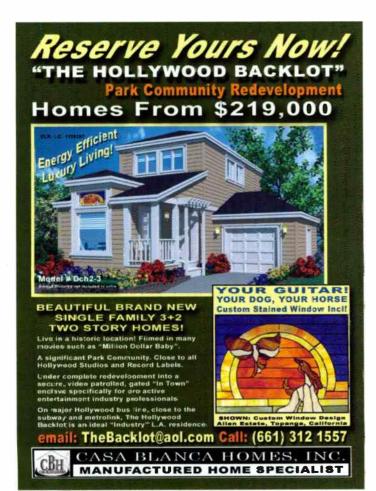

resenters and performers at this year's Grammy Awards will get something besides worldwide exposure for their efforts. Thanks to Distinctive Assets (DA), a company dedicated to "gifting" celebrities at major award shows and special events, 165 artists and key executives will leave the Staples Center with a Grammy gift bag full of items totaling over \$30,000. For their seventh year working the event, Distinctive Assets has filled it with unique items, including a free weekend at the Valhalla Shooting Club in Colorado (valued at over \$8,000 alone).

In addition, recipients will be invited to an interactive gift lounge backstage, where they can choose from eight different colors of \$650 ski jackets from Escada Sport, new cell phones and three months of free service from Verizon, a thousand-dollar Gibson guitar, and a wide array of designer sunglasses - including Valentino, Marc Jacobs and Gucci - from Solstice Sunglass Boutiques. In addition, DA is giving away 6,000 "goodie bags" worth \$150 each for the Grammy Afterparty, filled with less expensive, but still trendy items like four full-size bottles of S Factor hair care products and a \$30 brush.

The other shows they work require smaller numbers, from 100 for the Kids' Choice Awards to 25 for this year's HBO Comedy Festival. Other gifting events include the People's Choice Awards, Latin Grammys and Academy of Country Music Awards as well as special nominee gift bags for the Emmys and Oscars.

Some people have the mistaken impression that the only thing celebs want are Tiffany lamps or Cartier watches, but I've found that they are just regular people. They love to get gifts, just like the rest of us, and are especially excited to get products before they are officially launched."

At DA the focus is more on the cool and practical factors of the

products themselves rather than the dollar value. "The only real criteria are that they're fun and unique," says Fary. "And you never know what kind of reactions you're going to get. One year, we included a tin of Altoids, thinking it was useful but not particularly impressive. But when Beyonce was interviewed by Extra about her favorite gift bag item, she proudly pro-claimed, 'The Altoids! I just love them!' It's hard to buy better advertising than that."

Co-owned by Fary and partner Todd West, Distinctive Assets started as a private showroom selling clothing, jewelry and accessories to many of the top TV shows and to numerous celebrities. Based on an eye for cutting-edge products and services, coupled with their first-hand knowledge of celebrity needs, they quickly expanded into gifting celebrities through award shows and special events.

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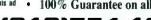
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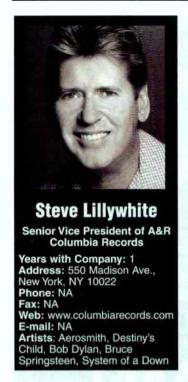


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A&R PROFILE —SCOTT PERHAM



BACKGROUND: Steve Lillywhite is among the most significant figures in the music industry. As a producer, he has worked with an extensive list of A-list artists including Dave Matthews, Peter Gabriel, and the Rolling Stones. He was recently nominated for the coveted "Producer of the Year" Grammy for his work on U2's latest release, How to Dismantle an Atomic Bomb. But producing is only part of his colossal contribution to the recording industry. Lillywhite also recently served two years as the Joint Managing Director at Mercury Records in London and he currently holds the prestigious position of Senior Vice President of A&R at Columbia Records in New York.

Making His Mark:

I moved back to England about four vears ago and I took a job as Joint Managing Director there with Universal, with Mercury Records, in England. We had some success and it was great, but after two years my good friend Paul McGuiness called me up and asked me to help him out with the new U2 album. So I left Mercury to work with U2 for six months. Then my wife suggested that we move back to New York, so I met up with Donny lenner and Will Botwin and really liked what they were up to. The things I didn't like about Mercury in London, I don't have to deal with at Columbia. Here it's all about the music and I feel like I have a completely empty board to make my mark.

Perks of Being a Producer:

Quite often as a producer I've had A&R people come into the studio, and they blatantly don't really know what they're talking about and we

sort of have a little giggle about them. But I'm able to relate to the artists and the producers in a unique way. I work with producers, I get along with, so when I go to the studio and they play me something I can talk their language. I've been lucky to work with important artists. I'm fortunate in that respect. A lot of young A&R people have never worked with true greatness, so what they think is good may not necessarily be great. I'm confident in really knowing the difference between great and exceptional.

It's All About the Voice:

I come from the day when there were no such things as well-produced demos. In the mid-70's, you were lucky if you got a live cassette. So the production doesn't matter. The first thing I do is listen to the voice. I understand the voice and I know a good voice. If I don't like the voice I won't be able to get into the song. If I do like the voice I will carry on and the song will show itself to me eventually.

Get the Ball Rolling:

We really want artists who can do a lot of the groundwork themselves. Sometimes major labels are not good at getting the ball rolling. What we're good at is taking things and bringing them to a mass market. But to actually get the grassroots rolling, no major label is as good at that as the kids who are out there doing it themselves. It's very arrogant to think that we can sign something that no one's ever heard and make it successful. I would much rather the general public gave some indication that there is something going on before we got involved. I like the fact that artists are developing beforehand and I like the fact that the public has an active role deciding what they want to hear, rather than some guy on the 26th floor deeming it so that they should hear certain music.

Concentrate on Quality:

Make sure your music is as good as you can make it. Be very hard on yourself. If friends of yours say you sound like Coldplay, sit down and say, "Okay, are we really as good as Coldplay?" If you're not,

make some improvements. It seems like every other bloody band these davs has a singer who has a falsetto voice, and they're okay. But Christopher Martin is a fabulous talent and he does it really well. I see a lot of things that aren't nearly as good as that. So be true to yourself and try to take your ego out of the equation. Do it for your own sake. It's hard to have music as a career. Less and less people are managing to sell records and make money from it, so the quality has to be much higher than you may think.

