#### Vital Events Update

We have received many queries regarding availability of the most recent public release of B.C. vital events records: 1901 births, 1926 marriages, and 1981 deaths.

Although the microfilms were ordered from the B.C. Archives early in January, we have not yet received them. We hope that they will arrive soon. A notice will be posted on our genealogy web pages when the films are here. Meanwhile, do not hesitate to call us at 604-331-3603 for an update on their status.

We have also been in touch with the Archives of Ontario regarding the release of the next set of vital events indexes for that province. The films are not yet available, but we will order them as soon as it becomes possible to do so.
