


**?** Find a book in the **ESL READING** area:

1. What is the call number on the side of the book?

Look for the small white label on each item. All call numbers start with 428.34. On the next row, the first two letters tell you which subject is being taught. "Re" is the code for "Reading", and is shown in blue below.

Example:



2. Is this book for Beginners, Intermediate or Advanced students?

Look at the number after "Re" in the call number on the white label. 1 = Beginner, 2 = Intermediate, 3 = Advanced. In the example above, the number 1 is shown in red, so we know that this book is for Beginners.

Find the ESL sets: write down any title from this collection: Write the title of any item that includes a book and a CD in a zipper case.

What is the call number for dictionaries in your first language? To find the call number for dictionaries in your first language, find the *Guide to Dictionaries & Language Learning Materials* sign at the end of the row of books in the Language Learning section. For example, the call number for Chinese dictionaries is 495.13, for Japanese dictionaries is 495.63, and for Hindi dictionaries is 491.433.

## LEVEL 5

Is there a newspaper from your birth country? What is the title? In the Newspaper area, you will find printed newspapers from the following countries: Canada, China, England, France, Germany, Ireland, Italy, Korea, Japan, Mexico, The Philippines, Pakistan, Scotland, Spain, Taiwan and USA.



Look at the white sign. Write down the call numbers you will find on this floor. **780-999** 

Find a computer with a blue sign. Here you can find the online library catalogue.

Find a computer station without a blue sign that is not being used. This is an Internet station. With a library card or Internet card, how long can a person use this station? 120 minutes.

# Part 2 - Using the Library Catalogue

On Level 6, locate a computer station with a blue sign that says Catalogue and Research. If a computer station with a blue sign is not available, locate one on another floor in the library. Find the icon on the computer screen that says Library Catalogue and double click.

### SEARCH FOR A BOOK TITLE


At the top of the page you'll see the words "Search the" followed by a box that says Catalogue and a box that says Keyword. Click on keyword and select Title.

Type in this book title: Contemporary Topics. Click the Search button. You will see a list of titles. The book "Contemporary Topics: Academic Listening and Note-taking Skills 1" will be near the top of the list.



Who is the author of this title? Solórzano, Helen Sophia


Click on the title for more information on this book. On the right hand side there will be a box with the availability details of this title. To check whether a book is in the library, click on "Availability by location". If the book is here, under Status you will see IN. Also check to see which floor and collection it is in. You will find this information under the word Collection.

You will also see a call number. The call number is important in the library. You need it to find the book on the shelves.

At the top of the page in the search box, use the drop down box and select Author. In the search box, type in the name of this author: Betty Azar. Click the Search button.


