The state which has launched an intensive prevention drive against anthrax (disease caused by bacillus anthracis) after two cows died due to the infection recently – **Kerala**

The world's first malaria vaccine developed by GlaxoSmithKline and PATH Malaria Vaccine Initiative which has been approved European Medicines Agency (EMA) for use in babies in Africa at risk of the mosquito-borne disease – RTS,S or Mosquirix

The British humanitarian who rescued nearly 700 children, most of them Jewish, from Nazi-occupied Czechoslovakia on the eve of the II World War in an operation known as the Czech Kindertransport who passed away on 01 July 2015 – **Nicholas Winton**

Places - India

The state which has been chosen to host the XIIth International Symposium on Antarctic Earth Sciences (ISAES), from July 13 to 17, organised by National Centre for Antarctic and Ocean Research (NCAOR), Ministry of Earth Sciences, Government of India – **Goa**

The city on the banks of river Godavari in which the once-in-12-year event Kumbha Mela began on 14 July 2015 – Nasik

Places - World

The city in China which has been chosen by the International Olympic Committee to host the 2022 Winter Olympics, becoming the first city to be awarded both summer and winter Games – **Beijing**

The country whose citizens have been allowed electronic visa facility by India from 30 July 2015 (the facility is already available to citizens of 75 other countries) – **China**

The African nation which has declared a state of emergency following an Islamic militant gun attack on a Sousse beach hotel, where 38 foreign tourists, mostly Britons, were killed – **Tunisia**

The largest city of Yemen which has been inducted into the list of World Heritage sites in danger by UNESCO along with the City of Shibam in Yemen and Hatra in Iraq – Sana'a

The Indian cricketer who was presented the Arjuna Award by the Union Sports Minister Sarbananda Sonowal, as the sportsperson was not present during the awards ceremony in 2014 – **R. Ashwin**

The Kenyan-born British professional road racing cyclist who has won the 2015 Tour de France, the multiple stage bicycle race – **Christopher Froome**

The Dutch hockey coach who has been appointed the coach for Indian hockey team till 2016 Olympics – **Roelant Oltmans**

South Africa's first post-apartheid international cricket captain who passed away on 28 July 2015, having played only 3 ODIs during his international career – **Clive Rice**

The venue of 14th Special Olympics World Summer Games 2015 being held from July 25 and declared open by Michelle Obama – Los Angeles

The domestic cricket tournament which has been scrapped from 2015-16 season by the BCCI — **Duleep Trophy**

Beidou Navigation Satellite Navigation System


It is a Chinese satellite navigation system consisting of 35 satellites. The 18th and 19th satellites were launched by China on **July 25**, **2015** from Xichang Satellite Launch Center on a Long March-3B rocket. The first BeiDou satellite of the present system was launched in 2000. The constellation currently covers the Asia and Pacific region and will be expanded to the whole globe when completed. The system has a positioning accuracy of 10 meters.

New Suez Canal

Egypt completed the first trial run of the New Suez Canal on July 25.

New Suez Canal is being created parallel to the existing Suez Canal. The original Suez Canal opened in 1869 and took 10 years to build. The new canal is expected to be completed in one year and open in August 2015. This will allow ships to sail in both directions at the same time over much of canal's length and double the capacity from 49 to 97 ships a day. In addition the project will boost the hard currency earnings for Egypt from the present \$5.3 billion to \$13.226 in 2023. The project has been launched simultaneously with plans to build six new tunnels under the canal.
