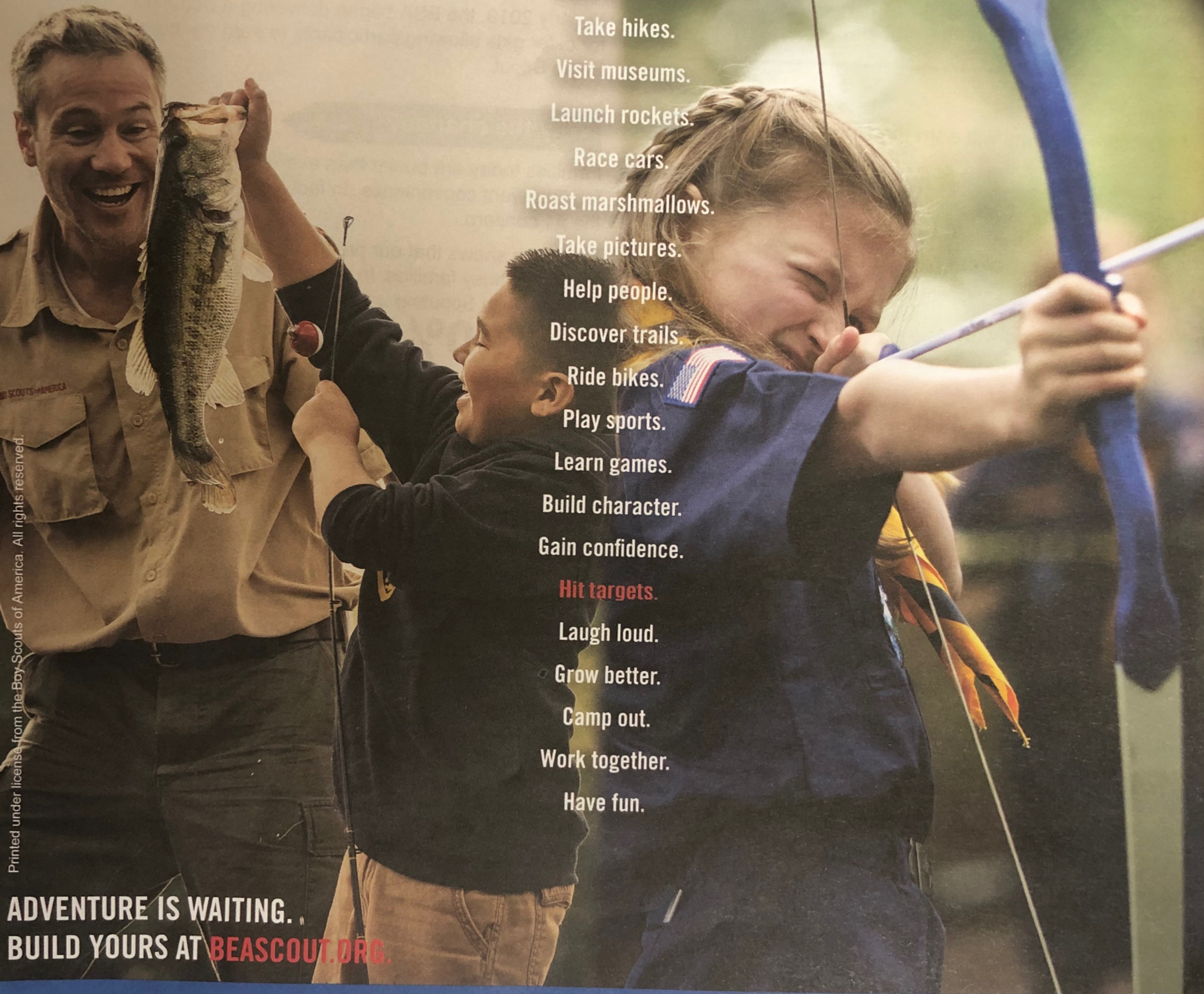

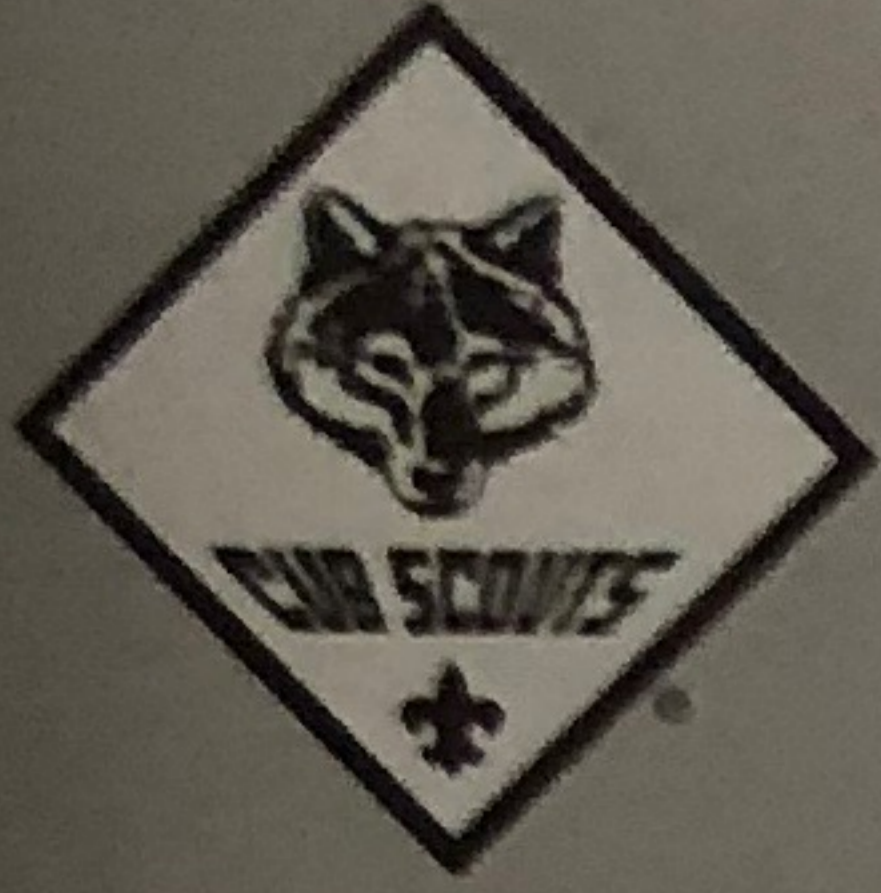

Bobcat

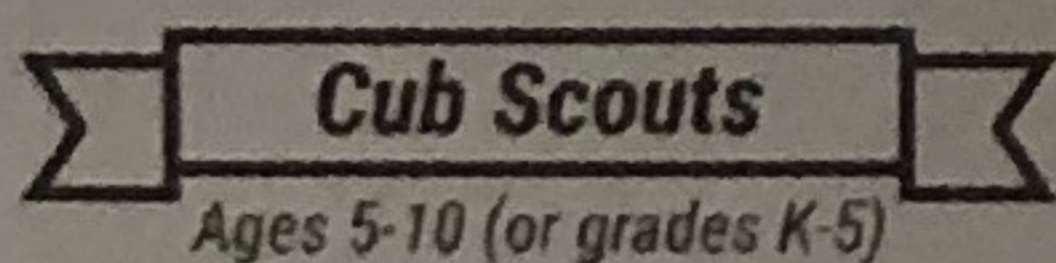
Oct 5 – Mitigwa Fun Day

Can't make the meeting tonight?