Songwriting vs. Production:

A lot of people work on production values much more than classic songwriting, because it's much easier to make something sound good nowadays. Everyone can save up and buy a ProTools rig. But sometimes technology takes over you as a songwriter. So rather than polish something so much that it doesn't have anywhere else to go, try to use your creative side of the brain more.

Quality Control:

I want to concentrate on the sort of artists that I would want to produce, even if I don't produce them. Quite often in A&R, especially with a company as big as Columbia, you get sent e-mails from someone saying something like, "I have this 16-year-old girl who is brilliant and cuté looking." But other people are better at that sort of stuff than me. We'll leave that to the American Idols of the world. I like songwriters. I like people who can write their own songs. The acts that I won't go for are the ones that I wouldn't want to produce. They'll get dropped to the bottom of the pile. That's my quality control.

Discovering New Music:

The internet is a great way of discovering music. I've had my eye on MySpace for about a year or so and I love it. If someone e-mails me a link I can go there straight away and hear their music. I will admit that some things pass me by, but if I don't hear it the first time it doesn't necessarily mean it's not good for me. I'll normally give it a second

listen, and sometimes after a while it'll start growing on me. Then that will go into the pile that needs a third listen. But usually everything gets two listens.

Signing Solid Stuff:

I think far too much rubbish gets signed. I'm sorry, but just because somebody can sing in tune doesn't mean that people will go out and buy their records. I'm looking for artists whose world I want to be in. Are they interesting as artists? Do they have something to say? If that's the case, I will get involved in their world. I feel very confident that we're going to make some major signings and carry on the tradition that Columbia has done so well for the past 30 years. They've signed classy acts that are there for the long term. I would love to bring something here that has the same [musical significance] as some of the major acts that I've worked with. I would rather sign two great acts than six or seven average ones.

Solicit Multiple Labels:

You may have an A&R person who has two or three hit rock acts and that becomes the rock label, or you may have two or three urban hits on one label and that becomes the urban place to be. But you don't ever only solicit one label. If you have two labels interested it really helps your bargaining power as an artist. When there's only one label interested it's a buyer's market, but when there is more than one person interested it goes to a seller's market instead.

Try Something Different:

We're all being analysts. Artists are listening to records too much and trying to make things sound like something else. I love songs that work brilliantly and you don't know what's going to happen next. I'm so fed up with the verse, chorus, verse, chorus. It's all the same. So try something different. Every time you do something that sounds like something else, challenge it and say, "Is this the best that I can do?"

the same — the only genre we're after are classy artists with depth to their music, and we trust our audience to spot them first."

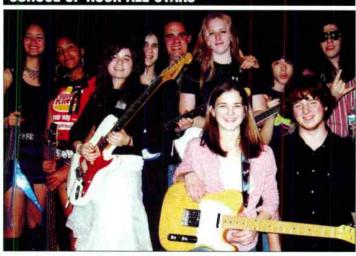
New artists who join the site benefit by getting their music heard by an online community and may progress from the unsigned stage to becoming a MVine featured artist and eventually even signing to the MVine label.

The organizers promise that artists will walk away with a practical planning tool that will take much of the guesswork out of CD releases. You'll also leave with many new music industry contacts that can help further your career.

s frontman for the Gadjits, Brandon Phillips made his debut on Hellcat Records. And after a ska-to-rock genesis, the band landed on RCA. Unfortunately, once Clive Davis stepped in, they were let go. "No-body wanted to stick their neck out," says Phillips. "But they ended up writing us a check, so that eased the pain."

Spending the money proactively, the band cut an album on its own and changed its name. Dubbed the Architects, Phillips sent out their fulllength (Keys To The Building) to a short list of folks he was familiar with. "I was disgruntled with labels," says Phillips. "Even my favorite indies were starting to act like majors. So we decided to talk to John Hulston over at Anodyne Records."

Armed with a firm vision on his band's development, Phillips asked Hulston if he was interested in not only releasing the album, but letting him control the expenses. "There's certain people I wanted to hire and certain money I thought should be spent," says Phillips.

Hulston agreed and the debut was released. But the album saw distribution problems and never hit a stride. "We just decided to stop wor-rying about it and focus on recording a new album," says Phillips. "But along the way we began working with James Cho of Sideshow Records, and he signed us to a distribution deal." Shortly thereafter, Phillips also became a label manager at Anodyne, giving him firm reins on his band and its upcoming release.

"I've recorded on all kinds of labels at different points of their careers," says Phillips. "I feel I'm well-equipped to dissect what was done right and wrong, so I can apply that now. Basically, it's just been made clear to me that I can't have an artistic life without a business life. If it were up to me, I'd roll out of my bunk, play a show, and call it a day. But you have to be in control of your own destiny.

ike other bands, Austin-based Bitter Tongues had played clubs, recorded demos, and did their own press and booking. But as their drummer Jared Cannon notes, they weren't too hopeful about getting signed.

"A couple of the guys, myself included, had decided at one point to stop playing music. People who liked us seemed to be more proactive about us than we were. We had no idea we had an impact on people."

They had an impact on Chuck Rottersmann of Resurrection Management, who signed Bitter Tongues after seeing them live, and sent out demos on their behalf. They also had an impact on other friends who, according to Cannon, began to put Bitter Tongues songs on their private message boards. "Our friends and people who liked us became our A&R agents.

One such friend had signed to United Edge Records some years earlier and Cannon had previously been in communication with United Edge's owner Andrea Goonan. "She got hold of our demo and she contacted me and said, 'I like your stuff.' It was the best label that had contacted us.

The original deal would have had Bitter Tongues recording for Textbook, the traditional rock-oriented "sister label" to United Edge. "[But] when Andrea got the master of our record she called up and said, 'I think this will fit better with United Edge's audience, because it's rock like Textbook, but heavier like United Edge.' We didn't care what label it's on as long as it's in stores."

United Edge is a small label with a solid foundation. "They have the record all over the place. which is more than we could do," notes Cannon. "We knew how to do everything except how to get the record in stores." United Edge distributes through the indie distributor Revelation and also through Navarre, which gets the albums into larger chain stores.

