School in 1968 and received a Bachelor of Science degree in health and physical education from the University of Rhode Island in 1972. He received his Master's degree in physical education from the University of Arizona in 1974, and studied in a special graduate program at Northeastern University from 1977-79. He also worked as a graduate assistant athletic trainer at the University of Arizona from 1973-74 before moving to Northeastern as a staff athletic trainer from 1974-79.

Fiore is the inventor of a special machine that is now used by many schools to treat ankle injuries. Fiore recently designed and developed a revolutionary new ankle brace that is used by several NBA players and athletes at all levels.

An avid golfer, Fiore resides in Lincoln, Rhode Island, with his wife, Karlene. They have two children, Matthew and Melanie.



# Success at the Top

#### 2008 Ivy League Champions

### Ruth J. Simmons Brown President

Ruth J. Simmons was sworn in as the 18th president of Brown University on July 3, 2001. She also holds appointment an as professor in the Department Comparative of Literature and the Department of Africana Studies.



She was president of Smith College from 1995 until the time of her appointment at Brown.

A native of Texas and a 1967 graduate of Dillard University in New Orleans, Simmons received her Ph.D. in Romance languages and literatures from Harvard University in 1973. She is fluent in French and has written on the works of David Diop and Aime Cesaire.

In 1983, after serving as associate dean of the graduate school at the University of Southern California, Simmons joined the Princeton University administration. She remained at Princeton for seven years, leaving in 1990 for two years to serve as provost at Spelman College. Returning to Princeton in 1992 as vice provost, she remained at the university until June 30, 1995. As vice provost she was deputy to the provost and executive secretary of the Priorities Committee, the university's budget committee. In 1993, invited by the president to review the state of race relations on the Princeton campus, Simmons wrote a report that resulted in a number of initiatives that received widespread attention. In 1995 she became president of Smith College, the largest women's college in the United States, where she launched a number of strategic initiatives to strengthen the college's academic programs and inaugurated the first engineering program at a U.S. women's college.

Simmons is a member of the National Academy of Arts and Sciences, the American Philosophical Society, and the Council on Foreign Relations; she is currently serving as chair of the lvy Council. She also serves on a number of boards, including Pfizer Inc., Texas Instruments, and the Goldman Sachs Group. Active in a wide range of educational, charitable, and civic endeavors, she holds honorary degrees from numerous colleges and universities, including Amherst, Boston University, Columbia, Dartmouth, Dillard, Harvard, Howard, Mount Holyoke College, New York University, Northeastern, Princeton, the University of Pennsylvania, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, the University of Southern California, George Washington University, Washington University in St. Louis, the University of Vermont, the Jewish Theological Seminary, Miami Dade College, and Morehouse College.

Simmons is the recipient of a number of prizes and fellowships, including the German DAAD and a Fulbright Fellowship to France. In 1997 she was awarded the Centennial Medal from Harvard University, in 1999 the Teachers College Medal for Distinguished Service from Columbia University, and in 2001 the President's Award from the United Negro College Fund. She has been honored with the 2002 Fulbright Lifetime Achievement Medal and the 2002 "Drum Major for Justice" education award from Southern Christian Leadership Conference/ W.O.M.E.N. In 2004 she received the ROBIE Humanitarian Award, given by the Jackie Robinson Foundation; the Eleanor Roosevelt Val-Kill Medal; and the chairman's award of the Congressional Black Caucus Foundation. She was selected as a Newsweek "person to watch" and as a Ms. Woman of the Year in 2002. In 2001 Time magazine named her America's best college president.

In recent years, Simmons, an articulate spokesperson and writer, has written and delivered papers or presentations on a wide array of educational and public policy issues, including institutional governance, foreign language study, diversity, liberal arts, science education, leadership, and women in higher education. Among numerous educational institutions and national forums, she has been a featured speaker at the White House, the World Economic Forum, the National Press Club, the Association of American Universities, and the American Council on Education. In September 2001 ABC News tapped her to serve as a respondent during its live telecast following President Bush's address to Congress.

During her tenure at Brown University, Simmons has created an ambitious set of initiatives designed to expand and strengthen the faculty; increase financial support and resources for undergraduate, graduate, and medical students; improve facilities; renew a broad commitment to shared governance; and ensure that diversity informs every dimension of the university. These initiatives have led to a major investment of new resources in Brown's educational mission.

As an academic leader, Simmons believes in the power of education to transform lives. She champions the university as a haven of reasoned debate with the responsibility to challenge students intellectually and prepare them to become informed, conscientious citizens. She has spent her career advocating for a leadership role for higher education in the arena of national and global affairs.

### Mike Goldberger Director of Athletics

Michael Goldberger assumed the duties of director of athletics at Brown on July 1, 2005 following a 10-year stint as director of admissions at the university. Goldberger brings a myriad of experience to the position, beginning his career in collegiate athletics as an assistant football coach at Brown in 1973.

"For more than 30 years Mike Goldberger has served the University – particularly prospective students, athletes and their families – with integrity, effectiveness and personal warmth," Simmons said. "His excellent relationships with alumni, students, faculty, staff, coaches and athletes made him an ideal candidate. Leadership is what it will take to move the athletics program to a higher level of excellence. Goldie has demonstrated that he can provide the leadership necessary to compete at the highest level."

The appointment as athletic director brings Goldberger back to his point of entry at the University. He came to Brown in 1973 as an assistant coach for football and baseball, recruited to the staff by John Anderson, Brown's new head football coach. Goldberger had played three seasons for Anderson when Anderson was a coach at Middlebury College.

Goldberger was an assistant freshman football coach during his first two years at Brown before joining the varsity staff in 1975. He coached the Brown freshman football squad for seven years. Goldberger was an assistant baseball coach for seven years and was the facilities director of the Olney Margolies Athletic center for several years. In 1981, Goldberger became an assistant to John Parry, Brown's athletic director, serving as athletic liaison to the admission office, among other duties.

"You only get one lifetime," said Goldberger at the press conference, "and the chance to do some different things at a place that you love is amazing. The opportunity to take on an new challenge with people I really care about is sort of hard to beat."

After 10 years in athletics, Goldberger moved to the College Admission Office, where he would serve for 22 years. He began as associate director in 1983 and was named director in 1995. Brown's applicant pool expanded steadily during his tenure.

A graduate of Middlebury College, Goldberger played defensive back on the gridiron team for three years, captaining the team in his senior year. He was an outfielder/pitcher for the baseball team while earning a Bachelor's degree in History.

He and his wife, Kathy, have two children, Kevin and Brian, and reside in Barrington, Rhode Island.



# NCAA Rules for Alumni



### Ask Before You Act

NCAA regulations are complex and ever-changing, and the consequences of breaking them can affect the eligibility of current and prospective student-athletes. For that reason, it is important to be diligent about compliance with the rules, and the Brown Athletic Department is available to assist you with any questions you may have as you support the University and its teams.

The following summary of frequently asked questions is designed to help you familiarize yourself with NCAA regulations, and also to clear up some of the confusion you may have about what the rules say. Always ask before you act, and please contact the Assistant Athletic Director for Compliance at 401-863-7584 if you require clarification or more information.

### Do these rules apply to me?

You are a Representative of the University's Athletic Interests (a booster), and therefore governed by these rules, if you have ever:

- been a member of any organization promoting Brown Athletics;
- are, or have been, a season ticket holder in any sport;
- are the parent(s) or guardian(s) of a current student-athlete;
- have ever made a donation to the Athletic Department, a men's or women's athletic team, or any friends organization;
- have ever assisted in evaluating or recruiting prospects;
- have ever helped to arrange or have provided employment to enrolled student-athletes, prospects, or their parents and relatives;
- participated in the Brown University Intercollegiate Athletics program; or
- otherwise promoted the University's athletics program.

Once you become a Representative of the University's Athletics Interests, you retain this status FOREVER!

# Who is a Prospective Student-Athlete?

A prospective student-athlete, commonly known as a "prospect," is any individual who has started classes for the 9th grade. In addition, studentathletes enrolled in preparatory school or two-year colleges are considered prospects. Ultimately, a student remains a prospect until enrollment at a four-year collegiate institution.

# What kind of contact may I have with a prospect?

 make any recruiting contacts with prospects or their relatives. This includes telephone calls, letters, emails, text messages, chat rooms and facsimiles, along with any face-to-face contact either on or offcampus;

 assist Brown coaches by picking up transcripts, films, or any other information pertaining to a prospect's ability from the prospect's educational institution;

 provide financial aid or benefit or any kind (e.g., clothing, special discounts, lodging, meals, transportation, tickets, loans of money) to prospects or their relatives;

• make contact with a prospective student-athlete or his/her parents when the prospect is on campus for an official or unofficial recruiting visit.

 contact a prospective student-athlete to congratulate him/her on an offer of admission to Brown University;

 provide transportation or arrange for payment of transportation costs for a prospect or his/her relatives or friends to visit campus;

 earmark funds for specific prospects to attend a Brown summer camp;

• employ or arrange for employment of a prospect before the completion of his/her senior year. After graduation, you may employ a prospect at a rate commensurate with experience and also the going rate. This is the only exception which allows you to contact a prospect before he or she enrolls at Brown. Please contact the Compliance Office for more details.