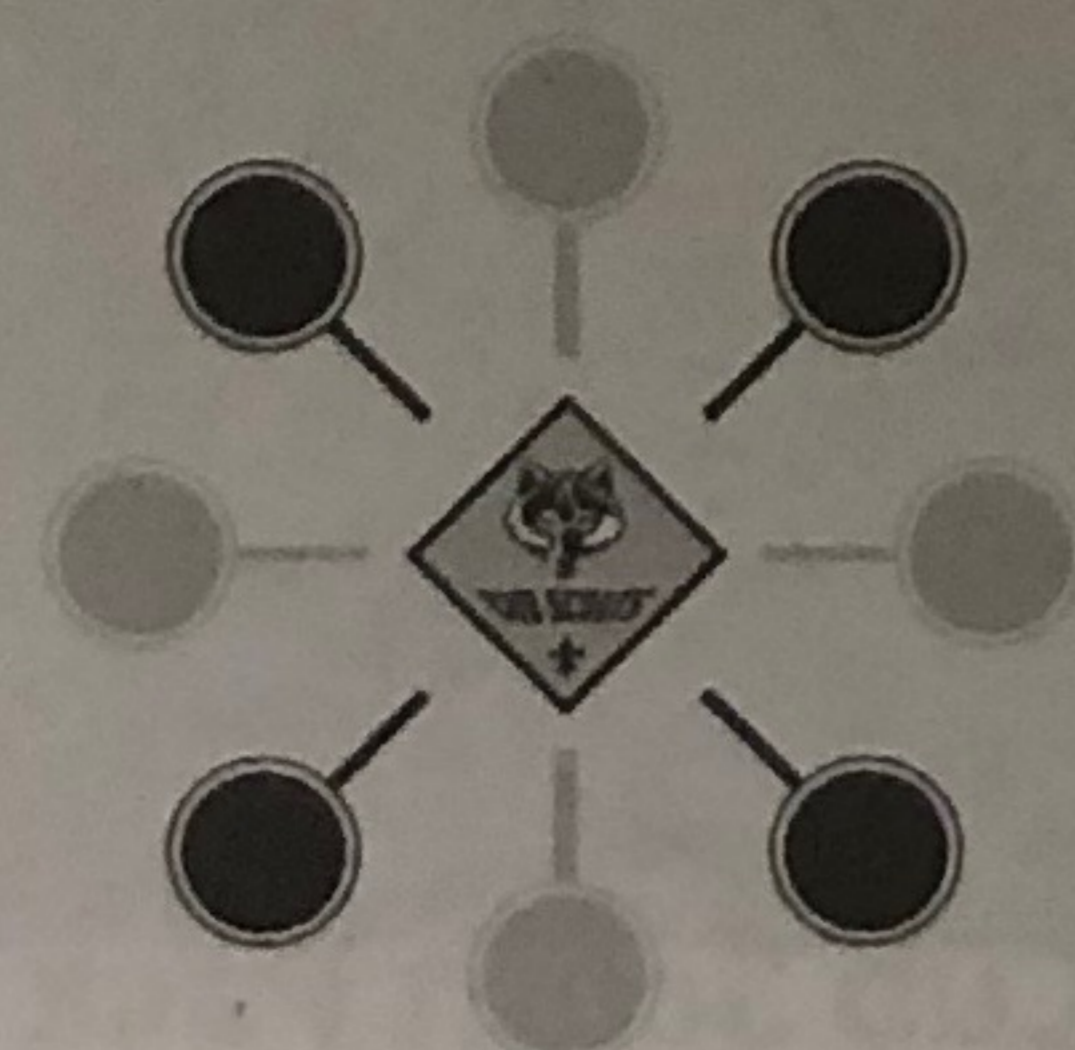
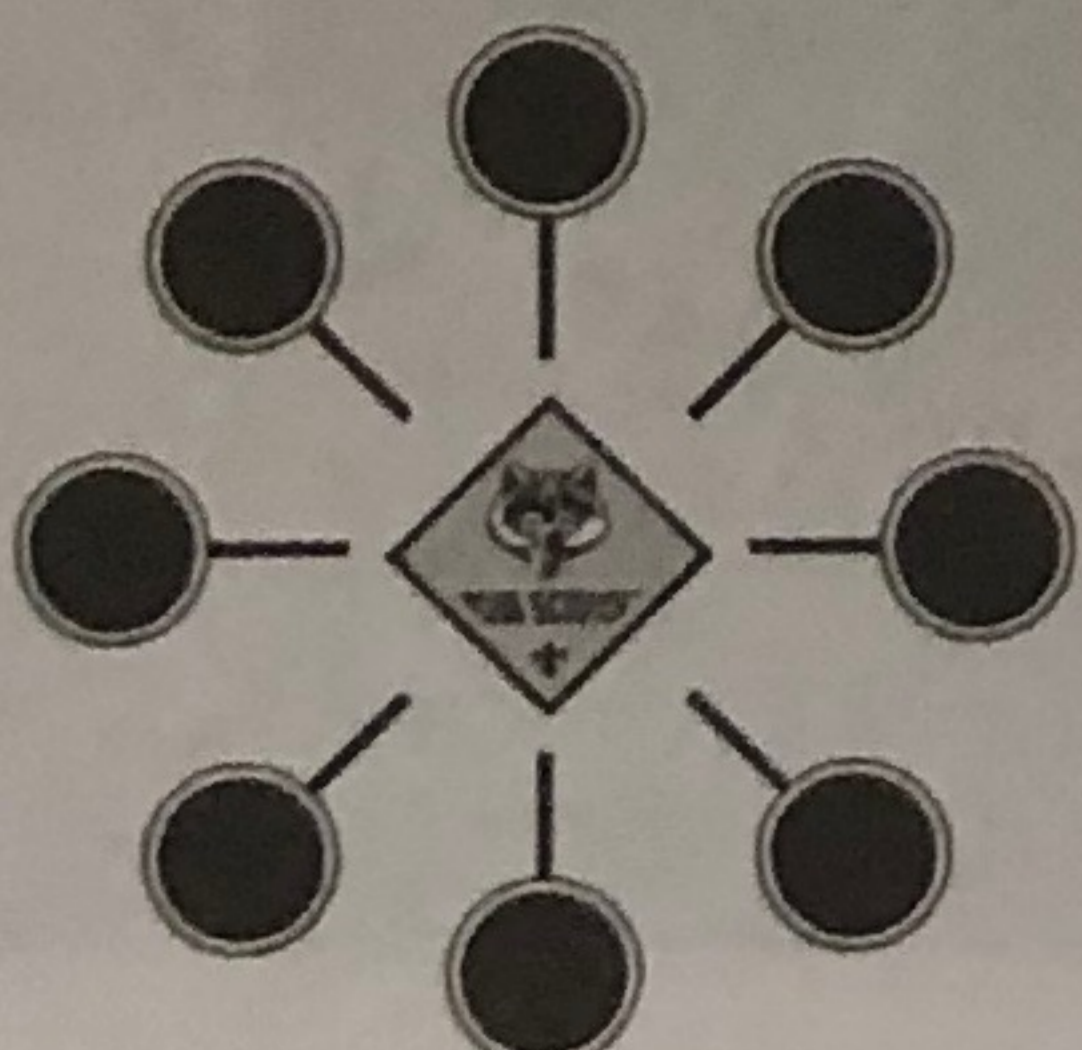