Bitter Tongues' album Clovis was released on January 24th.

o land his first record deal, Stereocell founder Todd Riffel used his job to network. While working his day job as an I.T. consultant for small businesses, Riffel was hired to wire the offices for the now defunct Electric Monkey Records' computer systems. Making the most of the opportunity, Riffel finally built up the nerve to approach label executive Jeff Grabow about his band.

"I slowly slid in the fact that I was a musician," remembers Riffel of his hidden talent. "Finally, I gave Jeff a CD [of my music] and he really liked it and came back to me saying, 'Wow, I'm really impressed!' He was really into it and played it for his 11-year-old son and [his son] absolutely loved it.

Riffel continued to see Grabow whenever the label needed I.T. work, and each time Riffet would invite him to a show. Several invites later. Grabow agreed to see the band live.

"I invited him to a few shows, and finally he said he would check us out, and he actually showed up and absolutely loved the show!"

Problem was, Electric Monkey was about to

fold. Grabow, a 20-plus-year veteran of the sales and marketing departments at WEA and Virgin Records, was starting his own label, Rockview Records.

For Riffel, Grabow's credentials were all the validation he needed, "I really feel confident in [Grabow]. I did a lot of research on him [prior to signing with Rockview] and noticed that he has been in the industry forever and I also heard a iot of good things about [how he planned to distribute the record] that really interested me."

Not that it made a difference in the signing, but it is interesting to note that Riffel's sister, Rena Riffel, an actress in several films and TV shows, is in the band. Stereocell has also licensed music to films and television and landed an endorsement deal with RKS Guitars.

The band's debut, Into Tomorrow, is in stores now.

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PRODUCER CROSSTALK



Jason Corsaro

Jaco Pastorius, Tony Williams, Motorhead, Peter Gabriel, Soundgarden

ason Corsaro likes to push the envelope. Though he's collaborated with pop megastars like Madonna and Duran Duran he primarily enjoys edgy experimentation. It's one of the reasons Corsaro has worked with Bill Laswell, whose unorthodox techniques and post-recording wizardry have sometimes created outrage. "I think what [Laswell] liked about me is that I was always very daring," recalls Corsaro. The mixer mentions the time he treated a Bootsy Collins record. "[Laswell] left and came back late at night and said, 'Jason, you've mixed this inside out and backwards. But it sounds great, so I'm gonna go with it.' I never had so much respect for somebody." Though Corsaro tailors his approach to his clients' tastes, he prefers musicians who want to be unconventional. "If someone comes in and says, 'I'm looking to do something that's never been done before,' I like that challenge."

When he won a Grammy for engineering Steve Winwood's *Back in the High Life*, Corsaro was pleased by the recognition. But he views the accolade with a dose of perspective. "It was nice to be accepted and appreciated, but there are so many things I've done that I think deserve the same," says the two-time nominee. For Corsaro, the job's true rewards come in other forms. "I'm happy when the artist calls me years later and they're still

happy with what I did."

It's this perspective that led Corsaro to become involved with DreamMakersMP3.com. Corsaro hopes the website will give rise to artists who wouldn't otherwise be able to make it. "DreamMakers is a place where artists can show off their talent to an audience looking for new music," explains Corsaro. "I don't think that exists in too many places. An unsigned band can make their dream come true; that's the purpose of DreamMakers." It's a site that's based on people power, circumventing the dominance of programmers. "I have faith in the consumer," Corsaro admits, "they just don't have the opportunity to get what they're looking for. They have a limited menu." Though the music on the website isn't yet available for purchase, Corsaro has produced several artists whose music you can preview; log on and check out Corsaro-enhanced numbers by Transfusion M and Never The Man.

Though DreamMakers may be an innovative delivery method, all those tracks need to be recorded somewhere. Corsaro's history includes experience capturing performances at legendary spots like A&M, Hit Factory and Power Station, where he worked with artists like Chic and Tony Visconti, so he can identify a good studio when he sees one. For Corsaro, Barber Shop Studios in Hopatcong, NJ. is the ideal location. "When you need a second, you can walk outside on the deck, look at the lake and focus on what you need to do. It's very serene." Besides the top-notch equipment, both old and new, Corsaro praises the studio's design. "The room itself is a partner in the making of the sound. The owner, Scott Barber, is so passionate about music it's incredible. I think it's going to draw a lot of people when they hear what can happen here."

But in the end the studio is just a tool, and what matters is whether or not the results edify. "If you finish your record and you can't stand listening to it, how are you going to listen to it 20 years later?" Corsaro wonders aloud. "A lot of people spend time doing things that don't really satisfy themselves." Corsaro's involvement with artistically satisfying projects has stretched for nearly 30 years. "If Jone of my records] sells two copies,

great," says the producer, counting his blessings. "But most of the time I end up selling more."

Alfred Publishing's recent acquisition of over 45,000 titles from Warner Bros. Publications includes artists like Green Day, the Eagles, Led Zeppelin, and the Rolling Stones. Alfred's now offers a new series of guitar tablature books of complete albums by many seminal recording artists. Called matching folios, I first received Green Day's hit 2005 album American Idiot with "Boulevard of Broken Dreams" and the title-track, "American Idiot." This folio contains piano and vocal arrangements for all of the songs on the album, including "Jesus of Suburbia' and "Holiday."

Alfred's Classic Tab series starts with the matching folio to Led Zeppelin's legendary first album, Led Zeppelin I. This

detailed, fully notated edition provides authentic guitar Tab for all the songs on the album, including "Babe, I'm Gonna Leave You," "Black Mountain Side," my big fave "Communication Breakdown," Jimmy Page's soloed authored "Dazed and Confused," "I Can't Quit You Baby," "You Shook Me," and "Your Time Is Gonna Come." This book is a requirement for any Led Zeppelin fan that wants to learn how to accurately play Jimmy Page's guitar parts and solos for every single song.

Probably the best value in Alfred's folios would be *The Very Best of Eagles*. This item contains 33 titles from the Eagles' remarkable career, as well as 24 pages featuring photos of the band. There is also a conversation with Don Henley and Glenn Frey that provides background information on how the songs were written and the meaning behind them. Titles include: "After the Thrill Is Gone," "Already Gone," "The Best of My Love," "Desperado," "Get Over It," "Heartache Tonight," "Hole in the World," "Hotel California," "The Last Resort," "Life in the Fast Lane," "The Long Run," "Love Will Keep Us Alive," "Lyin' Eyes," "Take It Easy," "Take It to the Limit," "Tequila Sunrise," "Victim of Love," "Wasted Time," "Witchy Woman" and many more.