• provide ANYTHING to a prospect or the prospect's family or friends without prior approval from the Compliance Office; or

• bring any guest to an alumni gathering or booster event if he or she is participating in athletics at the high school or junior college level. Your own son or daughter would be an exception, but limits to the type of interaction your son or daughter could have with coaching staff members at the event still apply.

#### YOU MAY:

forward information about prospects to the appropriate coaching staff member;

• view a prospect's athletics contest on your own initiative, provided you do not contact the prospect or his/her relatives, coach, principal, or counselor in an attempt to evaluate the academic or athletic abilities of the prospect. If contact is unavoidable, only greetings may be exchanged. Additionally, you are responsible for all incurred costs or fees at a contest;

• speak to a prospect on the telephone ONLY if the prospect initiates the call. Such a call cannot be prearranged by the athletic department. You MAY NOT have a recruiting conversation, but you may refer questions about the athletics program to the athletics department staff;

 provide lodging, meals and transportation to coaching staff members when they are recruiting in your area;

• join a friends group to help provide support and funding for recruiting, special trips and receptions at home and away contests; or

• invite a team to meet with alumni or friends in a city where they play. Student-athletes may receive benefits as a team in conjunction with an away contest, which individual student-athletes may not, but such arrangements must be made through the head coach.

### What if I have a preestablished relationship with a prospect?

If you have an established relationship with a prospect, his or her parents or relatives, you may continue normal contacts with the understanding that such contacts are not made for recruiting purposes and are not arranged by members of Brown's coaching staff. Essentially, a relationship is established if it predates the individual's status as a prospect, if it predates the athlete's status as a result of her or her athletic ability or reputation, and the relationship did not develop as a result of the individual's participation in athletics.

### What kind of involvement may I have with enrolled student-athletes? YOU MAY NOT

 pay for or arrange for payment of room, board, or any type of transportation at any time for currently enrolled student-athletes, their relatives, or their friends;

• provide student-athletes with any sort of extra benefit, which refers to any special arrangement to provide a student-athlete or his/her relatives or friends with a benefit unavailable to the general student population;

• provide student-athletes, their relatives, or their friends with any special discount, payment arrangements (e.g., cosigning a loan), credits on a purchase (e.g., airline ticket, clothing), or services (e.g., dry-cleaning, transportation);

 allow student-athletes, to use your telephone to make free calls;

 provide awards or gifts to student-athletes for any reason. This also prohibits honorariums for speaking engagements. All awards to studentathletes must meet all NCAA legislation and be approved by the Compliance Office;

use the name, picture or appearance of an enrolled student-athlete to advertise, recommend or promote sales or use of a commercial product or service of any kind. Any use of the name, picture or appearance of a student-athlete must receive authorization from the Compliance Office; or

• entertain student-athletes or their family and friends. The only exception to this is that YOU MAY, on an occasional basis, provide a student-athlete or team (not family members or friends) with a meal. The meal can be catered, but it must be in your home and be approved in advance by the Compliance Office.

# 2009 Outlook



Coming off its second Ivy League Championship in the last four years, Brown head football coach Phil Estes is optimistic that his team will be in the mix to once again challenge for the Ivy title with the return of 10 starters that includes six All-Ivy players, including four first team All-Ivy selections.

Estes, a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award as the nation's top coach in 2008, has guided the Bears to three Ivy League titles in the last 10 years. He believes the Bears' 2008 Ivy League Championship is to be celebrated as a true team accomplishment. But once the memories have faded and the 2009 squad begins its Spring Practice sessions, last year's media guide is buried and the focus is on a completely new season.

### Offense

Three of Brown's first team All-lvy selections return to the offensive side of the ball, with senior wide receivers Buddy Farnham and Bobby Sewall back in the fold, along with senior offensive tackle Paul Jasinowski. While the Bears are solid at wide receiver and the offensive line, the biggest question mark comes at quarterback where the Bears will feature a quarterback who has never attempted a varsity pass.

### Wide Receiver

Brown's wide receiver corps is considered the best in the nation with the return of Farnham and Sewall, as well as several talented receivers who will vie for playing time in Brown's wide-open offense.

Now a two-time first team All-Ivy and All-New England selection, Farnham twice earned the Boston Globe Gold Helmet Award winner as the New England Player of the Week. His 63 receptions and 816 receiving yards were third in the Ivy League, while he ranked second in the league with 149.5 all-purpose yards per game. Farnham's 1,892 career receiving yards are 27th in the Ivy League record book, while

his 155 career receptions are 20th in Ivy history. Farnham earned one of his Gold Helmet awards against Princeton with 228 all-purpose yards, including 79 receiving yards with a 20 yard touchdown, 27 rushing yards with a three-yard touchdown run, 55 kickoff return yards, and 67 punt return yards.

A triple receiving, running and passing threat, Sewall ranked ninth in the nation with 6.9 receptions per game, and 14<sup>th</sup> nationally with 94.80 receiving yards per game. The first team All-Ivy and All-New England choice led the Ivy League in receptions (69), receiving yards (948) and scoring (8.4 points per game), registering eight receiving touchdowns and six touchdowns via the run. Sewall also etched his name in the Ivy League record book with 144 career receptions, 25<sup>th</sup> best in Ivy football history. Against Cornell, Sewall made 11 receptions for 181 yards with touchdown grabs of 52 and 33 yards.

Junior Matt Sudfeld stepped up in his first varsity opportunity a year ago, making 20 catches for 181 yards, while senior Trevan Samp made 12 receptions for 190 yards and two touchdowns. Senior Chris LaMar also contributed with one reception for 18 yards.

At tight end, senior Andrew Fertig saw some valuable playing time as a back-up a year ago, as did junior Alex Prestley, who made one catch for 15 yards last season.

### Quarterback

The biggest question mark heading into the 2009 season is at quarterback, where the Bears will look to replace All-lvy quarterback and Brown record holder Michael Dougherty, who was the only Brown quarterback to attempt a pass in 2008. Estes believes several players have a grasp of the offense and should vie for the top spot, including juniors Joe Springer, who played the fourth quarter against Dartmouth, Kyle Newhall-Caballero and Ryley Hegarty, along with sophomore Patrick Pakan.

### Offensive Line

The Bears return three starters to their offensive line, led by the 6-5, 285 Jasinoswki, a mainstay at right tackle since his sophomore campaign. Mark Callahan, a 6-1, 260 senior, has started 18 of the last 20 games at center for the Bears and is one of the most underrated linemen in the Ivy League. Senior Tim Danser, who is 6-3, 275, earned a starting role at right guard. The trio helped the Brown offense to 379.5 total yards per game, third in the Ivy League, and the league's second best passing offense with 267.7 yards per game. Brown's 29.3 points per game led the Ivy League. As a group, the Bears' offensive line allowed an Ivy League best seven sacks all year, sixth best in the nation, while passing 384 times.

Brown also features several more offensive linemen, who saw action a year ago, including 6-2, 275 junior Brian Ellixson, and 6-3, 260 junior Patrick Conroy.

### Running Back

Junior tailback Daniel Ball is the most experienced returning tailback with 14 carries for 45 yards last season, while junior Marc Howland contributed with 37 yards on five carries. Nine of Brown's 14 rushing touchdowns came from the wide receiver position, with Sewall running for a team high six touchdowns, rushing 140 yards on 34 attempts, some on direct snaps. Farnham ran for 89 yards and three touchdowns out of the wide receiver position.

# Defense

Brown's defense also returns three All-Ivy players, senior defensive tackle David Howard, a first team selection, and second team All-Ivy honorees, senior defensive end James Develin, and senior safety Chris Perkins. The Bears will look to pick up where they left off last year with the Ivy League's stingiest defense against the run, allowing a league best 77.1

yards per game on the ground, fourth best in the nation. Brown's defense also allowed the fewest rushing touchdowns (3) in the nation.

### Defensive Line

The Bears lost two of its starters on the defensive line, but return its two All-lvy players, Howard and Develin. Howard, a 6-3, 270 tackle, had a breakout season for the Bears, playing a key role in Brown's stingy rushing defense that allowed just 77.1 yards per game to lead the lvy League and rank fourth nationally. Howard led the Bears and ranked fourth in the lvy League with 13 tackles for a loss of 69 yards. He also made 6.5 quarterbacks to rank third in the lvy League, and finished the season with 30 total tackles, including 17 solo stops.

Playing the defensive end position, the 6-3, 270 Develin, a second team All-Ivy selection a year ago, led all defensive linemen on the Brown squad with 34 total tackles, including 20 solo stops. He also made 4.5 tackles for a loss, including 2.5 quarterback sacks. He was named the Ivy League and the Sports Network National Defensive Player of the Week after leading the Bears' defense against Stony Brook with nine tackles, 3.5 tackles for a loss, including two quarterback sacks for a loss of 16 yards.

The Bears rotated several players into the lineup a year ago, which should pay-off in 2009. Senior Michael Lemmons made 12 tackles from the tackle position and recovered a fumble for the Bears. Junior end Clay McGrath made the most of his playing time with 12 tackles, including 2.5 tackle for a loss and a quarterback sack. Senior end Peter Hughes was also a force in the middle for the Bears with 16 total tackles and 5.5 tackles for a loss of 12 yards, including 1.5 quarterback sacks. Senior end Brian Neff also contributed with three total hits for the Bears.

