


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Authorisations of complementary and herbal medicinal products 2022







Authorised complementary and herbal medicines, without notification procedure (2019-2022)

In the reporting year 2022, the number of homeopathic medicinal products (606), anthroposophic medicinal products (355), Asian medicinal products (6), medicinal products used in other schools of complementary medicine (5) and herbal medicinal products (413) decreased again. However, the decline in the number of herbal medicinal products authorised over the years is more pronounced.

New authorisations of complementary medicinal products with indication and herbal medicinal products in 2022

Complementary and herbal medicinal products can be authorised using a simplified authorisation procedure in accordance with Art. 14 para. 1 let. b of the Therapeutic Products Act (TPA, SR 812.21) or Art. 14 para. 1 let. c^{bis} TPA. A total of 12 medicinal products were authorised in procedures of this type.

One application was completed in 2022 using the procedures described in Art. 13 (Medicinal products and procedures authorised in foreign countries) and one using the procedures described in Art. 14 para. 1 let. a^{bis-quater} TPA.



New authorisations of complementary medicinal products with indication in 2022

Authorisation number	Name	Indication
67484	Similasan Allergy Eye Relief N, eye drops, single doses	According to homeopathic principles, used locally for allergic reactions (e.g. hay fever) of the mucous mem- branes of the eyes and eyelids with symptoms such as: itching and a burning sensation, redness, swelling.
67485	Similasan Dry Eye Relief N, eye drops, single doses	According to homeopathic principles, for dry eyes with symptoms such as a gritty feeling in the eyes, mildly irritated eyes or watering eyes.
67562	Similasan Inflamed Eye Relief N, eye drops, single doses	According to homeopathic principles, for non-infectious, mild forms of inflammation of the conjunctivae and edges of the eyelids due to irritating environmental fac- tors, with symptoms such as reddened and burning eyes.
67564	Similasan Strained Eye Relief N, eye drops, single doses	According to homeopathic principles, for strained, wa- tering eyes and in a supportive capacity during intensi- ve use of the eyes.
68347	Coryzalia, oral liquid in single-dose container	According to homeopathic principles, for colds.
68333	Adler Euclim, tablets	According to the biochemical therapeutic principle described by Dr. Schüssler, Adler Euclim may be used for menstrual and menopausal symptoms, e.g. mild cramping during menstruation, mood swings, agitation, sleeping difficulties and hot flushes.
68315		According to the anthroposophic principles of man and nature, as adjunctive treatment of malignant diseases in adults.




New authorisations of herbal medicinal products in 2022

Authorisation number	Name	Indication
68064	Buscomint, enteric-coated soft capsules	For symptomatic relief of stomach pain, mild cramping in the gastrointestinal tract and flatulence, particularly in patients with irritable bowel syndrome.
68067	SimiMed Ginkgo, film-coated tablets	For symptomatic treatment of impaired mental perfor- mance, intermittent claudication, vertigo and tinnitus.
68866	Zeller Menopause, tablets	For menopause-related problems.
68362	Ginkgo Spirig HC, film-coated tablets	For symptomatic treatment of impaired mental perfor- mance, intermittent claudication, vertigo and tinnitus.
68555	Kaloba Direct, granules	Symptomatic treatment of acute bronchitis.
68641	Umckaloabo Direct, granules	Symptomatic treatment of acute bronchitis.
68993	Klostergarten Chest Tea Hieronymus N, herbal tea	Relieves irritation of the throat, promotes expectoration.

Authorised complementary medicinal products without indication under the notification procedure (2019-2022)

The number of authorised homeopathic or anthroposophic medicinal products, medicinal products for gemmotherapy and Chinese medicinal products without indication under the notification procedure increased slightly in 2022 (10,888 medicinal products).






There was an increase in the authorisation of medicinal products for gemmotherapy without indication under the notification procedure from 64 products in 2021 to 96 in 2022.

For the first time, 20 medicinal products used in Chinese medicine without indication were authorised under the notification procedure according to Art. 31 of the Complementary and Phytotherapeutic Products Ordinance (KPTPO, SR 812.212.24).

A.109 regulatory changes

Implementation of the new requirements in accordance with the revised TPLRO


Full declaration became mandatory for all medicinal products when the revised therapeutic products legislation came into force on 1 January 2019. These adaptations to the requirements are requested with an A.109 regulatory application. In 2022, twice as many A.109 applications were concluded as in 2021 and 2020.





New Complementary and Herbal Medicines (CHM) Division website