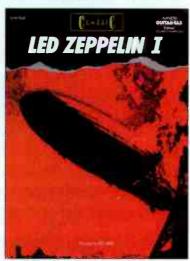
Taylor Grand Symphony Guitar

The solid top of western red cedar or Sitka spruce is supported by one of Taylor's not so secret features: optimized bracing from precision-carved framing that provides strength yet maximal flexibility of large guitar tops. This construction is one reason the GS has incredible power and volume and is capable of producing an enormously dense sound. The strength ofthis instrument means the GS can take with ease all vigorous strumming, but without the loss of Taylor's trademark: an excellent and balanced tone.

The GS has a clean, uncluttered look with an understated, single-ring abalone soundhole rosette along with microdot fret markers and ivoroid binding around the neck and body. The GS is available in four solid premium tone wood combinations: tropical American mahogany back and sides with western red cedar

top; big leaf maple back and sides with Sitka spruce top; Indian rosewood back and sides with western red cedar top; and Indian rosewood back and sides with Sitka spruce top.

Roland BOSS RT-20 Rotary Speaker Simulator

The newest member of the Roland BOSS' Twin-Pedal family is the RT-20 Rotary Ensemble. Employing COSM®modeling technology, the RT-20 authentically reproduces classic rotaryspeaker sounds and other interesting sound treatments. It



offers adjustable rise/fall time (or how fast the rotary speaker spins up/down to speed), horn and bass speaker speed, and overdrive.

For me it's worth the price of this pedal just for the awesome graphic of the virtual rotors within its built-in display. The spinning lights show the audio-rotation characteristics of the RT-20 with the center of the display, illuminated in red light, representing the virtual bass speaker. The outside ring, illuminated in blue, displays the rotation of the virtual horn. I had to kick myself out of a trance a couple of times staring at this Stargate vortex.

With the RT-20, COSM is used to simulate classic rotary characteristics in stereo via its two outputs, allowing the (impossible with a real Leslie® speaker) virtual horn and bass speaker to be independently adjustable while you play. This unit will accept either guitar level or keyboard/synth levels — just use the Drive Type switch to optimize the effect.

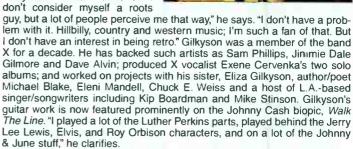
Tony Gilkyson

A Six Stringer's Songs

ight years after Tony Gilkyson's last solo release, Sparko, the consummate guitarist/producer now commands center stage with Goodbye Guitar, a project that casts him in the spotlight as a songwriter and artist. What aligned the planets for this project, he reveals, was arriving "at a point where I was looking for the deeper satisfaction that comes from writing."

Gilkyson traverses a crossroads of styles, with a distinctively West Coast attitude. "I don't consider myself a roots



Songwriting, Gilkyson attests, is an increasingly rigorous process. "It used to be all I had to do was sit down and have a cup of coffee to do it. Now it takes a little more. Sometimes I need a road trip to anywhere — north, south, east, west. I like to go to Arizona or New Mexico, or anywhere I've never been before, just me and a credit card and a guitar. Sparse is the key If you're in a room without much in it, you can focus."

key. If you're in a room without much in it, you can focus."

Growing up as a kid in Hollywood, Gilkyson was surrounded by music. His late father, Terry, penned classics "Green Fields," "All Day All Night Marianne," and "Memories are Made of This." Gilkyson recalls, "One year would be really rough and the next year the Brothers Four would record a song. It was easy to tell when things were going great." The elder Gilkyson didn't encourage his children (including Tony and Eliza's sister Nancy, who was a longtime Warner Bros. executive) to follow in his footsteps. "He knew it was cut-throat and potentially devastating. He died five years ago; I never talked to him about songwriting. He didn't get X. He was a songwriter from another time, but he was honest about it." On *Goodbye Guitar*, Gilkyson includes, "Man About Town," a song his father penned in 1948, with accordion courtesy of an old family friend, Van Dyke Parks.

Seated in a trendy coffeehouse in Eagle Rock, not far from his home in Highland Park, Gilkyson notes the similarity of these newly hip districts to his previous neighborhoods. "In the old days, 1981 and 1982, in Silver Lake and Echo Park, there was an anonymity that had nothing to do with the entertainment business. It was a foundation of sanity. When you had to go to West L.A. you could come back and see people coming and going from work that nothing to do with a record label. It felt good."

Gilkyson's most affecting songs are as literal and laconic as his conversation, like "Wilton Bridge," about a homeless man under a Hollywood Freeway overpass. "Don't fool yourself my friends/You're no better than the man/Sleeping under Wilton Bridge tonight." Gilkyson notes, "I used to drive under Wilton Bridge, and there'd be homeless people camped out there."

The thematic essence of *Goodbye Guitar* is distilled into lines from "My Eyes," as the world-weary protagonist laments: "My back is bent, my hair is grey, but the worst thing I despise is my eyes," above the swaying honk of the Texicali Horns. Concludes Gilkyson, "Most people associate me as a guitar player. I want them to hear my music from a songwriting perspective."

Having worked on both the label (Bad Boy) and artist management side (Meshell Ndegeocello), Story understands what it takes to boost an artist to the national level and takes great pride in working with L.A.'s crop of local talent. And while The Temple Bar and its sister venues are best known for their popular groove/DJ oriented residencies like Bossa:Nova, AfroFunke, and The Blend, Story tells MC that the Temple Bar has some exciting booking plans in store for 2006.

MC What types of acts are you looking to book?

Dexter Story: Temple Bar is built on diversity and we like bands and DJs who bring people and cultures together. We're always looking for universal soul, hip-hop and world acts. We stay away from degrading, violent and destructive music, artists and audiences. Also, we don't book much metal, punk and hard rock.

MC: Have the booking policies changed since you took over those duties?