### Linebackers

Defensive coordinator Michael Kelleher will look to rebuild his linebacker corps after losing three of four starters, with senior inside linebacker Kelly Cox the lone starter returning to the lineup. Cox registered 33 total tackles a year ago, including 21 solo stops and two tackles for a loss. Junior inside backer Andrew Serrano enjoyed a solid season in 2008, registering

22 total hits. Senior Brendan Gallagher will also play on the inside after making 14 total tackles in 2008. Junior Chimso Okoji is a hard-hitter, who made three tackles, including a tackle for a loss last season.

2008 Ivy League Champions

On the outside, the Bears return two contributors, senior Phil Roffi and junior Cameron Cotton. Roffi was responsible for six tackles a year ago, while Cotton registered three stops for the Bears.

### Secondary

The Bears are buoyed by the return of starters Chris Perkins at safety and David Clement at corner back. Perkins played a key role in the success of Brown's secondary, making 55 total tackles, third best on the Brown team. He intercepted a pass against Rhode Island, was named the lvy League Defensive Player of the Week for his performance vs. Harvard, where he made a team high nine tackles, including six solo stops, forced two key fumbles, including one that led to a Brown touchdown, broke-up two passes, and was in on a tackle for a loss.

Clement was Brown's sixth leading tackler in 2008 with 38 total tackles, and led the squad with eight pass break-ups, while also picking off a pass. Junior safety Robert Gillett will also look to contribute in the secondary after action in all 10 games, making 17 tackles. Junior cornerback Russell Leedy was also on the depth chart and registered four tackles for the season, including one for a loss.

# **Kicking Game**

Estes will look to retool his kicking game with the loss of all-lvy kicker/punter Robert Ranney. Senior Drew Plitcha and junior Del Thomas will battle it out after watching two All-lvy kickers come through for the Brown team (Steve Morgan and Ranney) during their tenure.

# Phil Estes - Head Coach

#### The Howard D. Williams '17/ Joseph V. Paterno '50 Football Coaching Chair

Since Phil Estes became head coach of the Bears 11 years ago, his Brown football teams have captured three lvy League titles (1999, 2005, 2008), finished second twice, third three times, and overall have finished in the top half of the lvy League in nine seasons, compiling an impressive 47-30 lvy mark (.610), 66-43 (.605) overall.

Estes may very well be the greatest coach in Brown football history with three lvy League Championships in 11 seasons as head coach of the Bears. Prior to his arrival on College Hill, Brown had earned one lvy League Championship in the previous 42 years of lvy League competition.

Estes, the 19th head coach in Brown history, is the third winningist coach in Brown football history, guiding the Brown football program to an unprecedented level of success, winning three Ivy League Championship, including Brown's first ever Ivy outright title in 2005. He has also coached and recruited Brown's only three Ivy League Players of the Year – Sean Morey '99, James Perry '00 and Nick Hartigan '06.

Since the Ivy League was formed in 1956, only two Brown teams have won nine or more games in a season, both teams coached by Estes, in 2005 (9-1) and 1999 (9-1). Prior to Ivy League play, Brown teams won nine or more games just once before, in 1894 (10-5).

Estes has also earned 50 wins faster than any coach in Brown history, taking 78 games to get to the halfcentury mark. It took coach John Anderson 79 games to reach 50 victories from 1973 through 1982. Edward North Robinson coached 84 games for the Bears before reaching 50 wins from 1898-01 and 1904-1907.

Last year (2008), Estes was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award as the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS/ I-AA) National Coach of the Year for 2008 Ivy League Champions the third time in his career. He guided the Bears to a

6-1 Ivy League mark, equaling the most Ivy wins ever for a Brown team. His Ivy League Championship squad featured a Brown record 15 All-Ivy players, including eight first team All-Ivy selections. Estes was also honored by the Rhode Island Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame for his "Contribution to Amateur Football."

In 2005, Estes was named the New England Coach of the Year and a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award as the nation's top coach, following Brown's remarkable season where his team posted a 9-1 overall record, including a 6-1 lvy mark, winning their last eight games to earn the lvy title outright. Brown also earned its highest national ranking ever, being ranked 15<sup>th</sup> in the final Sports Network poll. Overall, 15 Brown players earned All-lvy honors that season as the Bears led the lvy League and ranked 10<sup>th</sup> nationally in scoring offense with 36.8 points per game.

Estes has also coached the most storied running back in Brown football history, Hartigan, the leading rusher in Brown football history (4,492 yards), who was also a final-three Walter Payton Award Finalist, the 2005 Ivy Player of the Year, the ECAC Player of the Year, the New England Senior Player of the Year, an NCAA Top VIII Award Winner, the National Academic All-American of the Year, a first team All-American (Walter Camp, AP, Sports Network, AFCA), and holder of three Ivy League records, including new marks for career rushing touchdowns (52), career points (324), and career touchdowns (54). He also played in the East-West Shrine Game.

Estes has always been known as an offensive guru, with his teams reaching the 1,000 point scoring mark faster than any coach in Ivy League football history, scoring 1,022 points in his first 32 games as head coach of the Bears, while averaging 31.9 points per game. Estes' 2000 team set an Ivy League record with 375 points, averaging 37.5 points per game.

Quarterbacks, wide receivers and runningbacks have

reaped the rewards of Estes' successful offense, spinning off three Walter Payton Award finalists, several All-Americans, national record holders, annual NCAA receiving champions, and an NCAA rushing champion.

Among his many All-Americans and record setters are Perry, the Ivy League's all-time leading passer with 9,284 career passing yards, and a Walter Payton Award finalist. All-American wide receiver Stephen Campbell '01, a Walter Payton Award finalist, who set an NCAA record with 120 catches in 2000. All-American wide-out Chas Gessner '03 finished 6th in the Walter Payton Award balloting in 2002, and led the nation in receiving. All-American RB Mike Malan '02, finished his career as Brown's all-time leading rusher twice running for 1,000 or more yards. Quarterback Kyle Slager '04 took over the Bears offense and tied the NCAA record with 25 consecutive completions against Rhode Island in 2002. Hartigan provided the icing on the cake by placing among the top three of all Payton candidates, the highest finish ever for an Ivy League player.

And let's not forget Zak DeOssie on the defensive side of the ball, a Buck Buchanan Award finalist for the Bears and a linebacker and long snapper for the Super Bowl Champion New York Giants.

Versatility is the key to Estes' offense, with the term "Receiver U." being attached to the program for his first six years. But while the Bears were known for their vaunted passing game, Estes also produced two All-American runningbacks – Hartigan and Michael Malan '02 - who have turned in the top five single-season rushing performances in Brown football history.

Estes helped the Class of 2001 to become the most successful class in Brown football history, compiling a 30-10 mark, besting the 28 wins won by Brown teams from 1894 to 1897, and 1996 to 1999. The Brown Class of 2002 was just behind, posting a 29-10 four-year mark.

A finalist in 1999 for the Eddie Robinson Award, presented annually to the top coach in NCAA I-AA,

# Phil Estes - Head Coach



Estes guided 1999 Bears to their second-ever Ivy League Championship and first title since 1976, leading the Bears to a 9-1 record and 6-1 Ivy mark, and posting the most wins for a Brown team since the 1926 Iron Men (9-0-1). Estes' squad finished the season with a seven-game winning streak, capturing 15 of its last 16 games over two years, and finishing with a 25th place national ranking.

Brown's 1999 team also set six team and 12 individual records, including team marks for most points in a season (324), touchdown passes in a season (27), single-season passing completion percentage (66.2% - 469 of 310), single game pass completions (42 vs. Princeton), first downs in a season (252), and average gain per play (5.9). Estes was also instrumental in developing Perry '00, the 1999 lvy League Player of the Year, who finished his career as the finest passer in lvy League football history, walking away with 10 lvy League passing records and 18 Brown football records.

In his first season as head coach of the Bears, Brown finished with a 7-3 overall mark, winning its last six games, Brown's longest winning streak since 1949. The Bears also posted a 5-2 lvy League mark, good for second place in the lvy League standings, and the most lvy wins at Brown since 1987.

In 1998, Estes' Brown team defeated league champion Penn, 58-51, in the highest scoring game in Ivy League football history. In addition, Brown's 1998 offense established 25 team or individual records, and five Ivy League team or individual marks. Among the Brown records set were passing yards in a season (3,316), first downs (240), pass completions (292), touchdown passes (26), and passing yards in a game (483 vs. Penn).

Estes was Brown's highly successful recruiting coordinator from 1994 to 1997, coaching the Bears' receivers in 1997 after three years as running backs coach. He was instrumental in bringing many of the talented athletes into the program, who have been the

cornerstone of the program's success. One of Estes' protege's, Zach Burns '99, went on to become a first team Associated Press I-AA All-American, the first Brown player to ever earn AP first team honors. Burns also earned a berth in the Blue-Gray Senior All-Star game and was an ESPN/USA Today first team All-American.

As receivers coach in 1997, Estes helped develop Morey, the Special Teams Captain of the Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers, into the nation's premier wide receiver. After two solid seasons, Morey took a quantum leap into being named the Ivy League's 1997 Player of the Year. In 1997, Morey led the nation in receiving (143.4 yards a game) and set single game Brown records for yards (221 vs. Cornell) and TD receptions (3). He also shattered the Brown and Ivy League record books with 15 touchdown receptions, and 1,434 receiving yards, 6th best in NCAA I-AA history. In 1998, Morey became the first athlete in Brown history to have his number retired. He competed in the Hula Bowl, and finished his career with five Ivy League and 11 Brown individual records.

