Exciting New Season Set For Local Venues

Fans of music, theater and comedy purchased almost 10% more tickets per show during the 2018-19 Villages entertainment season according to Brian Russo, director of entertainment. Cue: applause. But even as the season winds down and the curtains close, The Sharon L. Morse Performing Arts Center and Savannah Center are planning a strong lineup for the season starting this fall. Much of it was announced Sunday. Patrons can look forward to some fancy dancing from Ballroom with a Twist in October, ventriloquist Terry Fator in November, and in 2020, Branford Marsalis in January, Kansas in February,

April, and many more fresh acts.

Old favorites are returning, too, including The Righteous Brothers, Kansas, Masters of Illusion and The Beach Boys.

"We are very excited to announce 'Beautiful: The Carole King Musical,' and to offer a three-part Broadway subscription with a 15% discount," said Elizabeth Constant, booking coordinator at The Sharon.

In addition to "Beautiful," which The Sharon will host for three performances in December, the Broadway subscription also will include the award-winning comedy "The Play That Goes Wrong" in December and the World War II homecoming musical "Bandstand" in February.

The Sharon is keeping its International subscription, a discount package on multicultural shows that launched in 2018, and adding a National Geographic subscription.

The National Geographic shows feature a speaker series on a variety of topics including Spinosaurus, the largest predatory dinosaur yet discovered, along with travel and underwater photography.

"I often get asked for TED talk-style seminar and lecture shows," Constant said. "This was a prepacked offering from National Geographic. They tour the country with many speakers to choose from."

Russo, who books the shows at Savannah Center, said Savannah Center will offer a new Classic Albums Live package.

Classic Albums Live is a show that chooses a famous album and then plays it live from start to finish. It has frequented Savannah Center, and will appear in the 2019-20 season with shows on the Beatles' "Abbey Road," Queen's "A Night at the Opera," Tom Petty and the Heartbreakers' "Damn the Torpedoes" and Fleetwood Mac's "Rumours." Russo also is

Russo also is looking forward to a new title called "MozART," coming to Savannah Center in October, a combination of classical music and comedy.

"They mix in absolutely hilarious sketches with the music they perform," Russo said. "I think our residents will absolutely love them."

Constant and Russo said that when booking the season, they look for a balance of crowd favorites and fresh titles.

Tickets for many of the shows go on sale Wednesday.

More shows will be announced in the coming months, according to Russo.

The Villages Entertainment recently made upgrades to the ticketing system, including new touches to thevillagesentertainment. com that make buying tickets more interactive and efficient, as well as a new remote box office call center and more.

"Part of these upgrades also included a ton of infrastructure upgrades that are going to take us to another level very soon," Russo said. "This big launch was only the first phase of several more to come."
