PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The new District 9 Neighborhood City Hall, a LEED Silver building, located on Central Avenue was designed by Paul Murdoch Architects with landscape architecture by Pamela Burton & Company. The design incorporates the sustainable technologies of solar power, rainwater harvesting, green roof, green wall/facade and native plants into an urban site.

Simon Patucha, Principal Designer with the Los Angeles Department of City Planning Urban Design Studio, will present "Changing Urban Infrastructure and Creating Great Green Streets" and answer questions about Los Angeles' urban, green initiatives. Architects Paul and Milena Murdoch of Paul Murdoch Architects will discuss design programming and inspiration and Stephanie Psomas of Pamela Burton and Company will talk about the landscape architecture programming and design implementation. The designers will then lead walking tours of the site and answer questions.

9th District Councilwoman Jan Perry is the Chair of the Energy and Environment Committee and is widely credited with passage of Proposition O to clean Los Angeles water. The Augustus Hawkins Wetland is one of Perry's most inspiring initiatives. The nation's first created wetland in a highly urban area is part of Augustus Hawkins Park, and Perry has also proposed a 19.5 million dollar, 9-acre South Los Angeles Wetlands Park that will simultaneously improve water quality and provide much-needed park and recreation space to the South Los Angeles community.

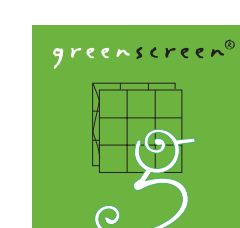

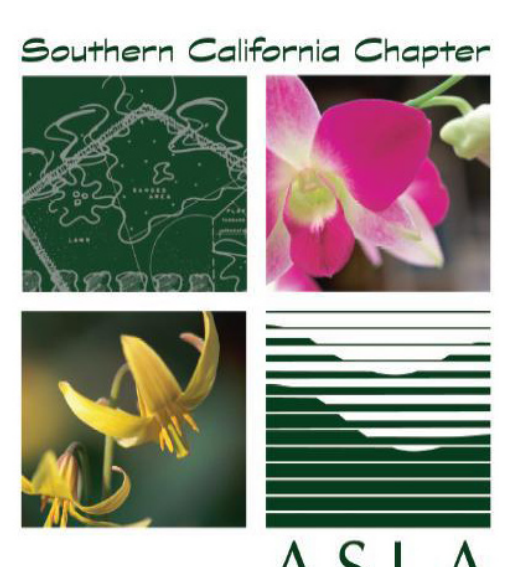