In three years as running backs coach, Estes helped guide Marquis Jessie '97,then Brown's all-time career rusher, to 910 yards in 1996, the second best rushing performance in Brown history. Jessie's 3,098 career yards was 6th best in Ivy League football history.

Estes arrived at Brown in 1994 after three highly successful years as the offensive coordinator at the University of New Hampshire. During his tenure at New Hampshire, Estes developed the Wildcats into an offensive power. His offense ranked in the top three in the Yankee Conference in total offense from 1991 to 1993. As offensive coordinator in 1991, Estes was instrumental in leading the Wildcats to their first ever appearance in the NCAA I-AA Playoffs and the Yankee Conference Championship.

Estes began his collegiate coaching career as offensive line coach at the University of New Hampshire in 1984 after a successful two-year stint at Concord (NH) High School. While at New Hampshire, Estes worked with former Brown coach Mark Whipple, who was offensive

coordinator for two years, from 1986-1987. Estes also developed several All-Americans at UNH, including first team Kodak All-American John Driscoll, who was drafted by the Buffalo Bills, and two-time All-American Barry Bourassa, who led the nation in all-purpose running in 1991.

Born in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Estes grew up in Laconia, NH. An offensive and defensive tackle at Laconia High School, Estes was team captain and Athlete of the Year as a senior. He is a member of the Laconia High School Hall of Fame. A 1980 graduate of the University of New Hampshire, Estes was a three-year starter and team captain for the Wildcats. He was a first team All-New England and Yankee Conference selection as a senior and played for the Wildcats' 1976 Yankee Conference Championship team.

He and his wife, Katie, reside in East Greenwich, Rhode Island with their two daughters, Meaghan and Kelly, and their son, Brett.

# Abbott Burrell

Assistant Head Coach Defensive Secondary Coach

Recognized as one of the outstanding coaches in the country, Assistant Head Coach and Secondary Coach Abbott Burrell begins his fifteenth season with the Brown coaching staff. Burrell, who now has three Ivy Championship rings, is also heavily involved in Brown's community relations program.



Burrell has done outstanding work with the Brown defensive secondary with his 2005 squad making 13 interceptions. He also coached All-American defensive back Jamie Gasparella '06, who made seven interceptions in 2005, and 10 career interceptions, seventh best in Brown football history.

Burrell has coached several positions while at Brown and was promoted to assistant head coach in 2002, while maintaining his duties as the defensive secondary coach. In 2001, his secondary unit led the lvy League in pass defense, allowing only 191.1 passing yards per game.

Burrell also coached at Brown from 1994-1996, working with the defensive secondary for two years and the outside linebackers for a season. He was an assistant coach at Bethune Cookman College in 1997 with responsibility for the defensive backs.

Burrell earned a B.A. in Sociology from the University of Connecticut in 1990 and was a fouryear letterwinner and team captain as a senior. He first came to Brown from Wesleyan University where he coached wide receivers and assisted on special teams from 1992-1993. He also served as

an assistant coach at Southern Connecticut State University, working with the defensive backs.

A native of Hamden, CT, Burrell attended Hamden High School. He played professional football for the French Professional Football League while also working as an assistant defensive backs and receivers coach.

He currently resides in Providence, Rhode Island.

# Michael Kelleher

Defensive Coordinator

Michael Kelleher, known as one of the outstanding defensive strategists in the east, is set to begin his ninth season as the defensive coordinator for the Bears. His defensive units have helped the Bears capture two Ivy League Championships (2005, 2008). In 2003, Kelleher was honored as



the New England Assistant Coach of the Year.

Kelleher's 2008 Ivy League Championship defense featured six All-Ivy selections. His defensive unit was the Ivy League's stingiest against the run, allowing a league best 77.1 yards per game on the ground, fourth best in the nation. Brown's defense also allowed the fewest rushing touchdowns (3) in the nation.

Kelleher's defense helped Brown to the Ivy League Championship in 2005, coaching five All-Ivy players, including three-time All-American and two-time Buck Buchanan Award Finalist Zak DeOssie, who was drafted by the New York Giants on the fourth round of the 2007 NFL Draft, and played a key role in the success of the New York Giants' Super Bowl Champion team.

A native New Englander, who grew up in West Springfield, Mass., Kelleher helped Brown's 2003 team to wins in four of its last five games. His 2003 defense ranked second in the Ivy, yielding 369.2 yards per game. In 2001, Kelleher implemented a new defensive system that allowed 26.1 points per game, down from 30.1 the previous year.

Brown also led the Ivy League in pass defense in 2001, allowing only 191.1 passing yards per game. Last year's team ranked third in the Ivy League in pass defense and fourth in scoring defense, allowing 22.9 points per game.

Kelleher's defense ranked second in the Ivy League in 2004, yielding 316.4 yards per game, in helping Brown to a 6-4 overall record and fourth place finish in the Ivy standings. His defensive unit allowed just 19.4 points per game and led the Ivy League in sacks (32).

Kelleher came to Brown after a four-year tenure at Columbia University. With the Lions, Kelleher served as linebackers coach and special teams coordinator.

Kelleher, a 1981 graduate of Boston University with a Bachelor of Science degree in rehabilitation counseling, was a four-year starter for the Terriers and a member of the 1980 Yankee Conference championship team. He was twice named First Team All-Conference and was the 1980 Defensive Player of the Year.

Following his playing career, Kelleher coached at Boston University for nine years, working as secondary coach and linebacker coach, as well as serving as recruiting coordinator for three years. From there, he became the defensive coordinator at the University of Rhode Island, where his 1990 defense was ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense.

Kelleher then worked in a similar capacity at Colgate, where his defense finished second in the Patriot League in scoring defense in 1993 and 1994 before a brief stint at Maine and his tenure at Columbia.

Kelleher currently resides in Boston, MA, with his wife, Betsy.




# Frank Sheehan

Offensive Coordinator Offensive Line Coach

Frank Sheehan begins his fourth season as offensive coordinator of the Bears, 9th season as offensive line coach, and his 13th season on college hill. He was previously Brown's recruiting coordinator.

On the way to the lvy Championship in 2008, Sheehan's offensive unit



players including two first-team All-Ivy tackles, Paul Jasinowski '10 and Shane Kelley '09, and allowed a league-best seven sacks all year, ranking sixth best in the nation, while passing 384 times.

Sheehan's 2007 offensive unit featured the nation's fourth-leading passing offense (310 yards per game), and the lvy League's top passing offense, total offense (424.2 yards per game) and scoring offense (31.2 points per game).

As offensive line coach, Sheehan completely rebuilt the offensive line in 2005 after graduating four starters. The result was an Outright Ivy League Championship, three All-Ivy players, and an offense that led the lvy League in scoring with 36.8 ppg (ranked 9th nationally), rushing offense (248.6 yards per game), total offense (409.2 yards per game) and surrendered a league-best 5 sacks (ranked 2nd nationally). The unit also blocked for national rushing leader Nick Hartigan (172.7 yards per game). Overall, Sheehan's offensive line blocked for Hartigan<sup>1</sup>s five Ivy League and 22 Brown records.

In 2003, Sheehan completely revamped Brown's offensive line, molding a young senior-less group, and guiding them to block for Nick Hartigan's school-record and nation-leading 1,498 yards on the ground, the fourth best rushing performance in Brown football history.

Under Sheehan's direction, the offensive line finished first in the league in pass offense 2001, and second in rushing offense in 2001 and 2004. His line cleared the way for Brown's leading rusher, Michael Malan, to run for 117.7 yards per game with a league-high 6.2 yards per carry. As the running backs coach in 2000, Sheehan coached Malan to a then record 1,213 yards rushing, including a then school-recordtying 90 points on the season.

Before he began his responsibilities with the offensive line in 2001, Sheehan coached the running backs

in 2000 and tight ends in 1999. Prior to that, he assisted the offensive line for two years.

In addition to his responsibilities with Brown's talented offensive line, Sheehan also handled the recruiting coordinator duties from 2000-2005, serving as liaison to admissions and financial aid as well as overseeing the staff's national recruiting efforts.

Sheehan, who now has three Ivy Championship rings as a coach at Brown, came to Brown from the University of New Haven, where he coached for two seasons as assistant offensive line and tight ends coach. At New Haven, he helped to design and implement all phases of the coaching plan for the offensive line and tight ends while also handling recruiting responsibilities.

A 1996 graduate of the University of New Haven with a Criminal Justice degree, Sheehan was a fouryear offensive lineman, starting his last three years at center. He was tri-captain his senior year, earning CoSIDA All-Northeast Region, All-ECAC and All-New England honors.

Sheehan and his wife Christina recently celebrated the birth of their first child Ryanne Elizabeth. They reside in Providence, Rhode Island.

### Joe Leslie Tight Ends

Joe Leslie begins his fifth season with the Brown coaching staff, coaching the Bears' tight ends, following two years (2005, 2006) as wide receivers coach. Leslie was also Brown's highly successful recruiting coordinator for two years. He came to Brown after working with the offensive



line at Dartmouth for the previous 11 years.

In the last two years, Leslie has coached Colin Cloherty '09 to become the top tight end in the lvy League, and a free agent signee of the Indiannapolis Colts.

Leslie helped develop an exciting group of wide receivers at Brown - Paul Raymond '08, Colin Cloherty '09, Buddy Farnham '10 and Bobby Sewall '10 – an outstanding group who all earned All-lvy honors in 2007.

