

British Columbia Vital Events Now Available Online!

Vital Events Search http://search-collections.royalbcmuseum.bc.ca/ Genealogy/AdvancedSearch

Free access, effective 4 September, to a new online genealogy database linked to digitized images of many of the province's historical birth (1854-1903), marriage (1872-1936) and death (1872-1991) registrations.

The release of the index and attached images is a collaborative project between the B.C. Archives, the Vital Statistics Agency and FamilySearch. There are currently 700,000 images; new digitized images will be loaded on a regular basis.

Veterans Death Cards for World War I Now Online

Over 130,000 file cards from Veterans Affairs with information about the deaths of World War I veterans have been digitized by Library and Archives Canada. The collection of cards covers up to the early 60, and includes veterans who passed away after the War, as well as soldiers who died in Canada during the War. Information such as rank, date and cause of death, next of kin, and place of burial can be found on these index cards.

International Genealogical Index (IGI)

The transfer of the International Genealogical Index is now complete. The IGI contains several hundred million names from church and vital records as far back as the early 1500's, as well as personal family information submitted to the Latter Day Saints Church.