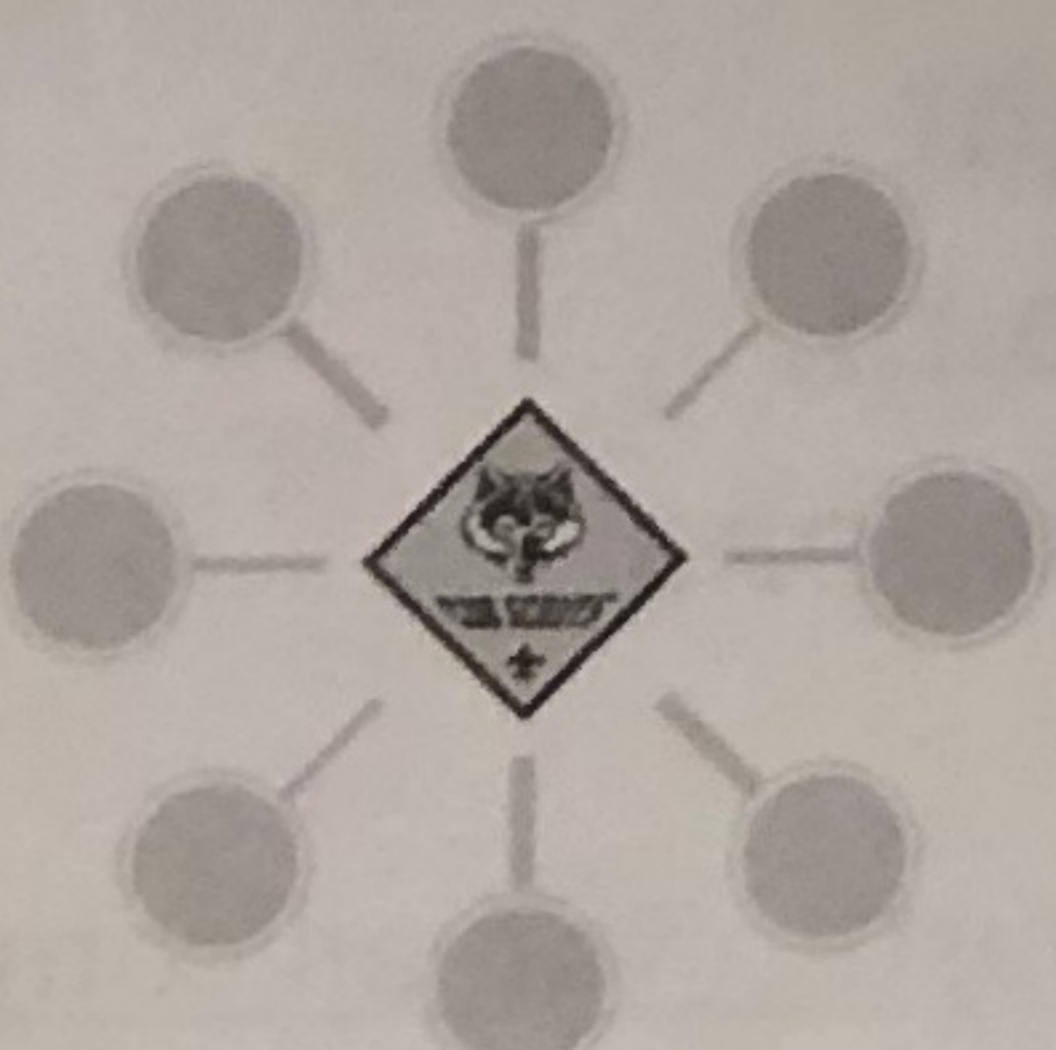


All-Boy Cub Scout Pack

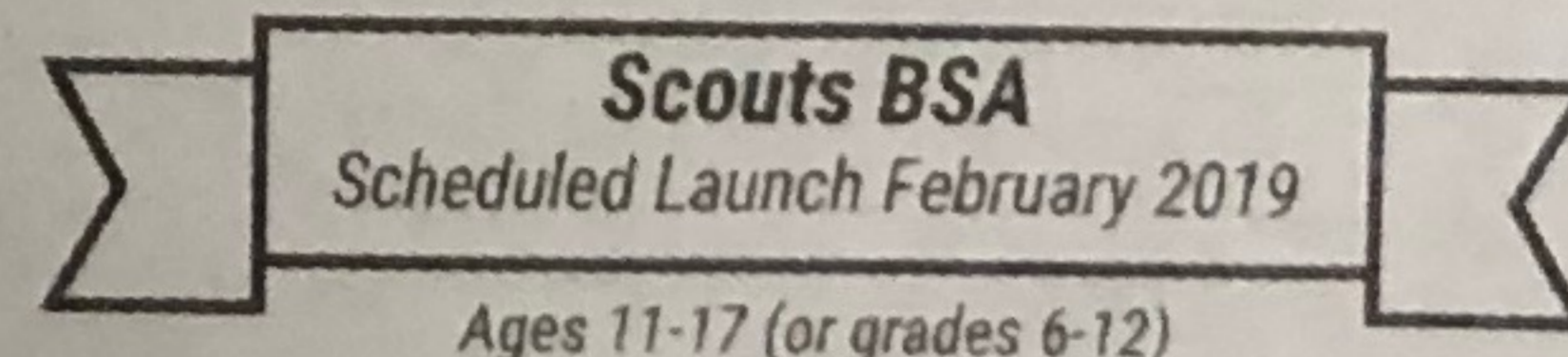