A 1972 graduate of Dartmouth, the Tucson, Arizona native played for three straight Ivy League Championship teams for the Big Green from 1969-1971. In 1971, Leslie was an All-East offensive tackle and earned first team All-Ivy and All-new England honors.

Leslie began his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at Dartmouth in 1972, and followed that up with coaching stints at New Hampshire, Penn and Boston University. From 1976-82 he was an assistant coach at New Hampshire. He then became the offensive coordinator at Penn for the 1983-84 season, both Ivy titles for the Quakers. Leslie then spent two years at BU where he was offensive coordinator and coached the offensive line

Leslie holds two master's degrees, one in secondary school administration from Maine (1975), and a second in counseling from New Hampshire (1988).

# Neil McGrath

Defensive Line Coach

Neil McGrath enters his eighth season with the Bears as the Defensive Line Coach, and has developed the defensive front line to where it is considered among the best in the lvy League.

His 2008 defensive line helped the Bears allow just 77.1 yards per game,



fourth best in the nation, and first in the Ivy League. First team All-Ivy tackle David Howard and two-time second team All-Ivy defensive end James Develin helped the Bears to their second Ivy Championship in the last four years.

His 2005 Ivy Championship defensive line was led by All-American and All-Ivy defensive tackle Pat Curran with 10 tackles for a loss and four quarterback sacks as the Bears amassed 68 tackles for a loss and 28 sacks as a team. In 2004, he built a formidable group that helped lead the Ivy League in sacks, including the Ivy League leader in tackles for a loss, defensive end James Frazier.

McGrath came to Brown from the University of Massachusetts, where he was the defensive coordinator for the Minutemen under Head Coach Mark Whipple for two years. His defense at UMass ranked first in total defense in the Atlantic 10 during the 1999 season.

Prior to coaching at Massachusetts, McGrath worked at the University of Maine, where he spent five seasons (1995-1999) as defensive coordinator. He was instrumental in the drastic turnaround of Maine's defensive fortunes, as the Black Bears improved from 11th in the league in total defense in 1995 to fourth in McGrath's second season. In 1997, Maine led the Atlantic 10 in turnover margin (+12), including 19 interceptions. The Black Bear defense also held opponents to a league-low 29 percent on fourth-down conversions during the 1997 season. In 1998, Maine led the league in sacks.

Prior to his time at Maine, McGrath spent 11 years as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Boston University. He began as a part-time assistant in 1984, coaching outside linebackers and assisting with special teams. McGrath became a full-time assistant for the Terriers in 1988 and coached the defensive line, then added the responsibility of special teams coordinator in 1990. He also spent three seasons as Boston University's recruiting coordinator, and coached linebackers for one year (1992). The Terriers advanced to the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs three times while McGrath was at

Boston University, including his last two seasons in 1993 and 1994.

McGrath is a 1981 graduate of Boston University where he received a bachelor's degree in education. McGrath earned four letters as a member of the Terrier football team, where he played with Bears' defensive coordinator Mike Kelleher. He earned first team All-Yankee Conference honors at linebacker during his senior season in 1980, after leading Boston University to a record of 9-2 and the conference title. The Terriers posted an overall mark of 26-14-1 during McGrath's four years on the team, winning a pair of Yankee Conference championships.

A resident of Longmeadow, Mass., he and his wife, Kim, have three children, Clayton, a member of the Brown Class of 2011, Sam, a member of the Brown Class of 2012, and Hannah. Both boys play football at Brown.

Beginning his tenth season on the Bears' coaching staff, Paul Frisone will once again work with the outside linebackers. Frisone, who has been on the defensive side of the ball since his arrival as a defensive assistant in 2000, now has two lvy League Championships under his belt.



Frisone has received accolades for developing a young and inexperienced outside linebacker group, which played a key role in Brown's 2005 lvy League Championship.

Frisone came to Brown from Union College, where he was defensive line coach for three years. During his tenure at Union, the Dutchmen compiled a 22-7 record and were the 1999 ECAC Division III Champions. The 1999 team also featured the number-one ranked pass efficiency offense in the country, and the #2-ranked overall defense in the nation.

A 1993 graduate of Western New England College, Frisone earned a Bachelor's Degree in Government. He was a four-year letterwinner for the football team at defensive tackle, while also lettering in wrestling for two years.

A native of Schenectady, New York, Frisone and his wife, Tracy, reside in Fall River, Mass, with their newborn son, Samuel.

# **James Perry**

Quarterbacks/Recruiting Coordinator

James Perry '00, the top passer in Ivy League Football history and former Ivy League Player of the Year, returned to his alma mater in 2007 to coach the quarterbacks and receivers at Brown. Perry recently became Brown's recruiting coordinator in addition to his quarterback coaching duties.



In two years with the Bears' coaching staff, Perry helped the Bears win an Ivy League title, and transform Bears' quarterback Michael Dougherty '09 into one of the top quarterbacks in Ivy League football history. Dougherty wrapped up his Brown career with 487 career completions, 8th best in lvy football history, and 5,763 career passing yards, 11th best in the lvy record book. In addition, Dougherty's 5,914 career yards in total offense rank 14th in the lvy record book, while his 38 career TD passes are 13th in Ivy history. He also finished 17th in the lvy record book in completion percentage (.583), completing 487 of 835 career passes.

At Brown, Perry led the Bears to the Ivy League Championship in 1999, and holds virtually every school and lvy League passing record, including passing yards in a season (3,255) and career (9,294), completions in a season (309) and career (789), touchdown passes in a game (6) and career (74), and total offense in a career (9,236). He threw for over 400 yards in a game six times during his career.

He was a Walter Payton Award Finalist as a senior and won the Bulger Lowe Award as the Outstanding Offensive Player in New England. A three-time first team All-Ivy selection, Perry was also named the New England Football Writers Gold Helmet of the Year Award recipient. He was named the lvy League Player of the Year as a senior in 1999 when he threw for 3,255 yards and 27 touchdowns and led the school to its second league title in school history. Following his college career, he spent the 2001 season in NFL Europe and the Arena Football League.

A 2000 graduate of Brown with a Bachelor of Science degree, Perry went on to earn a Master's degree in Education Policy & Leadership from the University of Maryland in 2006.

Perry comes to Brown from the University of Delaware, where he coached the running backs for the 2006 season. The Blue Hens offense flourished with Perry's assistance, ranking in the top five in the

conference and among the NCAA I-AA leaders in passing offense total offense, and scoring offense

As a graduate assistant with the offense in 2004 and 2005 at the University of Maryland, Perry helped lead the Terrapins to consecutive 5-6 seasons under head coach Ralph Friedgen. While at Maryland, his duties included breaking down opponent game film, working with the defensive scout team, and assisting with the Terrapin offensive line.

A native of Andover, Massachusetts, Perry began his coaching career as assistant quarterbacks and wide receivers coach at Dartmouth in 2001 and served as quarterbacks coach at the University of San Diego in 2002. He served as guarterbacks coach and recruiting coordinator at NCAA Division III power Williams College in Williamstown, MA from 2002-03, and served as offensive coordinator there in 2004 before moving on to Maryland later that same season.

He and his wife, Abby, reside in Providence, Rhode Island, with their son, Samuel Ernest.



# Dates to Remember



- **November 13, 1878 -** Brown plays its first game of intercollegiate football, traveling to Amherst to do battle with the Lord Jeffs.
- **October 8,1892** Brown plays its first on-campus game, beating WPI 8-4 on Lincoln Field.
- **November 29, 1894 -** The first Thanksgiving Day game in Brown's history, a 20-4 victory over MIT at Adelaide Park, Providence.
- **1894 Season** Paced by its first set of touchdown twins, William Burr Hopkins and Charles D. Millard, Brown finishes the season 10-4 and is ranked fifth in the nation.
- **1896 Season** Brown may not have had the best team in the country, but it did have the richest manager John D. Rockefeller, Jr. '97.
- **November 6, 1898 -** Willie Richardson kicks the first Brown field goal in 16-5 victory over the Newton A.C.
- October 4, 1899 At its new home on Camp Street, Brown defeats Tufts 6-0. Andrews Field was named for Brown President Benjamin Andrews, and remained Brown's football home until the opening of Brown Field in 1925.
- November 30, 1899 In its first intersectional game, Brown meets the University of Chicago at Marshall Field on Thanksgiving Day.

**November 25, 1905** - Brown's first live bear, Helen, appeared as a Brown mascot at the Dartmouth game in Springfield, MA.