Story: No, but we are pushing for unprecedented growth this year. I'm attempting to book bigger national acts and more potent local acts. I'd also like to enhance our reputation in the area of indie rock and singer/songwriters. 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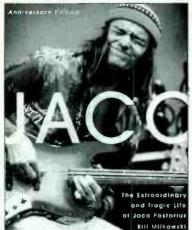

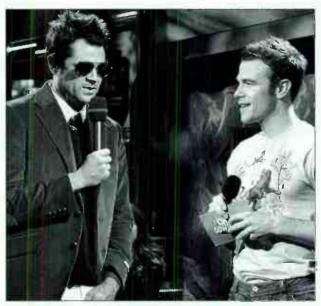

has tracked a string of platinum releases. Their newest album, For Me It's You, promises to extend that tradition. Still, despite their massive popularity, Train's image has remained relatively low profile. Unlike many frontmen, vocalist Pat Monahan does not seem intent on gracing fashion magazine layouts or hosting television shows; in conversation he exudes determination and a single-minded purpose: to advance his band's reputation through music. "The way the world has come to be, people in the hiphop industry and the Gwen Stefani's of the world are marketing themselves as a product, and that product does different things: makes clothes, sings songs. That's not the kind of personality I am. Maybe that's foolish of me, but music is what I know how to do — marketing isn't."

An art gallery on trendy La Brea Avenue in Hollywood is an improbable setting for an arena-filling band like Train. On a recent night, however, the quintet — stripped down to basics to match the intimate space — rolls through a brief selection of songs from their new album, For Me It's You, alongside their best known hits including their signature song, "Calling All Angels."

The audience is mainly friends and press, and as the crab cakes and Chardonnay circulate the gracious Monahan converses easily with the crowd, spearheading the band's minimalist approach. The semi-acoustic sound pinpoints what makes Train's latest endeavor so appealing: deft, emotionally charged songs with fresh hooks and undeniable commercial appeal.

Onstage tonight, the chemistry in the band is palpable; guitarist Jimmy Stafford, with his shaved head and open demeanor, is the foil for Monahan's good-natured jibes. Bassist Johnny Colt exudes an effortless rock vibe, keyboardist Brandon Bush somehow manages to make a Yamaha grand sound like a \$300 Wurlitzer, and Scott Underwood on drums is a flawless timekeeper. The band's set is short and sweet. "We'll just do one more and then let you get back to your thing," offers Monahan to the restive, chatty L.A. crowd.

The Music Connection Factor

Monahan grew up in Erie, PA, and still lives there part-time. (He and his girlfriend also have a new home outside Seattle.) The singer says that the small-town upbringing was a plus.

"You can turn anything into inspiration. My inspiration wasn't people telling me I couldn't do something, it was people telling me I had to do something and what I had was too big for a small town, unless that's what I wanted out of it. So I left. It was inspiring to know that the people in my small town were support-

ive, so that one day when I returned they would be proud of helping me. They're all still my friends and family and support me in everything that I do."

He and his previous girlfriend, who first met when Monahan was 19, moved to Los Angeles in 1990. "There was still a lot of hair. Guns N' Roses were popping and Nirvana and that whole world was just beginning. That sums it up: it was all changing, everything was different."

That said, a certain music magazine provided context and contacts. "I know some of the other guys in the band met through *Music Connection*. My personal experience is that I found a friend of mine, Bart Hendrickson, who I wrote the song "Ordinary" with for the *Spider Man 2* soundtrack. I met him through *Music Connection* in 1990 and we've been friends ever since."

Monahan also met Rob Hotchkiss who had been playing in a band, the Apostles. The pair kept in contact when the future Train conductor and his girlfriend returned home to Pennsylvania to have their first child. "After doing that, Rob convinced me to give it a shot in Northern California. He'd gone to school there. It was fantastic; we fell in love with the area for a lot of reasons. There were a lot of venues we could play as a coffeehouse duo. There were open mic nights there and we found every one in the Bay Area and played them."

Monahan recalls the duo plying their trade on San Francisco's caffeine circuit. "We learned a lot about making contact with people in close proximity, just doing it with the tools we had — voice, guitar — instead of lugging in equipment and creating different sounds. It was one-on-one: 'Man, if you don't like this song you're not going to like the other versions of it.""

The singer says that his acoustic beginnings are still useful to him today. "What happens when you become a bigger band and you plug in and do what you do, you can always revert to what you came up as, an acoustic band — strap on your instrument, sing a couple of songs and people will get it right away. The audiences started showing up to see us. Jimmy Stafford, who was living in L.A. at the time the earthquake hit (1994), decided to join us in the Bay Area and we got our following there."

After a New York City showcase, Columbia turned Train down. Undaunted, the group recorded their own CD independently and a Columbia Records subsidiary, Aware Records, picked up the project. The label placed the band on *Aware 5*, the fifth compilation album from the company that had launched the bands Better Than Ezra and matchbox twenty. The song, "Meet Virginia," went Top Five and was accompanied by a memorable, heavy-rotation video. By the summer of 1999, Train was at full throttle.

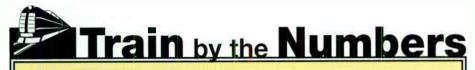

To record For Me It's You, Train traveled to Atlanta for an intensive and productive collaboration with producer Brendan O'Brien who has been behind the board for Bob Dylan, Neil Young and Rage Against The Machine among many others. O'Brien's participation in the project is key: he also played on the record and co-wrote songs.

Two of the band's newest members, keyboardist Brandon Bush (John Mayer, Shawn Mullins) and bassist Johnny Colt (originally from the Black Crowes) also reside in the music capital of the new South. "It saves us a lot of time to do it there. [Recording in Atlanta] doesn't add or take away from the music."

Many songs were written reveals Monahan, but few were recorded. "We were in discussion to record a couple of songs and come out with a different kind of record that had the essentials of Train or a cover record. By the time we started recording, though, it was clear that the level of songwriting had gone up a lot, and that we were much further ahead than any of us thought. We worked for six weeks and had a whole album done in that period of time."

The new CD's credits do not delineate individual contributions to the songs, but Monahan indi-

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cates that everyone in the band participated in the process. In past interviews, he has dismissed the academic approach to songwriting, testifying that he doesn't know or care where his songs come from, a sentiment he resoundingly reiterates. "I don't know how that whole thing happens and I'm not anxious to find out what the theory is — I just want to keep it flowing."