Boys and Girls Cub Scout Pack



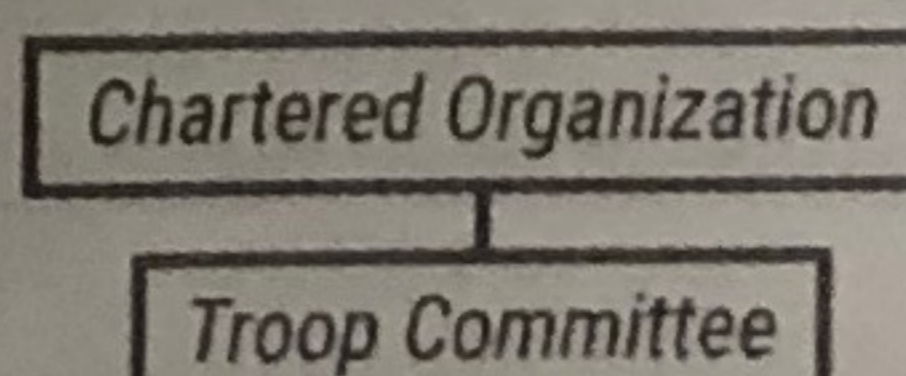
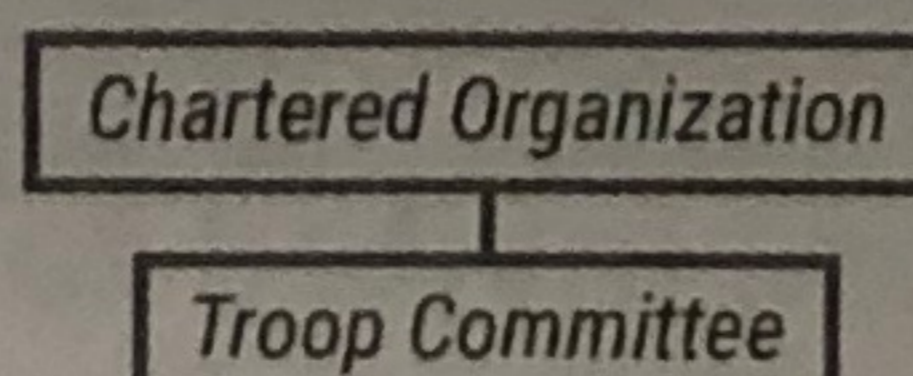
All-Girl Cub Scout Pack



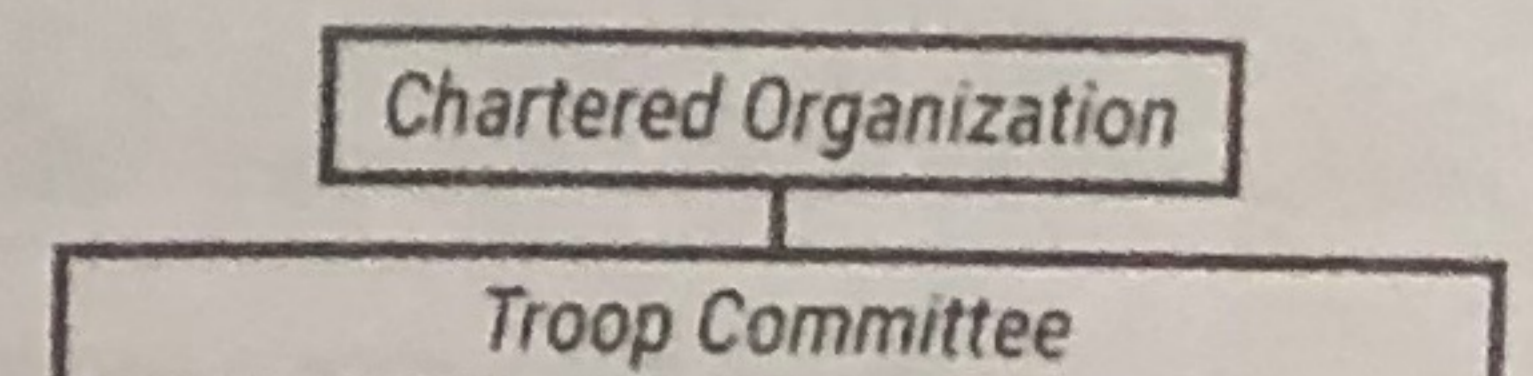