#### 2008 Ivy League Champions

- September 29, 1906 The forward pass was legalized for the 1906 season and QB Vic Schwartz throws Brown's first pass in the opener against New Hampshire.
- **November 24, 1906** Halfback Johnny Mahew scores twice on spectacular runs in a 23-0 victory over Dartmouth and becomes the first Brown player named to Walter Camp's All-America first team.
- September 26, 1908 QB Bill Sprackling completes first Brown TD pass, a 40-yarder to end Spike Dennie vs. New Hampshire.
- **November 5, 1910** Sprackling has the greatest day of any Brown back in leading Brown to its first victory over Yale, 21-0. He kicked three field goals and accounted for 456 yards.
- January 1, 1916 Brown meets Washington State in the first official Tournament of Roses game in Pasadena, California.
- **November 18, 1916** Fritz Pollard has two TD's and gains 140 yards rushing in leading Brown to its first victory over Harvard, 21-0. He later earned first team All-America honors from Walter Camp.
- September 26, 1925 Brown Field opens, and Brown wins, 33-0, over Rhode Island. The stadium was later dedicated at the Yale game before 27,000. A second dedication was held during the Harvard game.
- **October 23, 1926 -** The Brown Iron Men team is born as 11 starters play the full 60 minutes in a 7-0 victory over Yale at the Yale Bowl.
- **November 25, 1926** Close to 30,000 see Brown end the season undefeated after battling Colgate to a 10-10 tie on Thanksgiving Day morning at Brown Field.
- **1932 Season** Brown's Cinderella team meets a previously undefeated opponent for seven straight weeks. The Bears lost their final game on Thanksgiving morning to undefeated, untied and unscored upon Colgate before 33,000, the largest home crowd in Brown history.

- **November 24, 1938** In a Turkey Day thriller at Baker Field, Irving "Shine" Hall scores 27 points in leading Brown to a 36-27 victory over Columbia and its star, Sid Luckman.
- **October 10, 1942** Junior Halfback Bob Margarita sets an all-time Brown record with 233 yards rushing in 28-21 victory over Columbia.
- **November 24, 1949** Trailing 26-7 with 17 minutes left, Brown rallies to crush Colgate, 41-26, on Thanksgiving morning via the running and passing of Joe Paterno.
- **October 4, 1958** With fullback Paul Choquette rushing for 113 yards, Brown beats a strong Yale team, 35-29.

- **November 21, 1964 -** Brown limits Columbia and its All-American quarterback Archie Roberts to five yards in total offense to defeat the Lions 7-0 and complete a 5-4 season.
- **October 13, 1973** Using rollout quarterback Dennis Coleman the first half and passing quarterback Pete Beatrice after intermission, Brown befuddles Yale, 34-25, for coach John Anderson's first victory.
- **November, 1976 -** Brown defeats Harvard, Dartmouth, and Columbia in the final three games to gain a share of its first Ivy League title.
- **November 5, 1977 -** Ruben Chapa's 32yard field goal with 9 seconds left gives Brown a 13-10 victory over Dartmouth, its first win in Hanover since 1928.
- 1978 Season Centennial Anniversary.
- **November 4, 1978** Rick Villella snares a two-point conversion pass from Mark Whipple in the final minutes as Brown comes from behind to nip Harvard, 31-30, in Cambridge.

November 5, 1983

- The Bears battle national power Penn State before a Brown record crowd of 75,000.

with three interceptions for 216 yards and two TD's. The 27-14 victory over Yale marked John Rosenberg's debut as head coach.

- September 17, 1988 Brown kicks off the Ivy League's National Television package on ESPN at home against Yale.
- **November 20, 1993** Freshman Marquis Jessie sets a single game rushing record by running for 237 yards in 28-23 win over Columbia. He later becomes the first freshman in Ivy League football history to earn All-Ivy honors.
- **December 21, 1993** Mark Whipple '79 returns to Brown as its 18th head football coach.
- **November 19, 1994 -** In its 1,000<sup>th</sup> game, Brown sets an NCAA Division 1AA record by scoring 56 second half points as the Bears rally from a 24-3 halftime deficit to defeat Columbia 59-27 in New York City.
- **November 22, 1997** Sean Morey catches 10 passes for 152 yards and three touchdowns vs. Columbia and sets Ivy League records for single season receiving yards (1,434), touchdowns in a season (15), touchdowns in a career (29), and career reception yards (2,827).
- **December 18, 1997 -** Phil Estes is named Brown's 19th head football coach.
- **October 24, 1998 -** The 109 Points scored in Brown's 58-51 win over Penn is the most points ever scored in an Ivy League game. The two teams combined for 58 fourth quarter points, an NCAA record.

- September 18, 1999 Senior James Perry, the Ivy League's all-time career passer, threw a 14 yard touchdown pass to sophomore David Brookman with 14 seconds remaining, and senior Rob Scholl smashed his way into the end zone for a two point conversion following a blocked extra point, to lead Brown to a 25-24 victory over Yale in New Haven. Brown would go on to share the Ivy League Championship with a 9-1 overall record and 6-1 Ivy mark.
- **November 18, 2000** Stephen Campbell sets an NCAA, I-AA record with 120 career receptions, after making 14 catches against Columbia.
- **October 15, 2003** Brown equals three NCAA I-AA records when quarterback Kyle Slager completes 20 consecutive passes against Rhode Island, tying the mark for consecutive completions in a half and a game, and Chas Gessner makes 24 catches, matching the NCAA record for receptions in a game.
- **November 22, 2003** Sophomore runningback Nick Hartigan rushes for 201 yards against Columbia to establish a new Ivy League sophomore singleseason rushing record with 1,498 yards, eclipsing the previous mark of 1,409 yards by Cornell's Ed Marinaro in 1969. Hartigan's 149.8 yards per game led the nation.
- **November 19, 2005** Brown wins its first outright Ivy League Championship with a 52-21 victory over Columbia before a national television audience at Wein Stadium in New York City. Nick Hartigan sets three Ivy League records and 22 Brown records in the victory before a raucous Brown crowd, which packed the visitors stands.
- **November 22, 2008** Brown's Class of 2009 became the first class in Brown football history to win two Ivy League Championships, beating Columbia 41-10, at Brown Stadium for the Ivy title.

The Brown Athletic Department in conjunction with the Brown Football Association and the Brown Sports Foundation, announced its 125th Anniversary Football Team on November 1, 2003 recognizing the greatest 50 players in Brown football.

The announcement of the team came at a gala dinner of more that 680 at the Westin Hotel in Providence, hosted by ESPN's Chris Berman '77, the former radio voice of Brown Football "Bruins." More than 1,500 alumni and fans voted for the 125th Anniversary team via the internet and mail-in ballots.

# Offense Quarterbacks (2)

- **Robert Hall '66** Bulger Lowe Award winner as the Outstanding Player in New England; first team All-lvy; All-American selection in 1965; said coach JJ McLaughry in 1965, "I'd have to say he's the best offensive player I've seen at Brown. And that goes back to 1926."
- James Perry '00 Ivy League Player of the Year; Holds 10 Ivy League passing records, including the career passing mark of 9,294 yards; Bulger Lowe Award winner as the Outstanding Player in New England; three-time first team All-Ivy; NE Sportswriters Gold Helmet of the Year.

# National Hall of Famers

## John W. Heisman 1891

A name synonymous with quality football, John William Heisman attended Brown from 1887 to 1889 and became one of the leading coaches and a dominant personality in intercollegiate football during the ensuing 45 years until his death in 1936. After obtaining his law degree from the University of Pennsylvania, he launched a football coaching career at Oberlin College that extended through a long series of successes at Akron, Alabama Poly, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Penn, Washington and Jefferson, and Rice. He did much to "open up" the game by use of the forward pass and the shifting line. At Georgia Tech, where he coached for 16 years, his teams of 1915-16-17 won 25 straight and rolled up 1,129 points to their opponents' 61. After retiring from coaching, he became Physical Director of the Downtown Athletic Club of New York and was one of the founders and first president of the Touchdown Club. In his honor, the downtown A.C. established the Heisman Trophy, which is presented annually to the outstanding collegiate football player in the nation. Born in Cleveland, Oct. 23, 1869, he died on Oct. 3, 1936.

### De Ormond "Tuss" McLaughry

A 55-year association with football as player, coach and administrator was duly acknowledged in December, 1962, when Tuss McLaughry was inducted into the National Football Foundation's Hall of Fame. From the day he played his first football game at Sharon, PA, High School in 1907, Tuss and football were inseparable, except for distinguished service in World War II. A standout player at Michigan State and Westminster, he began his coaching career at the latter college in 1915. He coached four years at Amherst, 1922-25, and his last team there was the highest scoring team in the history of the Little Three. He then moved to Brown, where he guided the famed Iron Men of 1926 to the only undefeated season in the school's history. His 1928 and 1932 teams lost only one game. Before leaving Brown for Dartmouth in 1941, he had the pleasure of coaching his son, John. Later at Dartmouth another son, Bob, played for him. His 1948 and 1949 teams were the first in Dartmouth's history to win six major games. He coached East squads in the San Francisco Shrine game four times, the New York Giants/ College All-Star Game in 1940 and the Chicago All-Star Game in 1947. After retiring from coaching in 1954, Tuss continued to serve the American Football Coaches Association as secretarytreasurer. He died in 1975.

### Frederick Douglass "Fritz" Pollard '19


Probably the greatest player ever to perform for Brown and one of the greatest black players ever to perform in the college ranks, Fritz Pollard was the star of Brown's 1915 team which played in the first official Rose Bowl game (1916), and the '16 team which compiled an 8-1 record and ranks among the University's best. Walter Camp, whose All-American selections are regarded as the last word for the era he covered, ranked Pollard as "one of the greatest runners these eyes have ever seen." In 1916 he scored all three touchdowns as Brown handed Yale its lone defeat of the season, 21-6, and he scored two and set up the other in the 21-0 victory against Harvard. Born in Chicago January 27, 1894, Pollard died May 11, 1986.

In 2004, Brown University and the Black Coaches Association joined together to co-sponsor an annual award for the male college coach of the year, to be named in Pollard's honor. The BCA will select the male Coach of the Year and will present the Fritz Pollard Award at its annual awards banquet.

