Starting **September 1, 2011**, you will place your order and pay for your microfilm online through the Family History Library website:

#### New Ontario Vital Events

The latest release of microfilm indexes to Ontario birth, marriage and death records is now available at the Vancouver Public Library. These indexes cover the following vital events:

- Births, 1913
- Marriages, 1928
- Deaths, 1938

References located using the indexes provide essential information which can be used to order microfilm copies of full original registration records from the Archives of Ontario through interlibrary loan.

While indexes and digital images of most Ontario birth, marriage and death records since 1869 are now available through **Ancestry Library Edition** (ALE), records for 1912-1913 births and 1937-1938 deaths are available exclusively on microfilm.

Another exciting addition to Ancestry Library Edition is the indexes and digital images of overseas deaths - 1939-1947. The Vancouver Public Library is looking into obtaining the corresponding microfilm reels for this collection.

#### **U.K. Employment Records**

Through a partnership with The British Postal Museum & Archive, Ancestry Library Edition now provides access to the **British Postal Service Appointment Books**, **1737-1969**. This collection contains 1.5 million records of people employed by the British postal service for a period of over 200 years. Information available in these records includes information on worker appointments, transfers, dismissals, resignations and deaths. They typically include a name, date of appointment, grade or position and location of work, with some showing salaries, references or recommendations.

In addition, Ancestry Library Edition now also provides access to railway employment records, from 1833 to 1963, which is close to as far back as there were railway employees. The 1.9 million records in the UK, Railway Employment Records, 1833-1963 collection include name, home station and date of birth of the employee, but also information on their career progression, salary increases, rewards, fines or suspensions for misbehaviour and notes from superiors on the worker's character and behaviour.





#### 1930 Mexican Census

Mexico's 1930 national census is both the largest and most recent Mexican census to be made public. The approximately 16 million records now available include name, age, gender, head of household, birthplace, marital status, nationality, religion, occupation, native language, address and more. **Note:** the 1930 Mexican Census is also available in FamilySearch.org



### Motion Picture Studio Directories, 1919 and 1921

Scans of print directories contain information about actors, directors, producers, and technicians. Listings include name, birth date and place, a brief career bio sometimes including educational history, a physical description. Information about many silent film stars including, Charlie Chaplin, Lillian Gish and Mary Pickford can be found using this directory.