It Takes a Train to Cry

For Me It's You spans a bridge of emotions and experience. Cheery, British-influenced rhythms recall bands like the Faces and Argent, but a deeper lyrical subtext reflects the dissolution of long-term relationships and emotional isolation best exemplified in the album's first single, "Cab," and the key line, "The days are better, the nights are still so lonely/Sometimes it feels like I'm the only cab on the road." The album was written in a turbulent period for the band, and for Monahan in particular. His marriage was dissolving, and two original members of Train — Rob Hotchkiss and bassist Charlie Colin — had left the group prior to recording My Private Nation.

The lyrics on the new record, delivered in Monahan's arcing, articulate tenor, are surrounded by solid rock underpinnings — punchy keyboards and razor-sharp guitars. "This is our heaviest guitar album. Everyone steps up. Jimmy stepped up with guitars, and there's a little bit of solo stuff, examples of individuality," interjects Monahan. Most of the 13 songs clock in at less than four minutes. "We're about putting together a concise story about a specific event or feeling. The attention span of a music lover varies, but personally I think you can get a lot done in three minutes."

An emotional cornerstone of the album is "Always Remember." The song and the album are both dedicated to Greg Violett, a friend of Monahan's who passed away last year. "I've got two kids of my own now/They grow up so fast and how I wish you did not miss that part of who I am." Opulent strings

Meanwhile, back at the art gallery, Train performs surrounded by paintings rendered by KC Haxton, whose work adorn the cover of For Me It's You. His distinctive visuals are replicated in large-scale canvases: angelic outlines of featureless children floating and riding unicycles against an ominous sky.

Monahan tells a between-the-songs story about first seeing Haxson's art after attending a furniture store opening. "That's the kind of guy I am," he laughs. "People ask me to go to furniture store openings."

By chance, he ventured into the gallery where the band is now performing. This led to a friendship with the artist, and Monahan and guitarist Jimmy Stafford both collect his work. Monahan introduces the artist from the stage with the

parallel the emotional content on the big ballads courtesy of arranger Eddie Horst. "He comes in with a limited amount of people, runs a few passes," notes Monahan who will often sing along during basic and overdub sessions. "I get a lot of vocals out of reference vocals."

In concert, Train will often mine their favorite cover songs: "Faith" by George Michael, "Ramble On" by Led Zeppelin, "Raspberry Beret" by Prince. It is fitting, then, that a timeless quality permeates For Me It's You; an analog synth may snake in for a 70's second; and the lush orchestrations may recall epic pop hits, but this is not a recording steeped in a specific era. Ten years hence it will be difficult to pinpoint the era of its conception. Monahan says this is intentional. "It's something that comes naturally and we keep an eye on it. When we're recording and searching there are sounds we avoid."

Live, the band sometimes performs the jazz classic "I'm Beginning to See the Light," co-written by Duke Ellington and Harry James. It's Monahan's preferred listening genre. "Jazz is a great love of mine, but when I listen to jazz I want to hear women. I think Ella Fitzgerald was the most incredible vocalist that ever was, far beyond, in my opinion, any of the other women of that era. I can listen to men, but it doesn't move me like women, but Bill Evans was the greatest jazz pianist ever. That's who I listen to."

The Engine that Could

While Monahan channels his star power into his band, he is not reticent about Train's direction through the mainstream of rock. "Ego can be positive if it makes you strive for things, but an ego is an unhealthy self-perception, and the way I perceive myself is healthy. I'm very confident that I have the ability to do what I need to do," he avows. "I can sing very well, I have a great band, and when you have that combination it's not an ego that drives you, it's a matter of fact."

Keeping a journal, Monahan says, used to be a part of his on-tour regimen. "I spent three years doing it and it was so much work. I also run. And if I run less than at a certain speed I feel like I didn't do anything that day. I'm like that with everything. If I keep a journal I have to do the whole feel and it's exhausting."

Monahan is driven to compete against himself in a quest for some finish line. He notes that success and contentment in the rock world may be incompatible. "It's an individual question. For me, they're not. When I'm content it's a fleeting moment: "We went in made a really good record, we should all be proud of ourselves, okay let's go to work." It's like that."

Train's Engineer

For management Train is signed to Jon Landau, most famous for orchestrating the career of his marquee client, Bruce Springsteen. Monahan says the Train/Landau combo is an effective pairing. "We've been with him for four or five years. We started with Bill Graham Management and things weren't working out like we hoped they would; then I had an opportunity to meet Jon. I don't know if there's anyone better. He's a very classy guy and a very kind man. I like working with people I admire for reasons of humanity. That's the kind of people I want to spend time around."

As a first-tier manager should be, Landau is keenly aware of the big picture. "Jon's very good at making sure we continue to look like a classy, A-list band, not a group of guys who are willing to sell it all for a little publicity," affirms Monahan. "You get caught up in looking at magazines and wondering why you're not on the cover of all of them, and he makes sure that we all understand that the value of good music is deeper than a couple of pictures."

Landau, no stranger to the recording studio (he co-produced Springsteen's monumental *Born to Run*), doesn't hang out when the band is tracking. "He has a great ear; he'll listen to some music from us and be able to turn it into something special or have us remove ourselves [from it] so we concentrate on something different if it's not working out. No one spends a lot of time hanging out in the stu-

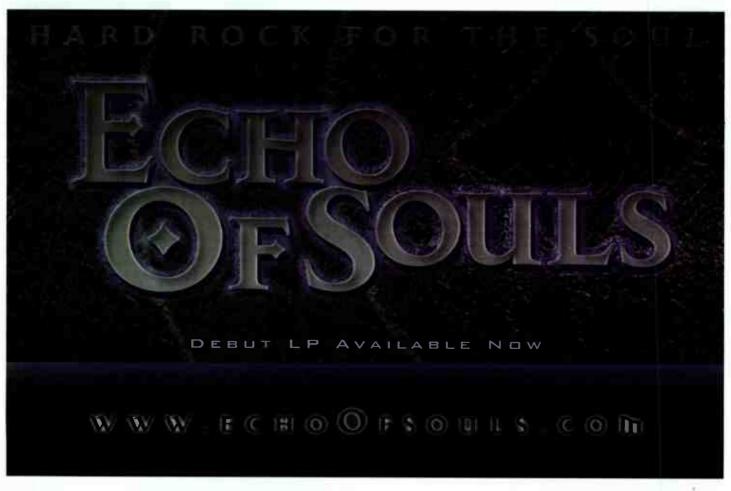

ADIO PROMOTION



by Lauri Shaw

adio is changing. Behemoth corporations now largely control commercial broadcast stations up and down the dial, and getting airplay on these stations can often be difficult, expensive and time-consuming. But there's good news, too: technology is revolutionizing radio. There are now more ways than ever to get your songs on the air. *Music Connection* found several college, public, internet, commercial and satellite radio stations and DJs who are ready to give local and/or unsigned artists a chance to be heard.