He was elected into the National Football Foundation College Hall of Fame in 1954 and the Profesional Football Hall of Fame in 2005.

# National Hall of Famers



### Edward North Robinson 1896

If any man deserves recognition as "the father of Brown football," it is Edward North Robinson. His influence spans more than a guarter of a century ---from 1892 when he entered Brown and helped put the game on a sound basis as an undergraduate, to 1925 when he wound up an illustrious coaching career that covered 24 seasons at his alma mater. He won nine letters in his playing days, four in football. Robinson is credited with helping the grid program take root when baseball was THE sport at Brown. He served three separate terms as head coach, the last covering 16 years, and won 140 games against 82 losses and 12 ties at a time when Eastern football was undisputedly the nation's best, and Brown was often called upon to meet the top grid powers with undermanned forces.

Born in Lynn, MA, on October 15, 1873, he died on March 10, 1945. In 1943, Robinson's friends created the Edward North Robinson collection of Brown Athletics, which is housed in the archives of the John Hay Library. His coaching record at Brown follows:

### William Earl Sprackling '12

Brown's only three-time All-American, the 150-pound Sprackling is rated by many as the finest all-around football player in the school's history. As a guarterback he could beat a team in many ways. One of the game's most successful pioneers with the forward pass, he threw 10 touchdown aerials, a figure exceeded only seven times by Bruin passers since 1911. In addition, he was a brilliant runner, a heady field general and an adept field-goal kicker. He kicked three field goals against Yale in 1910. He owns the Brown record for most yards gained on kickoff returns in a single game with 147 against the Carlisle Indians in 1909. His three Brown teams won 21 games, lost 8 and tied 2. The Cleveland, Ohio native was selected on Walter Camp's All-American teams in 1909-10-11 and in 1964 became the sixth man connected with Brown football to be elected to the National Hall of Fame. Born in Cleveland, Ohio on September 6, 1890, he died on March 27, 1980.

## W. Wallace Wade '17

A member of the 1915 Brown team that played Washington State in the first Rose Bowl game on January 1, 1916, Wally Wade earned a place among the great coaches of American intercollegiate football during an illustrious career that spanned 40 years. After serving his apprenticeship as a high school coach and an assistant at Vanderbilt, he took over the head coaching reins at Alabama in 1923 and built the Crimson Tide into a major football power, winning 61 of 74 games and taking three of his teams to the Rose Bowl, and compiled a record of 110 victories, 36 losses and 10 ties through 1950, when he retired to become the Commissioner of the Southern Conference. Wally made the cover of Time Magazine on Oct. 25, 1937, and the stadium at Duke

was named in his honor on Sept. 30, 1967. In addition to his achievements in the field of coaching, he distinguished himself in service during two World Wars. He interrupted his tenure at Duke at the age of 53 to serve as a lieutenant colonel in the artillery during World War II, taking part in several major battles in the European Theatre. Wally was born in Trenton, Tennessee on June 15, 1892. He died Oct. 6, 1986 at the age of 94.

## Charles A. "Rip" Engle

The latest member of Brown football inducted into the Hall of Fame is Charles "Rip" Engle, head coach of the Bear gridiron teams from 1944 through 1949, and then head mentor at Penn State until his retirement in 1966. Engle was inducted January, 1973. Recognized as one of the top coaches in his profession, Engle guided Brown to a 28-20-4 record in six years, including marks of 7-2-0 and 8-1-0 his final two seasons. His success at Penn State, where he compiled a 104-48-4 record, was amazing. He guided Penn State to post-season Bowl appearances almost every season, or so it seemed, and he coached in all-star games too numerous to mention. Engle learned his football under the old master, Dick Harlow, while at Western Maryland. He graduated in 1930 and moved into the high school ranks, where he coached at Waynesboro High (Pennsylvania) for 11 years. He joined the Bear staff in 1942 as an assistant to Neil "Skip" Stahley and when the latter entered the Navy, Engle was appointed head coach. Engle passed away in 1983.

# The Paterno Legacy



Legendary Penn State football coach Joe Paterno, Brown Class of 1950, impacted Brown University long before he began his coaching career for the Nittany Lions. A standout quarterback and defensive back for the Bears, Paterno completed his career on College Hill as one of the greatest in Brown football history and went on Penn State to become a nationally renowned coach, educator, leader, philanthropist and humanitarian.

#### Paterno's Brown Career

Under the tutelage of head coach Rip Engle, Paterno blossomed into the heady quarterback of the Bears football team that went 8-1 and was an Eastern powerhouses in 1949.

Legendary sportswriter Stanly Woodward once described Paterno as a quarterback, "who can't run, can't pass – just thinks and wins."

<sup>44</sup>The best four years of my life were here at Brown," said Paterno at the 1990 Celebration of Brown's 1949 team. "I've been involved with kids who won national championships in football... none of it has meant as much to me as the Colgate game, the Princeton game in '48, the Harvard game in '49. We all did it together. We all depended on each other...we trusted each other...We grew up together. We gave something to Brown, Brown gave something to us, and we gave something to each other. Brown is a special place-I really believe that. "" -Joe Paterno

In addition to his role in the rushing and passing offenses, Paterno also returned punts and kickoffs, posting career averages of 8.8 and 20.1 yards, respectively. He had a 69-yard punt return for a touchdown against Holy Cross in 1949. An heady defensive back, Paterno still holds the Brown career interception record (14),

Brown paid homage to its skinny exquarterback in 1993 when it named one of its major athletic awards in his honor. The coach attended the All-Sports Banquet in Providence to present the first "Joe Paterno Outstanding Male Freshman Athlete Award." He is also a member of the Brown Athletics Hall of Fame and was named to Brown's 125th Anniversary All-Time team at defensive back.

After his senior football season, Paterno took an offer from Engle to work on a part-time basis with the Brown quarterbacks while awaiting graduation. Shortly after, Engle was named the head coach at Penn State and Paterno joined him as an assistant coach, "for just a few years."

### Paterno At Penn State

His 16 years as an assistant coach and 43 years as head coach at Penn State spans the administrations of 12 U.S. Presidents. Among his accomplishments:

- Led teams to 22 bowl victories, a college football coaching record.
- Became the only coach to win the New Year's Day games – the Rose, Sugar, Cotton, Fiesta and Orange Bowls.
- Captured National Championships in 1982 and 1986, and had teams go undefeated, but uncrowned, in 1968, 1969, 1973 and 1994.
- Posted 11 or more victories in 14 seasons.
- Won Coach-of-the-Year honors an unprecedented five times in balloting by the American Football Coaches Association
- Selected by the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame as the first active coach to ever receive its "Distinguished American" award.
- Appeared on the cover of Sports Illustrated as its 1986 Sportsman of the Year.
- Coached players who have won all of the major college awards – Heisman, Maxwell, Lombardi, O'Brien, Outland and Biletnikoff.
- Watched more than 300 of his ex-Lions play in the NFL, including 30 who were first-round draft choices.
- Paterno and his wife, Sue, gave Penn State \$3.5 million to endow faculty positions and scholarships in 1988, and to support two building projects. He has also been a major contributor and campaign chair for the expansion of libraries on the Penn State campus.
- Witnessed the payoff on his emphasis on graduating and achieving academic goals through the selection of 26 first-team Academic All-Americans, 15 Hall of Fame Scholar Athletes and 18 NCAA postgraduate scholarship winners.
- Quickest coach to reach the 200-win (246 games) and 300-win (380 games) plateau.
- In 2001, passed Paul "Bear" Bryant to become the leader in career wins by a major college coach.
- Selected for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2006.

#### Brown in First Rose Bowl 1916

Since the late 1940's, Rose Bowl participants have been representatives of the Pacific 10 and Big Ten Conferences. It has not always been so, however. It was under Edward North Robinson, class of 1896, and for many years head coach, that Brown journeyed westward in 1915 to play in the first annual Tournament of Roses game at Pasadena, California.

The Bruins were chosen as the Eastern representatives after posting a 5-3-1 mark. Those losses came via a 7-0 setback to Amherst and 6-0 loss to Syracuse, a 16-7 loss to Harvard and a scoreless game with Trinity. Brown outscored its opponents 167-32 that year, defeating URI, 38-0, Williams, 33-0, Vermont, 46-0, Yale, 3-0 and much heralded Carlisle, 39-3.

In that inaugural game, played January 1, 1916, Brown, with its brilliant Fritz Pollard, was opposed by the powerful team of

Washington State. It came up mud on that day memorialized in Brown gridiron history and Pollard was unable to cut loose as he had been accustomed to do on Eastern gridirons. WSU won, 14-0, but to Brown always will belong the distinction of having been the first Eastern team to play in the Rose Bowl.

#### The 1926 Iron Men of Brown

The only undefeated team in Brown history, the 1926 team earned even greater fame as the "Iron Men," socalled because the starting 11 played 60 minutes without substitution on consecutive weeks against Yale and Dartmouth, and well into the fourth quarter against Harvard two weeks later. They lost their chance for an undefeated-untied season in the last game when Colgate earned a 10-10 deadlock. The team was ranked among the top nationally. Its members were Captain Hal Broda and Thurston Towle, ends; Ed Kevorkian and Paul Hodge, tackles; Lou Farber and Orland Smith, guards; Charles Consodine, center; Red Randall, quarterback; Dave Mishel and Ed Lawrence, halfbacks; and Al Cornsweet, fullback.