There's a lot of blending going on between the different formats. For example, many college stations are now broadcasting online; some of them have managed to go national this way. Internet radio has no geographic restrictions, and podcasting is the newest buzzword in wireless technology. SUBMISSION TIPS

Make sure your material is the appropriate format for the show/station you are submitting to, and that your submission is going to the correct person's attention. Internet research goes a long way!

Check each website for official submission guidelines before you drop anything in the mail. Be sure to note the station's preferences for follow-up, library additions, and tracking.

Unless otherwise specified, large press kits are usually unnecessary. A typical package is a CD with a one-sheet/bio.

Most DJs and program directors prefer to be contacted via e-mail, rather than by phone.

If you aren't signed yet, try getting your material on college, public or internet radio stations before submitting to a commercial one. Track your airplay, and add the results to your one-sheet. The more airplay you've already received, the more you're likely to get.

WHAT IS PODCASTING?

Podcasting is the latest buzz: DIY radio technology that distributes content using RSS (Real Simple Syndications). The concept is similar to blogging, and is becoming so popular that mainstream companies now use it. There are official directories on the web for podcasts, such as www.podcast.net. Here's what you need to create one of your own:

Plug a USB headset with a microphone into your computer.

Install an MP3 recorder for Windows, Mac or Linux.

Create an audio file by making a recording (you can talk, sing or record music) and saving it as an MP3 file.

Upload the MP3 audio file to podcasting sites.

HOW TO LISTEN TO PODCASTS:

Go to a podcasting site and download the free software.

Click on the hyperlink for each podcast you want. You can listen right away on your computer (both Windows and Mac support podcasting) or download the podcast to your MP3 player.

Or, subscribe to one or more RSS feeds. Your podcasting software will check the RSS feeds regularly and automatically pull content that matches your playlist. When you dock your MP3 player to your computer, it automatically updates with the latest content.

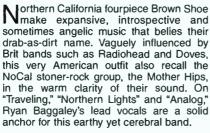

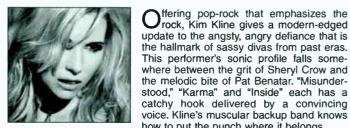

Together, they comprise a jam band extraordinaire with the ability to take the crowd to euphoric levels. Performance: The NK Band never lost their stamina, even in their longest stretches of instrumental reveries. In a set that approached two hours, these superb players maintained their level of play throughout. Frontman Korula, an extremely charismatic performer, made an impressive connection with the audience.

Summary: More than just a collection of songs, this performance was a profound statement that reminded the audience that there is power in music. By dedicating songs to family members, as well as others, Nikhil Korula made a public concert personal, and brought everyone into his world. That sort of intimacy made this outing memorable.

Musicianship: Amavisca's guitar licks and ease of transition combine powerfully with the steady bass lines of Quagmire, the dynamic keyboard work of Cooley and Wesley's vocals. This is a group with magnetic chemistry and obviously enjoy what they do. Performance: From the very first notes of their set, yayo jones made a solid connection with the audience that was maintained throughout the night. With a mix of straight-ahead rock and silky vocals, Wesley and the band gave the crowd a no-holds-barred performance.

Belying their youth, this group had an incredible stage presence. As the set progressed, the floor filled up with people who stopped what they were doing and gave in to the groove. The band responded with a fever pitch intensity that led to a stirring climax.

Summary: Yayo jones is definitely a force to be reckoned with. This exciting group has perfected both its presentation and audience interaction, and only needs to find the right vehicle to bring it to the people. By far, this is one of the tightest sounding bands on the Southern California circuit.

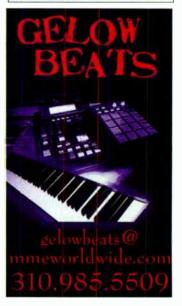

Janeen Leah: Combines soulful classic rock with smooth jazz.

Material: Janeen Leah's music has the feel of classic rock with a 60's flair that impacts at an intersection where Janis Joplin meets Grace Slick, with a touch of Melissa Etheridge. This young singer/ songwriter is multi-dimensional and her material defies identification, as she moves deftly from rock to smooth jazz. Slightly reminis-cent of Pauline Wilson of Seawind fame, Leah's songs "Melt Into You" and "Erased" are radio-ready and probably best suited for light-rock stations like The Wave (94.7 FM). Musicianship: Leah's backing band exhibits excellent chemistry, especially when she plays with lead guitarist Michael Burke, Burke's sound is heavily influenced by 60's rock and is a perfect fit for Leah's subdued playing style. Substitute

bassist Rama is more than up to the challenge, and he and drummer Gutierrez lay down a solid foundation that feels like they have been playing together for a long time. Brennan's sax adds an extra dimension to the music, but was especially effective on "Erased."

Performance: Trying to work within the sound restrictions of the tiny Kibitz venue, Leah revealed herself as a constrained rocker who was capable of belting out when she needed to. Like movements in a well orchestrated symphony, the set flowed from one groove to the next. Leah's pure, sweet, melodic vocals soared over a perfect blend of instruments as she performed each song, leaving the audience wanting more.

Summary: A worthy effort with a wide appeal, Janeen Leah's music is ready for the marketplace. Building her sound upon that of Joplin, Etheridge and Slick, Leah could carry the torch for a new generation for female singers. Especially so among those leading ladies who are not afraid to return to the roots of rock and plant their own seed of music for future generations to enjoy.