#### Bruno – Brown's Mascot

The birthdate of the Brown Bear is January 20, 1904, when he was introduced to the University by Senator Theodore Francis Green, Class of 1887.

"The Brown Bear is truly American and, most important of all, he embodies and suggests those qualities we want to emphasize," the Senator wrote. "While somewhat unsociable, he is good natured and clean. While courageous and ready to fight, he does not look for trouble for its own sake, nor is he blood thirsty. He is not one of a herd but acts independently. He is intelligent and capable of being educated (if caught young enough!). Remember, an athlete can make Phi Beta Kappa. Furthermore, the Bear's color is brown; and its name is Bruno."

Live bear mascots appeared on the sidelines at Brown games for six decades. They were provided to the University by local animal farms and zoos, and their care and feeding were entrusted to the Brown Key Organization. The live bear mascot was replaced by a costumed bear in 1963.

At Brown's 1922 Commencement a campaign was begun to create a bronze bear statue. A slogan quickly emerged; "Put a Hair on the Bear." The Bronze Bruno Committee selected Eli Harvey, famous animal sculptor from New York City to create the statue. The model was cast at the Gorham Manufacturing Company foundry. After long debate about location, during which the statue languished at Gorham, Bronze Bruno was placed in

front of the new Brown Gymnasium (later named Marvel Gym). After Marvel's closing in 1989, and again after intense debate, the statue was moved to the College Green in 1992.

#### The Ivy Champs of 2008

The Brown Class of 2009 came into the 2008 season looking to become the first class in Brown football history to earn two Ivy League Championships. But the talented upperclassmen had never beaten Harvard and knew its opening game against the Crimson might dictate the success of the squad.

The Bears and Crimson played a thrilling game in a driving rainstorm at Brown Stadium, with Brown pulling out a 24-22 victory over Harvard. Brown's defense provided the theatrics in the game's waning moments, halting Harvard's two-point conversion attempt by a full yard to preserve the victory.

Solid wins over Princeton and Cornell gave the 3-0 Brown its best start ever, setting up a showdown with unbeaten Penn at Franklin Field before a national television audience on the Versus Network. Facing the nation's top defense that had allowed just 13 points per game, Brown's high scoring offense wasn't fazed, exploding for 34 points in a 34-27 victory over the Quakers.

Brown's bid for a perfect Ivy League season was derailed by Yale, 13-3, at Brown Stadium, but the Bears knew that wins over Dartmouth and Columbia in the upcoming weeks would assure them of the Ivy title.

Coach Phil Estes' Brown football team entered Memorial Field at the start of its game against Dartmouth with a fierce determination to take care of business. The first place Bears needed wins in both of their last two games to be

assured at least a share of the Ivy League title, and had struggled in recent years against the Big Green in Hanover. Brown scored on its first four offensive possessions and intercepting a pass for a touchdown to cruise to a 45-16 win over the Big Green.


Playing in sub-freezing temperatures on the frozen tundra at Brown Stadium, Brown played like a champion and came away with a 41-10 victory over Columbia and the Ivy League Championship before a Brown Stadium crowd of 7,865, earning Brown's third Ivy title in the last 10 years, and fourth ever league championship.

#### The Ivy Champions of 2005

In the spring of 2005, Bears' head coach Phil Estes passed out a small card to all of his players with the words "Win It Outright" on one side and Brown's 2005 schedule on the other. He told his team to keep the card close and never forget the team's goal of an outright lvy title.

Call it a premonition. Call it confidence. Whatever you call it, Estes' choice of the theme, "Win It Outright," made him a prophet of great things to come for the Brown football team.

The Bears hit a bump in the road in their first lvy game against Harvard, outplaying the Crimson for over 59 minutes, before falling in double overtime, 38-35, in Cambridge. Estes forcefully told the team after the game that the season wasn't over and that there was a lot of football to be played. Brown's dreams could come through if the team would stick together. What happened in Brown's last eight games would determine its fate. But the Bears needed a little help along the way.

Brown reeled off consecutive Ivy wins over Princeton at home, at Cornell, Penn at Brown Stadium and at Yale, before clinching a share of the Ivy Championship with a victory over Dartmouth in Providence to go a game up in the Ivy standings.

Needing a win over Columbia for its first outright Ivy title, the Bears dominated the Lions in New York City for a 52-21 victory. All 19 Brown seniors - Noori Abdul-Ghani, Efren Blackledge, Carson Brennan, Greg Burlin, Rashad Collins. Mickey Cooper, Tim Cotter, Pat Curran, James Frazier, Jamie Gasparella. Gene Hamlin, Nick Hartigan, Matt Hostetler, Alex Jury, John Kazanovicz, Jarrett Schreck, Steven Storrs, Max Tornatore, David Turner started the game for the Bears.

In the game's waning moments, the coaches were dowsed in Gatorade, and the Brown faithful stormed the field in a wild celebration at game's end. The presentation of the lvy trophy took place at the center of the field in front of a national television audience on the YES Network. Family, friends, alumni and fans joined the Brown team in celebrating the title. It seemed as though everyone in attendance had a photo taken with the lvy trophy, forever preserving a piece of history – the outright lvy title.

#### The Ivy Champions of 1999

As the clocked ticked down on Brown's 1999 football season, a group of Brown players doused head football coach Phil Estes with a bucket of Gatorade, signaling that the game was over and Brown had captured the lvy League Football Championship with a 23-6 victory over Columbia. Brown's lvy title was its second ever, having captured the championship in 1976.

The victory capped a magical season that saw Brown post a 9-1 overall record, the most wins since the 1926 Iron Men (9-0-1). The Bears finished the season with a seven-game winning streak, capturing 15 of their last 16 games over two years. Brown shared the lvy title with Yale, a last-second winner over Harvard, with 6-1 lvy League records. Brown, who finished the season ranked 25th in the nation, defeated Yale, 25-24 on the opening day of the season.

Brown's Class of 2000 ended their career as the most successful class in the last century, compiling a four-year 28-12 record, besting the 27 wins for Brown teams from 1976-1979.

It also marked the end of the career of senior quarterback James Perry, who finished his career as the finest passer in Ivy League football history, walking away with 10 Ivy League passing records and 18 Brown football records.

The end of the game set off a wild celebration, with the partisan Brown crowd storming the field, tearing down the goal posts on the Elmgrove Avenue end of the field. The goal posts' uprights would later be seen making their way down Tabor Avenue and onto the Brown campus.

#### The Ivy Champions of 1976

For 50 years, Brown fans had heralded the Iron Men of 1926. But in 1976, there was another celebration as Brown won a share of the Ivy League title (with Yale) for the first time ever. A 28-17 victory over Columbia on the final day of the season clinched the title for the Bruins. Only a 7-6 loss to Penn stood in the way of a perfect season.

Ranked throughout the season as one of the top defensive teams in the nation, Brown's defensive unit was a major factor in early wins over Yale, Rhode Island and Princeton. Linebacker Scott Nelson led the defensive unit with a season high 93 tackles as Brown held its opponents to 102 points for he season.

Coach John Anderson's offense came on strong and sparked Brown to an 8-1 overall record and a 6-1 lvy League slate. The offense broke eight Brown team season marks with quarterback Paul Michelko setting two game records and split end Bob Farnham surpassing two career highs.



#### 2008 Ivy League Champions

The Brown Football Family lost four of its former players during the terrorist attacks that struck the World Trade Center and the Pentagon on September 11<sup>th</sup> - David Laychak, class of 1983, Ray Rocha, class of 1995, Paul Sloan, class of 1997, and Charles Margiotta, class of 1979. The families of David Laychak, Ray Rocha, Paul Sloan and Charles Margiotta were presented with a framed uniform at halftime ceremonies of Brown's 2001 game against Dartmouth at Brown Stadium.

**David Laychak** played defensive back at Brown, and graduated in 1983. He majored in Organizational Behavior and Management. David lived in Manasas, Virginia, and was employed as a civilian budget analyst for the US Army Information Systems, working at the Pentagon.

**Charles Margiotta**, Brown Class of 1979, was a New York City firefighter who was not on duty on September 11th, but rushed to the scene anyway to try to help save lives. Tragically, he lost his own life in the line of duty. He was inducted into the Brown Athletics Hall of Fame along with the entire 1976 Brown Ivy League Champion football team.

**Ray Rocha** played wide receiver at Brown and graduated in 1995, majoring in Business Economics. He was a member of Delta Tau Fraternity, and later became a BASC Alumni Interviewer for Brown. Ray lived in Malden, Mass. before moving to New York City, where he worked for Cantor Fitzgerald in the World Trade Center

**Paul Sloan** played on Brown's offensive line and graduated in 1997, majoring in History. He was a member of Delta Tau Fraternity at Brown. Originally from Novato, California, Paul lived in New York City, where he worked for Keefe, Bruyet & Wood, Inc., at the World Trade Center.





The bell was cast at Boston's Blake Bell Company in 1890 and hung in the tower of the Gorham Manufacturing Company in Providence. It was dedicated on September 17, 1994, prior to the Yale football game. The dedication plaque reads, "Presented by Boston alumni and the Brown Football Association in recognition of all who support Brown football and its quest for victory." The victory Bell is rung to celebrate every Brown score and victory.