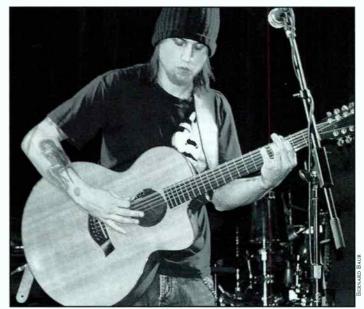
Material: Like snuggling before an open fire on a cold night, Rain Fur Rent's music has a warm charm. With lush arrangements that are expansive and expressive, their songs traverse an area somewhere between a mellow Radiohead and a bluesy Collective Soul. However, their linear style of writing and jam band tendencies play fast and loose with song structure. As a result, their material, though enjoyable, is not entirely memorable. Nonetheless, the crowd at this gig seem to dig it.

Musicianship: With multi-instrumentalists, Tyson Leonard and Ryan Johnson on hand, Rain Fur Rent's sound evolves from song to song. Tyson's violin makes especially significant contributions that add flavor and accent to the music. The rhythm section of Grant Leonard and Sarah Scarlata are perfection, as they manage to be precise yet flowing. It's Warren's voice, however, that gives the band their signature sound. With a range and emotional tone similar to Jeff Buckley's, Warren can make you feel his pain.

Performance: You can't avoid the impression that this was a group of virtuoso players. And, dedicating a song to Lindsey Buckingham was endearing. But, at times, it appeared that Rain Fur Rent were playing mostly for themselves, rather than for their audience. This self-indulgence seemed to be acceptable to their die-hard fans, but could very well prevent them from attracting new ones.

Summary: Though Rain Fur Rent is an impressive group in many respects, this act's penchant for stretching song structures could limit its appeal. The right direction and guidance from a producer might tighten the band's vision and make its songs more memorable, as well as commercial.

worked on, with emphasis on
selections from My Fair Lady and
Dance A Little Closer. With a stellar voice and a bookish knowledge
of facts and anecdotes, Brussell
not only offers a fine performance,
she also gives instruction on the
renowned songwriter.

Musicianship: A seasoned trio of players, Brussell and company project effortless skill. Rosen's stand-up bass plucking is a sturdy center to the sparse set-up. Alongside him, Schroeder, a talented pianist, glides from one song to

the next, flawlessly, and even accompanies the frontwoman on a full-fledged duet. Obviously, Brussell is the main attraction. A supreme vocalist, she belts out Lerner's classics with range, passion and a subtle affection, which justly complements the material.

Performance: The spotlight shined brightly on Brussell in the intimate surroundings of the venue. It seemed to take a couple of numbers for Brussell to acclimate, but once she settled in, her onstage confidence manifested. With Brussel's fourth song, "Brigadoon," her set took off. In between selections, Brussell came off as a comedic and well-versed student of Lerner's life. Presenting an overload of information, she closed with a track from Lerner's last musical, capping a lively and energetic evening.

Summary: Barbara Brussell is a gifted vocalist in the cabaret tradition. While one doesn't see many set lists based on musicals nowadays, Brussell is looking to bring back the form. It would be difficult to find a finer champion. She is aiming towards a specific audience, but catching this artist in top form should appeal to anyone who appreciates skilled entertainers. With a bottomless purse of knowledge on the subject she's paying tribute to, folks don't just walk away entertained, but educated as well

Material: Chris Allen's music fits between the singer/songwriter genre and Paul Westerberg's solorock style. A throaty vocalist with a penchant for delivering a hooky chorus, Allen tiptoes between safe mid-tempo strides and boozy upbeat romps. He isn't afraid to throw a lil' twang in there, either. With lyrical subjects leaning toward relationships and stark realities, Allen also spices up his verses with enough clever wordplay to keep things interesting.

Musicianship: Allen seems at home, whether he's alone with only his acoustic guitar or backed by a full band. A solid rhythm guitarist and singer, he never tries knocking out an audience with technique, since his focus seems to be on songwriting. McKean does an excellent job at backing Allen on vocals and injecting leads where needed. Hanna can smoke on keyboards, where he takes every song up a notch with tasteful texture.

Performance: Allen began the night by himself with a no-frills approach that lasted throughout the evening. With a full band coming in on the next number, the mood remained laid-back in typical coffeehouse manner. But with the up-tempo "Tilt A Whirl," the band displayed a first flash of undeniable conviction. And though subsequent mellower songs showcased Allen's efficient writing, it was during the set's last three songs (all buoyant rockers) that Allen went for broke and conveyed hard-hitting emotions.

Summary: Chris Allen jumps back and forth between sentimental crooner and gritty rock & roller. The man can definitely write and perform songs for the Starbucks crowd, playing to popular sensibilities.

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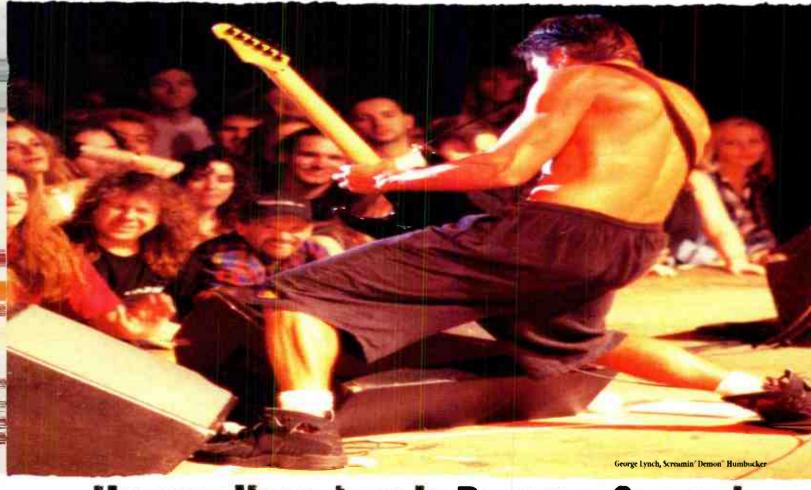
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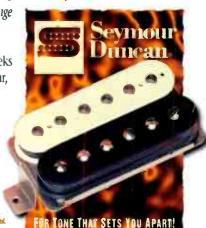
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
